1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 12.00 noon pursuant to adjournment.

The Speaker took the Chair.

An Acknowledgement of Country and Prayers were read.

2. Death of Tom Herzfeld – a former Member of the Legislative Assembly

The Deputy Premier, without notice, moved,

That the House records its sincere regret at the death of Tom Herzfeld and tenders its deep sympathy to his family.

The motion was supported by Ms L. Mettam, Mr D.A. Templeman, Mr R.S. Love and Mr D.T. Punch.

Question put and passed unanimously with members and officers of the Assembly standing in their places as a mark of respect.

3. Brief Ministerial Statements

Brief Ministerial Statements were made by –

The Minister for Tourism on the Government's efforts to increase the tourism and hospitality workforce in Western Australia.

The Minister for Police on the rollout of Naloxone in kits carried by WA Police officers.

The Minister for Youth on the new cohort of members of the Ministerial Youth Advisory Council.

The Minister for Lands on the start of negotiations with a South Korean renewable energy consortium to establish a green ammonia plant at Narngulu Industrial Estate near Geraldton.

The Minister for Planning on planning approval for Western Australia's first hospice and respite care for children and their families.

The Minister for Disability Services on an update on grant funding provided by the State Disability Strategy – Innovation Fund Tranche Two.

The Minister for Environment on the progress of the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions' Return to 1616 ecological restoration project at Dirk Hartog Island National Park.

4. Electricity Industry Amendment (Alternative Electricity Services) Bill 2023

The Minister for Energy, pursuant to notice, moved,

That a bill for "An Act to amend the *Electricity Industry Act 2004* in relation to alternative electricity services and to make consequential amendments to the *Electricity Act 1945*." be introduced and read a first time.

Mr P.J. Rundle moved, That the debate be adjourned.

7. Matter of Public Interest – Women and Babies Hospital Site

The Speaker informed the Assembly that she was in receipt of a notice from Ms L. Mettam that she intended to move a motion on a matter of public interest.

Ms L. Mettam moved,

That this House condemns the WA Labor Government for ignoring their own business case into the new Women and Babies Hospital which recommends QEII Medical Centre as the preferred site, and joins health experts, clinicians, and advocacy groups in urging the Government to reverse this dangerous decision.
