SYNOPSIS OF BILLS

The following synopsis of Bills dealt with by the Legislative Assembly this week, is intended only to give a brief outline of the purpose of each Bill at the second reading stage of the Bill and the stages it was dealt with in the Legislative Assembly.

Family Violence Legislation Reform Bill 2024

(Attorney General) (No. 168)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the Bail Act 1982; and the Criminal Investigation Act 2006; and the Criminal Law (Mental Impairment) Act 2023; and the Criminal Law (Mentally Impaired Accused) Act 1996; and the Cross-border Justice Act 2008; and the High Risk Serious Offenders Act 2020; and the Restraining Orders Act 1997; and the Sentence Administration Act 2003; and the Sentencing Act 1995.

Consideration in detail of Legislative Council Message No. 149

The Legislative Assembly acquainted the Legislative Council that it had agreed to amendments made by the Legislative Council.

Police Legislation Amendment Bill 2024

(Minister for Police) (No. 174)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the Criminal Investigation Act 2006; and amend the Weapons Act 1999; and amend the Young Offenders Act 1994; and make related and consequential amendments to other Acts.

Second reading; debate adjourned.

Consideration in detail.

Bill read a third time and forwarded to the Legislative Council Accordingly.

Environmental Protection Amendment Bill 2024

(Minister for Environment) (No.180)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the Environmental Protection Act 1986 and the Environmental Protection Regulations 1987.

Second reading agreed.

Consideration in detail.

Bill read a third time and forwarded to the Legislative Council Accordingly.

Births, Deaths and Marriages Registration Amendment (Sex or Gender Changes) Bill 2024

(Attorney General) (No.156)

The purpose of this bill is to amend the Births, Deaths and Marriages Registration Act 1998; and to repeal the Gender Reassignment Act 2000 and the Gender Reassignment Regulations 2001; and to make consequential amendments to other Acts.

Consideration in detail of Legislative Council Message No. 150

The Legislative Assembly acquainted the Legislative Council that it had agreed to amendments made by the Legislative Council.

Queens Gardens Car Park (Inner City School) Bill 2024

(Minister for Education) (No.182)

The purpose of this Bill is to terminate the agreement approved and ratified by the Chevron-Hilton Hotel Agreement Act 1960; and to repeal the Chevron-Hilton Hotel Agreement Act 1960; and to provide for the transfer of certain land; and to provide for the effect of the termination, repeal and transfer; and to provide for the development of a government school on the transferred land; and for related purposes.

Second reading agreed.

Consideration in detail.

Bill read a third time and forwarded to the Legislative Council Accordingly.

Towing Services Bill 2024

(Minister Assisting the Minister for Transport) (No. 176)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the regulation of the towing industry; and make consequential amendments to various other Acts, and for related purposes.

Second reading; adjourned debate.
