Michel presented a petition from 15 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly advocate, on behalf of long-suffering Pilbara residents, for a cap on insurance premiums for homes and businesses that are certified under appropriate Australian building codes to withstand cyclones and other weather-events that increase premiums (P. 27).
