TUESDAY, 16 MAY 2023

1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 1.00 pm pursuant to adjournment.

The Speaker took the Chair.

9. Workers Compensation and Injury Management Bill 2023

10. Local Government Amendment Bill 2023

Message No. 98 dated 11 May 2023 from the Legislative Council was reported agreeing to the bill without amendment.

11. Major Events Bill 2023

Message No. 99 dated 11 May 2023 from the Legislative Council was reported as follows –

The Legislative Council acquaints the Legislative Assembly that it has agreed to the *Major Events Bill 2023* subject to the amendment contained in the Schedule annexed; in which amendment the Legislative Council desires the concurrence of the Legislative Assembly.

Schedule indicating the amendment made by the Legislative Council in the Major Events Bill 2023

No. 1

New Clause 107A, page 81, after line 3 — To insert:

107A. Review of Act

- (1) The Minister must review the operation and effectiveness of this Act, and prepare a report based on the review, as soon as practicable after the 5th anniversary of the day on which this section comes into operation.
- (2) The Minister must cause the report to be laid before each House of Parliament as soon as practicable after it is prepared, but not later than 12 months after the 5th anniversary.

Leave was granted to consider in detail Legislative Council Message No. 99 forthwith.

CONSIDERATION IN DETAIL

The Leader of the House, on behalf of the Minister for Tourism, moved, That amendment No. 1 be agreed to.

Amendment No. 1 agreed to.

Consideration in detail concluded and the Legislative Council acquainted accordingly.

14. Matter of Public Interest – Banksia Hill

The Speaker informed the Assembly that she was in receipt of a notice from Mr R.S. Love that he intended to move a motion on a matter of public interest.

Mr R.S. Love moved,

That this House condemns the McGowan Labor Government for its failure to manage Banksia Hill, exposing our State to the dangerous repercussions of a failed corrective service.
