- (i) If yes to (h), will the Minister table the business case? If not, why not?

4887. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Parliamentary Secretary representing the Minister for Environment; Disability Services; Electoral Affairs:

I refer to the Container Deposit Scheme to be introduced into Western Australia next year and ask:

- (a) What is the price per vessel beverage producers will be charged by the system operator to participate in the recovery scheme;
- (b) Will there be any relief for small beverage producers such as micro-breweries in their contributions to the recovery scheme:
 - (i) If yes, what will they be;
- (c) How will the scheme manager monitor beverage producers to ensure they are compliant with the regulations;
- (d) Will wine vessels be exempt from the scheme:
 - (i) If yes, why; and
- (e) Will 750ml wine bottles containing beer be required to be registered for the scheme:
 - (i) If yes, why?

4888. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Local Government:

I refer to the recent media reports that the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries is investigating the conduct of City of Mandurah councillor Dave Schumacher and ask:

- (a) When did the authorised inquiry into Cr Schumacher commence;
- (b) Why wasn't Cr Schumacher informed by the department that he was the subject of an authorised inquiry;
- (c) Is it the policy of the department not to advise councillors they are under investigation:
 - (i) If yes, why;
- (d) Was the department planning on interviewing Cr Schumacher as part of the inquiry:
 - (i) If not, why not; and
 - (ii) If yes, when;

- (e) Will the department be informing Cr Schumacher of the source of the complaint that prompted the inquiry:
 - (i) If not, why not;
- (f) Why has the inquiry into Cr Schumacher taken so long; and
- (g) Is the delay in finalising the inquiry the result of the reduction of department resources under Machinery of Government changes?

I refer to the Minister's answer to Question On Notice No. 4335 and ask what is the total balance in the Off-Road Vehicles account and:

- (a) When was the last time funds were withdrawn from the Off-Road Vehicles account for expenses in relation to the administration of the Act:
 - (i) What was the expense and what was the amount withdrawn; and
- (b) How much in bank interest has the Off-Road Vehicles account gained since July 2011?

4890. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Local Government:

I refer to the Minister's answer to Question on Notice No. 4334 and ask do the members of the Off-Road Vehicles Advisory Committee receive fees:

- (a) If yes, what is the fee structure;
- (b) What is the breakdown of fees paid to the respective members of the committee for each of the years 2011-12, 2012-13, 2013-14; 2014-15, 2015-16 and 2017-18; and
- (c) Will the Minister table the minutes of the most recent meeting of the Off-Road Vehicles Advisory Committee?

4891. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Culture and the Arts:

I refer to the Minister's answer to Question On Notice No. 4332 and ask, if the transfers from the State Library to the State Records Office has been impacted by staff constraints, will the Minister be providing more resources to help the process and:

- (a) Were the constraints the result of Machinery of Government changes;
- (b) What resources will the department be making available; and
- (c) When will the resources be available?

4892. Mr W.R. Marmion to the Minister for Finance:

- (1) I refer to the answer to Question on Notice 4403 which states that the Treasurer was first advised of elevated lead levels in the Perth Children's Hospital (PCH) on 5 September 2016 and that he was further advised on 10 October 2016 that all water entering the PCH was lead free:
 - (a) Can the Minister confirm that testing for lead by Merieux NutriSciences on 17 June 2016, at the Interior North Main Feed, recorded a reading of 0.011 mg/l, which is 10% above the Australian Drinking Water Guideline;
 - (b) Can the Minister confirm that testing for lead by ALS Environmental Services on 13 July 2016, at the North Tunnel Potable Water Inlet, recorded a reading of 0.073 mg/l, which is 730% above the Australian Drinking Water Guideline;
 - (c) Can the Minister confirm that testing for lead by ALS Environmental Services on 27 July 2016, at the Interior North Main Feed, recorded a reading of 0.013 mg/l, which is 30% above the Australian Drinking Water Guideline;
 - (d) Can the Minister confirm that testing for lead by Zedcon NATA Testing Facility on 7 September 2016, at the Potable Water South Feed, recorded a reading of 0.019 mg/l, which is 90% above the Australian Drinking Water Guideline;

