 - (c) how many patients are currently on the waiting list for out-patient services for eating disorders at the Centre; and
 - (d) what is the average waiting time for patients to gain access to out-patient services for eating disorders at the Centre?

7648. Mr R.H. Cook to the Minister for Health

- (i) what is the current average length of stay at each of these hospitals, listed by hospital, for a caesarean section?

- (2) What were the establishment costs of the FBC?

- (h) what is the total monthly cost per aircraft for the following financial years: 2008–09; 2009–10; 2010–11 and from July 1 2011 to date;
- (i) what is the total cost of the contract over four years;
- (j) is Maroomba Airlines still the provider of air charter services, and if not, who is the current provider;
- (k) what are the current guidelines for Minister's use of the charter services; and
- (l) will the Premier table a copy of the guidelines, and if not, why not?
