8 9 10 11 12			A person must not, without consent of another person or without reasonable excuse, publish or distribute a recording of the other person accessing, attempting to access or leaving premises at which abortions are provided, if the recording contains particulars that are likely to lead to the identification of —

24 25 26 27 28 29		(1)	The Minister must review the operation and effectiveness of the amendments made to this Act by the <i>Public Health Amendment (Safe Access Zones) Act 2020</i> , and prepare a report based on the review, as soon as practicable after the 5 th anniversary of the day on which the <i>Public Health Amendment (Safe Access Zones) Act 2020</i> section 4 comes into operation.

7	(1)	If, in the Minister's opinion, a House of Parliament will
8		not sit during the period of 21 days after finalisation of

12	(2)	When the report is sent to the Clerk of a House it is
13		taken to have been laid before the House.
14	(3)	The laying of the report that is taken to have occurred
15		under subsection (2) must be recorded in the Minutes,
16		or Votes and Proceedings, of the House on the first
17		sitting day of the House after the Clerk receives the