- (e) Can the Minister confirm that testing for lead by Zedcon NATA Testing Facility on 14 September 2016, at the Potable Water South Feed, recorded a reading of 0.016 mg/l, which is 60% above the Australian Drinking Water Guideline;
- (f) Can the Minister confirm that testing for lead by Zedcon NATA Testing Facility on 16 September 2016, at the Potable Water South Feed, recorded a reading of 0.015 mg/l, which is 50% above the Australian Drinking Water Guideline; and
- (g) Can the Minister confirm that testing for lead by Zedcon NATA Testing Facility on 16 September 2016, at the Water Corp Incoming Northern Feed, recorded a reading of 0.046 mg/l, which is 460% above the Australian Drinking Water Guideline?
- (2) Why was there a delay of more than 2 months before the Treasurer was advised of the issue of elevated lead levels in the water reticulation system at PCH?
- (3) Why was the Treasurer advised that water entering the PCH was lead free when seven (7) test results taken of incoming water to the PCH between 17 June and 16 September had levels above the Australian Drinking Water Guideline?
- (4) Was any further investigation or water testing undertaken to determine why testing showed elevated lead levels in the incoming water source to the PCH in 2016 and if so what was the outcome of this investigation?

I refer to the Regional Capitals Alliance WA which represents the State's 10 largest rural councils and ask:

- (a) How often did the Alliance meet for each of the years 2017, 2018 and 2019 so far;
- (b) Where were each of the meetings held in 2017, 2018 and 2019 so far;
- (c) How many times in 2017, 2018 and 2019 so far did the Minister attend the meetings, please list which meetings he attended and where they were held;
- (d) What input did the Minister make at the meetings he attended;
- (e) Who else from the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries attended any of the meetings in 2017, 2018 and 2019 and please list the meetings attended;
- (f) Did any of the Minister's staff attend any of the meetings in 2017, 2018 and 2019 and please list the meetings attended; and
- (g) What correspondence has the Regionals Capitals Alliance WA sent to the Minister or Ministerial staff in 2017, 2018 and 2019 so far regarding its policies and objectives?

4894. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Local Government:

I refer to the recent price rise for weekday burials at the South Hedland Cemetery in the Town of Port Hedland from \$1100 to \$3500 and ask:

- (a) Is the Minister aware of the considerable fee rise;
- (b) When was the Minister made aware of the fee rise;
- (c) Has the Minister or anyone from his department contacted the Town of Port Hedland over the price rise:
 - (i) If yes, what was the message sent to the Town; and
 - (ii) What was the response from the Town;
- (d) Will the Minister invoke section 52 (4) of the *Cemeteries Act 1986* and order the Town of Port Hedland to amend or revoke the burial fee rise:
 - (i) When will the Minister invoke the section; and

- (e) Will the Minister consider applying uniform burial fees across WA local governments:
 - (i) If not, why not;
 - (ii) If yes, is the department forming a policy on the matter;
 - (iii) Which parties have contributed to the policy; and
 - (iv) When will the policy be implemented?

4895. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Heritage:

I refer to the *Heritage Act 2018* and ask if the terms of the Heritage Council members will be adjusted when the Governor approves the proclamation regulations:

- (a) If yes, will all current members of the Council be given new five-year terms once the proclamation regulations are approved by the Governor;
- (b) Will the current members of the Council continue their existing five-year terms once the proclamation regulations are approved by the Governor;
- (c) How many years has each of the current members served on the Council; and
- (d) For each member of the Council when does their current five-year team expire?

4896. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Heritage:

I refer to proposed Draft Regulation 11 in the new *Heritage Act 2018* and ask:

- (a) Will a co-opted member's vote be in place of a permanent member of the Council:
 - (i) If not, will the regulations allow for more than nine votes on a particular question before the Council?

4897. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Heritage:

I refer to the Draft Regulation 14 of the new *Heritage Act 2018* which will require a member with a material personal interest not to vote on a matter before the Heritage Council and ask:

- (a) Will the member or members with the material personal interest be replaced by an alternate member under Draft Regulation 9; and
- (b) Will the Minister have a panel of candidates from which an alternate member can be chosen:
 - (i) If yes, how many alternate members will be on the panel?

4898. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Heritage:

I refer to Draft Regulations 19 and 23 for the new *Heritage Act 2018* and ask:

- (a) Why has the number of Council members required for a meeting quorum been changed; and
- (b) Will there be a limit on the number of meetings a Council member can attend via telephone or other means of instantaneous communication in a year:
 - (i) What is the number?

4899. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Heritage:

I refer to the Heritage Act 2018 and ask when does the Minister expect to forward the regulations to the Governor for approval?

I refer to the Auditor General's findings in the Financial Audits of Local Government Entities report that there were 36 matters of non-compliance with various acts or laws and ask:

- (a) Has the Minister or his department taken any action against the local governments found to have been non-compliant:
 - (i) If yes, what action was taken and when; and
- (b) Has the Minister or his department identified any matters worthy of further investigation:
 - (i) If yes, what matters and which local governments are involved?

