1. Meeting of Assembly

Burswood Multi-purpose Stadium – Mr R.H. Cook presented a petition from 927 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly pressures the Government to reconsider the site for the proposed multipurpose stadium at Burswood, and instead consider the site at Kitchener Park in Subiaco (P. 551).

Skilled Local Jobs – Ms L.L. Baker presented a petition from 26 persons requesting that Legislative Assembly takes full and comprehensive action to ensure a greater share of skilled work for major resources projects is performed in Western Australia (P. 552).

Midland Train Line – Ms L.L. Baker presented a petition from 25 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly ensures that the Barnett Government builds adequate car parking on the Midland train line (P. 553).

Carpark Facilities Cockburn Central Railway Station – Mr F.M. Logan presented a petition from 221 persons requesting that the Legislative Assembly call upon the State Government to commit to building a new overpass road bridge joining an upgraded North Lake Road to Armadale Road and a new rail station with car parking at Russell Road (P. 554).

- immediately halt plans to withdraw police officers and administration staff from PCYCs; and
- (2) explain why he has broken his 2008 promise to reinstate school based police officers.

16. Suspension of Standing Orders

The Deputy Premier, without notice, moved, That so much of the Standing Orders be suspended as is necessary to enable a motion to be debated forthwith referring matters relating to the Kimberley Ultramarathon event to the Economics and Industry Standing Committee.

Question put.

The Speaker having counted the House, and an absolute majority being present and there being no dissentient voice, declared the motion to be carried with the concurrence of an absolute majority of the whole number of members of the House.

17. Economics and Industry Standing Committee – Referral to Committee – 2011 Kimberley Ultramarathon

The Deputy Premier, pursuant to the foregoing motion, moved,

- (1) That the Economics and Industry Standing Committee investigate and report by 21 June on the 2011 Kimberley Ultramarathon event held by RacingThePlanet (RTP) which resulted in injuries to a number of participants. The investigation will include:
 - (a) whether RTP took all reasonable steps to identify and reduce risks and maintain the safety of competitors, employees, contractors, spectators and volunteers in the preparation for and the running of the event and in responding to the fire and the injuries, including access to medical support and evacuations;
 - (b) the extent to which the terms and conditions applied by an event organiser to employees, volunteers and competitors and any associated sponsorship agreement with WA Tourism should reasonably protect the safety and interests of competitors, employees, contractors, volunteers and spectators;
 - (c) insurance and civil liabilities matters and the appropriateness of the *Civil Liability Act 2002* (Western Australia) provisions regarding liability of operators and organisation of recreational activities particularly of a high risk nature;
 - (d) the extent to which WA Tourism adequately assessed the qualifications, capability, experience, and capacity of RTP to organise, promote and run the event safely and with appropriate protections to competitors, employees, contractors, volunteers and spectators and the extent to which these should be assessed for future events;
 - (e) the role and actions of Western Australian government departments and agencies, including WA Tourism, DEC, FESA, Police and Health departments and local governments in respect of the event and the protection and rescue of competitors, employees, contractors, volunteers and spectators; and

- (f) whether there are measures that should be taken by government to ensure the risks including bush fires in remote areas in the context of extreme sporting events are adequately identified and addressed.
- (2) That the member for Midland be co-opted to the Committee for this inquiry.

Debate ensued.

Question put and passed.

18. Variation to the Order of Business

Ordered, That Government Business Order of the Day No. 1 be next considered.

19. Education and Care Services National Law (WA) Bill 2011

The Order of the Day for the resumption of the debate upon the second reading of the bill was read.

The Minister for Planning, That the bill be now read a third time.
