## FIRST SESSION OF THE FORTIETH PARLIAMENT

## WEDNESDAY, 22 NOVEMBER 2017

### 1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 12.00 noon pursuant to adjournment.

#### 2. Petitions

Boarding Away From Home Allowance – Mr I.C. Blayney presented a petition from 363 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly reverse the decision to remove the Royalties for Regions contribution to the Boarding Away from Home Allowance (P. 31).

Community Resource Centres – Mr D.T. Redman presented a petition from 682 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly call upon the Premier Mark McGowan to ensure adequate funding to support the ongoing operation of all Community Resource Centres, without reducing service delivery (P. 32).
