1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 9.00 a.m. pursuant to adjournment.

The Speaker took the Chair.

Prayers were read.

2. Papers

9. Pay-roll Tax (Indigenous Wages) Rebate Bill 2012

The Treasurer, pursuant to notice, moved,

That a bill for "An Act to provide a rebate on pay-roll tax paid on wages paid to certain indigenous persons, and for related matters." be introduced and read a first time.

Question put and passed.

The Treasurer presented an explanatory memorandum and bill read a first time.

The Treasurer moved, That the bill be now read a second time.

Mrs C.A. Martin moved, That the debate be adjourned.

10. Revenue Laws Amendment Bill 2012

The Treasurer, pursuant to notice, moved,

- the Pay-roll Tax Assessment Act 2002." be introduced and read a first time.

The Treasurer moved, That the bill be now read a second time.

Mrs C.A. Martin moved, That the debate be adjourned.

11. Appropriation (Consolidated Account) Recurrent 2012-13 Bill 2012

The Order of the Day for the resumption of the debate upon the third reading of the bill was read.

Debate resumed.

Question put and passed.

Bill read a third time and forwarded to the Legislative Council for concurrence.

12. Appropriation (Consolidated Account) Capital 2012-13 Bill 2012

The Order of the Day for the third reading of the bill having been read, the Treasurer moved, That the bill be now read a third time.

Debate ensued.

Debate interrupted by the Chair (Mr W.J. Johnston speaking) and adjourned until a later stage of the sitting.

14. Speaker's Ruling – Repetitive Questions

The Speaker advised members that at Question Time on 13 June 2012, the Member for Perth had asked if a question asked by the Member for Mount Lawley was the same as the question asked by that member on 16 May 2012. Both questions asked by the Member for Mount Lawley had wording which was nearly the same. Under the Standing Orders, the House does not entertain having a question which has been asked and answered, asked a second time. While the temporal element is often very significant in asking a question, having looked at the answers by the Minister, the substantive answers were found to be quite similar. Consequently, the second question should not have been asked.

16. Matter of Public Interest – Pharmaceutical company gifts to Health Department officials

The Speaker informed the Assembly that he was in receipt of a notice from Mr R.H. Cook that he intended to move a motion on a matter of public interest.

At least five members having risen in support,

Mr R.H. Cook moved,

That this House condemns the Barnett Government for its failure to act on extensive gifts and benefits provided by pharmaceutical companies to Health Department officials and the associated potential conflicts of interest.
