SYNOPSIS OF BILLS

Health Services Amendment Bill 2022

(Minister for Health) (No. 34)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Health Services Act 2016*; and the *Mental Health Act 2014*; and the *Motor Vehicle (Catastrophic Injuries) Act 2016*; and the *Queen Elizabeth II Medical Centre Act 1966*; and the *University Medical School, Teaching Hospitals, Act 1955*.

Second reading, debated and agreed to.

Auditor General Amendment Bill 2022

(Attorney General) (No. 88)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the Auditor General Act 2006.

Liquor Control Amendment (Protected Entertainment Precincts) Bill 2022

(Minister for Racing and Gaming) (No. 90)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Liquor Control Act 1988* and to consequentially amend other Acts.

Directors' Liability Reform Bill 2022

(Attorney General) (No. 89)

The purpose of this bill is to amend *The Criminal Code* and various other Acts in relation to the criminal liability of directors and other persons involved in the management of bodies corporate, and for related purposes.

- (3) reviewing the fees and charges of the Public Trustee together with the communication protocols used for informing clients of the statements of their estates and trusts;
- (4) reviewing level of fee subsidisation across estates and trusts; and
- (5) reviewing supplier policies and procedures.
