THURSDAY, 21 JUNE 2018

1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 9.00 am pursuant to adjournment.

The Speaker took the Chair.

An Acknowledgement of Country and Prayers were read.

2. Brief Ministerial Statements

Brief Ministerial Statements were made by –

The Minister for Health on the proclamation of section 87 and Part 3 of the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (WA) Amendment Act 2018.

4. Road Traffic Amendment (Driving Offences) Bill 2018

The Minister for Road Safety, pursuant to notice, moved,

5. Railway (METRONET) Bill 2018
