[Mining Amendment Bill 2024](#)

(Minister for Mines and Petroleum) (No.194)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the Mining Act 1978 and to make consequential amendments to the Mining Legislation Amendment Act 2014.

Introduced and read a first time.

[Privacy and Responsible Information Sharing Bill 2024](#)

(Attorney General) (No.158)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide a framework to protect the privacy of personal information handled by public entities, Ministers, Parliamentary Secretaries and contracted service providers to public entities; and to provide a framework to authorise the responsible sharing of information held by public entities; and to establish the office of Chief Data Officer; and to amend the Freedom of Information Act 1992; and to make consequential amendments to other Acts; and for related purposes.
