WEDNESDAY, 17 JUNE 2020

1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 12.00 noon pursuant to adjournment.

The Speaker took the Chair.

An Acknowledgement of Country and Prayers were read.

2. Petition

Stirling Highway – Ms S. McGurk presented a petition from 39 people asking the Legislative Assembly to have a five metre noise wall researched, designed and installed to the western side of Stirling Highway extending from the Marmion Street intersection to the Brush apartments (P. 180).

3. Joint Standing Committee on the Commissioner for Children and Young People – Extension of Reporting Date

The Speaker advised that the Joint Standing Committee on the Commissioner for Children and Young People had resolved to extend its reporting date to the House on its inquiry into the monitoring and enforcing of child safe standards to 13 August 2020.

5. Mutual Recognition (Western Australia) Bill 2020

The Premier, pursuant to notice, moved,

That a bill for "An Act to continue the adoption of the *Mutual Recognition Act 1992* of the Parliament of the Commonwealth (and any amendments made to it before the enactment of this Act) which provides for the recognition within each State and Territory of the Commonwealth of regulatory standards adopted elsewhere in Australia regarding goods and occupations, and for related purposes." be introduced and read a first time.

Question put and passed.

The Premier presented an explanatory memorandum and bill read a first time.

The Premier moved, That the bill be now read a second time.

Mr A. Krsticevic moved, That the debate be adjourned.

Question put and passed.

6. Road Traffic Amendment (Immobilisation, Towing and Detention of Vehicles) Bill 2020

The Minister for Transport, pursuant to notice, moved,

That a bill for "An Act to amend the *Road Traffic Act 1974* and the *Road Traffic (Administration) Act 2008* and for related purposes." be introduced and read a first time.

Question put and passed.

The Minister for Transport presented an explanatory memorandum and bill read a first time.

The Minister for Transport moved, That the bill be now read a second time.

Mr A. Krsticevic moved, That the debate be adjourned.

Question put and passed.

7. Criminal Law (Unlawful Consorting) Bill 2020

The Order of the Day for the resumption of the debate upon the second reading of the bill was read. Debate resumed.

Debate interrupted by the Chair (Mr S.A. Millman speaking) and adjourned until a later stage of the sitting.

9. Matter of Public Interest – Supporting Small Businesses
