GRAIN MARKETING REPEAL BILL 2010

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This is a Bill to repeal the *Grain Marketing Act 2002* and make one consequential amendment to another Act.

It consists of 4 clauses.

Clause 1 states the short title of the proposed Act.

Clause 2 provides that the repeal and the consequential amendment will come into operation on a day to be fixed by proclamation.

Clause 3 repeals the *Grain Marketing Act 2002*. That Act established a licensing system for the bulk export of prescribed grain which was administered by the Grain Licensing Authority. The prescribed grains were barley, lupins and canola. These grains are no longer prescribed and there is no need for the Act to continue.

Clause 4 amends the *Constitution Acts Amendment Act 1899* to remove the reference to the Grain Licensing Authority from Schedule V.
