1. Meeting of Assembly

The Speaker advised members that as a mark of the very special Sister State relationship Western Australia has with Hyogo, Japan, he had invited Vice Speaker Masaru Yaota, of the Hyogo Prefectural Assembly, on to the floor of the House and asked the Sergeant-at-Arms to escort him to a seat next to the Speaker. He was accompanied by Mr Toshihiko Hirota, also from the Hyogo Prefectural Assembly.

3. Brief Ministerial Statements

Brief Ministerial Statements were made by –

The Minister for Commerce on the intention by the Government to appoint a Small Business Advocate to work within the Small Business Development Corporation and will provide advice to the business community on commercial tenancy issues.

The Attorney General on the retirement of Mr Robert Cock QC as director of Public Prosecutions and his appointment as Special Counsel to the Premier to oversee significant and complex changes to public sector legislation.

Shack Site Coastal Communities in Western Australia - Petitions requesting that Shack Site communities be preserved so Western Australians have affordable coastal holiday destinations for future generations were presented by –

Rockingham Infill Sewerage Program - Mr M. McGowan presented a petition from 147 persons requesting that the Government to take immediate steps to reinstate the Infill Sewerage Programme for the residents located within the Rockingham 25B precinct (P. 105).
