Review of Demersal Scalefish Policy (18/10/22)

Mr R.S. Love, moved –

That this House;

- (1) Recognises the irreplaceable economic, social, and public health value fishing brings Western Australia and calls on the Minister for Fisheries to:
 - (a) Review his policy to ban fishing for demersal scalefish, including Pink Snapper and Black Dhufish, for as much as nine months of the year;
 - (b) Develop a plan for the West Coast Fishery that balances community, economic, and environmental outcomes; and
- (2) Acknowledges the more than 18,000 West Australians who have petitioned the Minister to conduct such a review
