- repeal the *Country Towns Sewerage Act 1948*; and
- repeal the *Busselton Water Board (Supply of Water to Dunsborough) Act 2009*; and
- repeal the *Land Drainage Act 1925*; and
- repeal the *Land Drainage (Validation) Act 1996*; and
- repeal the *Water Boards Act 1904*; and

- repeal certain subsidiary legislation consequentially; and
  - make consequential amendments to certain Acts,
- and for related and incidental purposes.” be introduced and read a first time.

Question put and passed.

The Minister for Water moved, That the bill be now read a second time.

Mr M. McGowan moved, That the debate be adjourned.
