Page 26, after line 8 — To insert:

53A. Section 77X amended

After section 77X(1)(f) insert:

- (fa) section 98(2) is to be read as if a reference to a direction given under section 47(1), 71(1) or 75(1) included a reference to a direction given under section 77O(1);

Clauses 54 to 168 agreed to.

Title agreed to.
