We also note that the trial judge in *Carter v. Canada (Attorney General)* [2012] BCSC 886 [852], [1242] found that empirical evidence does not support the claim that vulnerable individuals could not be protected. (This finding was not disturbed by the Canadian Supreme Court which noted that the trial judge's findings were 'reasonable and open to her': *Carter v Canada (Attorney General)* [2015] 1 SCR 331 [109].)