4901. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Local Government:

I refer to the Auditor General's concern in the Financial Audits of Local Government Entities report that the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries didn't consider the benefits of reporting land under roads justified the cost of its periodic valuation and ask:

- (a) Will the Department change its policy on reporting land under roads following the Auditor General's report:
 - (i) If not, why not; and
- (b) Has the Minister or his department written to local governments outlining a change of policy and if yes:
 - (i) When did the Minister or a member of his departmental staff write to the local governments; and
 - (ii) Will the Minister table the letter sent to the local governments and if not, why

4902. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Local Government:

I refer to the Auditor General's reference in the Financial Audits of Local Government Entities report to a variety of valuation methodologies used for property, plant, equipment and infrastructure in the sector and ask:

- (a) Will the department develop a standard valuation methodology to be used across all local governments:
 - (i) If not, why not; and
 - (ii) If yes, what methodology will be used;
- (b) When will the methodology be implemented as standard policy; and
- (c) Have the local governments been informed of the methodology:
 - (i) If yes, when?

4903. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Local Government:

I refer to the report on the Financial Audits of Local Government Entities and ask will any of the Auditor General's recommendations be included in the second phase review of the *Local Government Act 1995*:

- (a) If yes, which elements of the Auditor General's report will be included; and
- (b) Will local government stakeholders be able to consider the recommendations to be included in the review:
 - (i) If yes, when will they be invited to consider the recommendations?

I refer to the proposed review of the *Dog Act 1976* and ask:

- (a) When will the review commence;
- (b) Will there be a full review of the Act:
 - (i) If not, what parts of the Act will be reviewed;
- (c) Who will oversee the review of the Act;
- (d) What form will the review take and will it include public surveys;
- (e) When will stakeholders be invited to lodge submissions for the review:
 - (i) Will the submissions be made public;
- (f) Has the Minister or his department received any submissions in advance of the review:
 - (i) If yes, from which groups or individuals;
- (g) When will the review period end;
- (h) When does the Minister plan to introduce legislative amendments to the *Dog Act 1976*; and
- (i) Will legislation to stop puppy farming be introduced into Parliament before the review of the *Dog Act 1976* is conducted:
 - (i) If yes, when will the stop puppy farming amendments be introduced into Parliament?

4905. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Culture and the Arts:

I refer to the Sculpture By The Sea exhibition at Cottesloe Beach and ask:

- (a) How much funding has the Department of Culture and the Arts provided to the exhibition for each of the years 2017, 2018 and 2019;
- (b) Has the Department of Culture and the Arts provided any other assistance to the exhibition in any of the years 2017, 2018 and 2019:
 - (i) If yes, what was the assistance and when was it provided;
- (c) Have the organisers of the exhibition made any applications to the department for grants or assistance in each of the years 2017, 2018 and 2018:
 - (i) If yes, when, what was the value of the grants or assistance sought and what were the applications for; and
- (d) Has the Art Gallery of WA provided funding for the exhibition in any of the years 2017, 2018 and 2019:
 - (i) If yes, what was the funding, its value and for what were the monies used?

4906. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Tourism:

I refer to the Sculpture By The Sea exhibition and ask:

- (a) How much funding has Tourism WA provided to the exhibition for each of the years 2017, 2018 and 2019;
- (b) Has the Department of Tourism provided any other assistance to the exhibition in each of the years 2017, 2018 and 2019;
- (c) Has Tourism WA pledged to continue its funds allocation to the exhibition for 2020 and how much has been promised;
- (d) Can the department supply estimated visitor numbers to the exhibition for each of the years 2017, 2018 and 2019;

- (e) Can the department provide an economic benefit in dollar terms from tourists visiting the exhibition in each of the years 2016, 2017, 2018 and an estimated benefit for 2019; and
- (f) Has the department discussed a change of venue with the exhibition organisers:
 - (i) If yes, what alternative venues have been considered in the discussions?

4907. Dr M.D. Nahan to the Premier:

I refer to the media release dated 11 March 2019 titled "McGowan Government Industry Participation Strategy delivering on local jobs and apprenticeships" and I ask:

- (a) Will the Premier provide a list of the nine pilot projects mentioned in the media release together with the date the tender closed for each project.;
- (b) Did the successful tenderer on each project submit an industry participation plan with the tender:
- (c) Will the Premier table the industry participation plans for each of the pilot projects? If not, why not;
- (d) Have the participation plans been incorporated in full into the contracts for each of the projects? If no, what projects have not had the plans incorporated in full;
- (e) Have the successful bidders provided reports to the Government on the fulfilment of the plans? If not, which projects have not been reported against; and
- (f) Have all of the projects met the industry participation plans in full? If not, which projects have not met with industry participation plans?
