1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 12.00 noon pursuant to adjournment.

The Speaker took the Chair.

An Acknowledgement of Country and Prayers were read.

2. Expiration of Notice of Motion

The Speaker advised members that Private Members' Business Notice of Motion No. 1, notice of which was given on 18 October 2017 and renewed for a further 30 sitting days on 9 May 2018, would be removed and would not appear on the next Notice Paper.

3. Brief Ministerial Statements

Brief Ministerial Statements were made by –

The Minister for Police on increased rewards to support police to apprehend offenders.

The Minister for Housing on micro lot homes in Ellenbrook.

The Minister for Child Protection on the recipients of the John Curtin Medal.

5. Legal Profession Amendment (Professional Indemnity Insurance Management Committee) Bill 2018

17. Fly-in Fly-out Work Practices

Ms M.J. Davies, pursuant to notice, moved,

That this House recognises that fly in fly out work practices can be detrimental to regional communities through the reduction of economic and social opportunities for development and calls on the McGowan Government to:

- (1) acknowledge the positive impact the Liberal-National Government made in improving the liveability of the Pilbara through Royalties for Regions investment;
- (2) ensure that all fly-in fly-out work arrangements are limited to genuinely remote and temporary operations and that workers are provided with genuine choice over where they live; and
- (3) ensure that key stakeholders, including Local Government, are engaged where the project will be located to address social and community infrastructure requirements.

Debate ensued.
