5. Government Trading Enterprises Bill 2022

- to amend certain Acts consequentially; and
- for related purposes.” be introduced and read a first time.

6. Statutes (Repeals and Minor Amendments) Bill 2021

The Order of the Day for the first reading of the bill having been read, the Attorney General moved,

That a bill for “An Act to —

- repeal various obsolete Acts; and
- repeal various obsolete Imperial Acts or provisions of them in so far as they are part of the law of Western Australia; and
- make minor amendments to various Acts.” be read a first time.

Question put and passed.

The Attorney General presented an explanatory memorandum and bill read a first time.

The Attorney General moved, That the bill be now read a second time.

Mr R.S. Love moved, That the debate be adjourned.

Question put and passed.

7. Road Traffic (Vehicles) Amendment (Offensive Advertising) Bill 2022

The Order of the Day for the resumption of the debate upon the second reading of the bill was read.

Debate resumed.

Debate interrupted by the Chair (Mrs L.M. O’Malley speaking) and adjourned until a later stage of the sitting.
