Ms L. Mettam, pursuant to notice, moved,

That this House condemns WA Labor's years of neglect and mismanagement of the WA health system and its failure to prioritise patient safety and support our hardworking health workers.

Speaker's Ruling – Official Documents

The Speaker advised that her ruling had been sought as to whether a letter quoted by the Minister for Health in debate today is an "official document".

Standing Order 157 provides "A Minister who has quoted from an official document will table that document if requested by any other member either during, or immediately after the conclusion of the remarks which include the quotation."

Having viewed the document, which is a letter not on official letterhead, and which is addressed to the Minister. In the Speaker's view it lacks the formality of an official piece of correspondence, and does not on its face appear to have originated through a recognised process within the Department of Health.

The Speaker determined that this document is not an "official document" within the meaning of Standing Order 157.

Debate ensued.

Debate interrupted by the Chair (Ms H.M. Beazley speaking) and adjourned until a later stage of the sitting.
