The Leader of the House, pursuant to the foregoing motion, moved,

That for the present Parliament –

- (1) the Procedure and Privileges Committee consists of the Speaker, Deputy Speaker and the members for Geraldton, Pilbara and Roe;
- (2) the Public Accounts Committee consists of the members for Armadale, Bateman, Darling Range, Mount Lawley and North West Central;
- (3) the Community Development and Justice Standing Committee consists of the members for Bunbury, Burns Beach, Carine, Dawesville and Hillarys;
- (4) the Economics and Industry Standing Committee consists of the members for Churchlands, Forrestfield, Jandakot, Swan Hills and Warren-Blackwood; and
- (5) the Education and Health Standing Committee consists of the members for Kimberley, Mirrabooka, Moore, Nedlands and Wanneroo.

Question put and passed.

7. Parliamentary Services Committee

The Leader of the House, pursuant to the foregoing motion, moved,

That -

- (1) for the present Session, the Parliamentary Services Committee consists of the Speaker and the members for Belmont, Central Wheatbelt, Geraldton, Girrawheen and Vasse; and
- (2) that the Legislative Council be acquainted accordingly.

Question put and passed.

8. Joint Standing Committee on the Corruption and Crime Commission

The Leader of the House, pursuant to the foregoing motion, moved,

That -

- (1) for the present Parliament, in accordance with Legislative Assembly Standing Orders 288 to 292, a Joint Standing Committee on the Corruption and Crime Commission be appointed by the Legislative Assembly and the Legislative Council; and
- (2) the Legislative Assembly requests the Legislative Council to agree to a similar resolution.

Question put and passed.

9. Joint Standing Committee on the Commissioner for Children and Young People

The Leader of the House, pursuant to the foregoing motion, moved,

- (1) That for the present Parliament
 - (a) pursuant to section 51 of the *Commissioner for Children and Young People Act 2006*, a Joint Standing Committee on the Commissioner for Children and Young People be appointed by the Legislative Assembly and the Legislative Council;
 - (b) the Joint Standing Committee shall comprise 2 members appointed by the Legislative Assembly and 2 members appointed by the Legislative Council;
 - (c) it is the function of the Joint Standing Committee to
 - (i) monitor, review and report to Parliament on the exercise of the functions of the Commissioner for Children and Young People;
 - (ii) to examine Annual and other Reports of the Commissioner; and
 - (iii) to consult regularly with the Commissioner;
 - (d) a report of the Joint Standing Committee will be presented to the Legislative Assembly and the Legislative Council by members of the Joint Standing Committee nominated by it for that purpose; and
 - (e) the Standing Orders of the Legislative Assembly relating to Standing and Select Committees will be followed as far as they can be applied.
- (2) That the Legislative Assembly requests the Legislative Council to agree to a similar resolution.

Question put and passed.

10. Loan Bill 2017 – Suspension of Standing Orders

The Leader of the House, pursuant to notice, moved,

That so much of the Standing Orders be suspended as is necessary to enable the Loan Bill 2017 to be dealt with while the Address in Reply has priority and to proceed without delay between the stages.

Debate ensued.

11. Loan Bill 2017
