(Treasurer) (No.183)

The purpose of this Bill is to establish Keystart; and to repeal the Country Housing Act 1998; and to make consequential amendments to various written laws; and for related purposes.

Introduced; read a first time.

Second reading agreed.

Consideration in detail.

Bill read a third time and presented to the Legislative Council for concurrence.

[Architects Amendment Bill 2024](#)

(Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Commerce) (No.189)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the Architects Act 2004 and to make consequential amendments to various written laws.

Introduced; read a first time.

Second reading; adjourned debate.

[Family Court Amendment \(Commonwealth Reforms\) Bill 2024](#)

(Attorney General) (No.187)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the Family Court Act 1997 and to consequentially amend other Acts.
