1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 12.00 noon pursuant to adjournment.

Millman presented a petition from 344 people asking the Legislative Assembly to ask the Minister for Planning to take the current and future needs of Noranda into account and reject the proposed scheme amendment of the Noranda Nursery site at 81 Camboon Road, Noranda (P. 135).

8. Police Amendment (Medical Retirement) Bill 2019

The Minister for Police, pursuant to notice, moved,

That a bill for "An Act to amend the *Police Act 1892* and to amend the *Industrial Relations Act 1979* consequentially." be introduced and read a first time.

Question put and passed.

The Minister for Police presented an explanatory memorandum and bill read a first time.

The Minister for Police moved, That the bill be now read a second time.

Ms L. Mettam moved, That the debate be adjourned.

Question put and passed.

9. Suitors' Fund Amendment Bill 2017

The Order of the Day for the consideration in detail of Legislative Council Message No. 80 was read.

The Legislative Council acquaints the Legislative Assembly that it has agreed to the *Suitors' Fund Amendment Bill 2017* subject to the amendments contained in the Schedule annexed; in which amendments the Legislative Council desires the concurrence of the Legislative Assembly.

18. Review of Act

- (1) The Minister must review the operation and effectiveness of this Act, and prepare a report based on the review, as soon as practicable after the 2nd anniversary of the day on which the *Suitors' Fund Amendment Act 2017* section 6 comes into operation.
- (2) The review must address the following
 - (a) the effect of the levy payable under section 5 on access by litigants to the courts;
 - (b) the extent to which recommendations from reports of the Law Reform Commission of Western Australia relating to the operation of this Act have not been implemented; and
 - (c) any other matters that appear to the Minister to be relevant to the operation and effectiveness of this Act.
- (3) The Minister must cause the report to be laid before each House of Parliament as soon as practicable after it is prepared, but not later than 12 months after the 2nd anniversary.

12. Speaker's Statement – Answers to Questions on Notice

The Speaker advised that he had asked the Assembly Office to review all queries raised by Members under Standing Order 80(2) the previous day and had confirmed that all Questions on Notice subject to the queries were overdue. As such, use of this Standing Order to ask Ministers why no answer had been received was appropriate. The Assembly Office had distributed each of the 127 answers it had received the previous day, in accordance with the protocol agreed between the Department of the Premier and Cabinet and the Legislative Assembly. Members were also advised that a Minister's response to the effect that they are not obliged to answer a Question on Notice will not be considered a meaningful response as it leaves doubt as to whether the Minister will actually respond. The Speaker indicated that, should a Minister not wish to respond, the Minister should say so. Finally, the Speaker reminded all members that Questions on Notice are an important part of the Parliament's role in holding the Executive to account.
