- (a) can the Minister confirm that the hand-written queries and concerns on the document about the generous terms offered to One Movement, in relation to A&R Worldwide were written by Richard Muirhead; and
 - (i) if not, by whom;
- (b) will the Minister table any documentary responses to these handwritten queries; and
 - (i) if not, why not;
- (c) did Ms Doherty declare any conflict of interest to anyone in preparing or delivering this memo regarding her intention to take up employment with One Movement officially in 14 November 2008; and

(d) is the Minister aware that Saskia Doherty's own linkedin.com website stated that since October 2008 she had been event director at the One Movement festival, as revealed in State Parliament on 25 November 2009?

5332. Mr J.N. Hyde to the Minister for Tourism

In relation to Eventscorp's sponsorship of the Margaret River Surf, Music and Arts Festival, and the 2009 sponsorship agreement, I ask:

- on what grounds did Tourism Western Australia verify the claim under "deliverables" that the event is 100 per cent owned and run by Western Australian-based organisations, ensuring all wages and spending will be retained in the State;
- (b) what audit has the department undertaken to ensure that all wages and spending were retained within Western Australia; and
- (c) will the Minister table any and all audit documents; and
 - (i) if not, why not?

5333. Mr J.N. Hyde to the Minister for Tourism

In relation to the February 2010 alleged financial analysis of the October 2009 One Movement festival conducted by Synovate for One Movement and only involving 118 spend interviews, I ask:

- (a) why do the detailed findings not include caterers at the festival who were charged \$1,500 for a site and incurred \$10,000 in losses due to One Movement not delivering the audiences promised;
- (b) why doesn't Eventscorp accurately include the net losses of participants in the economic analyses;
- (c) under "lessons learned", the analysis states that despite the number of interstate and international delegates being much lower than expected, they just fell short of their target, completing 53 out of 60 interviews. How many interstate and international delegates actually attended in 2009 and 2010, compared with the original expected attendance Eventscorp based their sponsorship agreement on?

5334. Mr J.N. Hyde to the Minister for Tourism

In relation to the 9 September 2008 Eventscorp letter regarding changes to the conditions for funding the One Movement Festival from future One Movement employee Saskia Doherty in her then role as Eventscorp Manager Event Development, I ask:

- (a) will the Minister table the information referred to in condition (k) of that letter, which states that the information will be protected as commercial in confidence by Tourism Western Australia; and
 - (i) if not, why not; and
- (b) has the Minister or his agencies sought advice on the ramifications or validity of (k); and
 - (i) if not, why not; and
 - (ii) if so, please table that advice; and
 - (A) if not, why not?

5335. Mr J.N. Hyde to the Minister for Tourism

In relation to the One Movement Pty Ltd Financial Report for the Year ended 31 December 2010, I ask:

- (a) does the document on page three state that there are three shareholders (including Chitty Pty Ltd but not including Sunset Events Pty Ltd) with one share each in One Movement;
- (b) does the Eventscorp statement of conditions listed in their letter of 9 September 2008 to Sunset Events regarding One Movement state at (d) that there is to be a guarantee that Sunset Events will retain a minimum shareholding in the entity formed to hold the intellectual property in the Event and to own and operate the Event and will not own less than 51 per cent without Tourism Western Australia's prior consent;
- (c) has Tourism Western Australia given its approval for Sunset Events to own less than 51 per cent; and
 - (i) if not, why not; and
- (d) has the Minister's officers or agencies provided any advice on who actually owns One Movement and will he table that advice; and
 - (i) if not, why not?

5336. Mr M. McGowan to the Minister for Housing

I refer to the Barnett Government's awarding of Department of Housing maintenance contracts to three major groups, and I ask:

- (a) as at 1 May 2011, could the Minister advise (expressed as a percentage), how each of the three individual companies (Transfield, Lake Maintenance and Programmed Facility Management) are meeting each of the following performance indicators:
 - (i) 100 per cent of job orders completed on time for emergency works (3 hours);
 - (ii) 100 percent of job orders completed on time for priority works (48 hours);
 - (iii) 100 percent of job orders completed on time for routine works (14 calendar days);
 - (iv) 100 percent of job orders completed on time for major works (28 calendar days);
 - (v) 100 percent of agreed completion time for vacant premises to deliver a corporate target of seven days average for the State; and
 - (vi) 100 percent contractor availability and completion of after-hours emergency maintenance necessary works;
- (b) if the Minster cannot provide the answer to (a), why not; and
- (c) if the Minister can provide the answer to (a), could the Minister also advise what the average turn-around in hours or calendar days is for each of the above performance indicators?

As at 30 April 2011, could the Minister advise:

- (a) the total number of vacant Department of Housing houses across Western Australia and the reasons for their vacancy;
- (b) the total number of vacant houses per Department of Housing district;

- (c) the total number of vacant houses per metropolitan suburb;
- (d) the total number of vacant houses in towns and cities outside the metropolitan area; and
- (e) how long each of the houses referred to in (c) and (d) have been vacant?

5338. Mr M. McGowan to the Minister for Housing

What is the total number of people associated with the public housing wait-list as at 30 April 2011?

5339. Mr M. McGowan to the Minister for Housing

With reference to the wait-list for Department of Housing accommodation as at 30 April 2011, could the Minister advise the number of:

- (a) applicants on the wait-list for Department of Housing accommodation;
- (b) children and dependents associated with applicants on the wait-list for Department of Housing accommodation;
- (c) children and dependents associated with applicants on the wait-list for Department of Housing accommodation per district;
- (d) applicants on the priority housing wait-list;
- (e) applicants on the priority housing wait-list per district;
- (f) children and dependents associated with applicants on the priority housing wait-list; and
- (g) children and dependents associated with applicants on the priority housing wait-list per district?
