# FIRST SESSION OF THE FORTIETH PARLIAMENT

# WEDNESDAY, 7 AUGUST 2019

### 1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 12.00 noon pursuant to adjournment.

The Speaker took the Chair.

An Acknowledgement of Country and Prayers were read.

# 2. Death of Hon John Kobelke – a former Member of the Legislative Assembly

The Premier, without notice, moved,

That the House records its sincere regret at the death of Hon John Kobelke and tenders its deep sympathy to his family.

The motion was supported by Mrs L.M. Harvey, Mr D.T. Redman, Mrs M.H. Roberts, Mr T.J. Healy, Ms M.M. Quirk, Mr J.E. McGrath, Dr A.D. Buti, Ms J.M. Freeman, Ms R. Saffioti, Mr D.A. Templeman, Ms L.L. Baker, Mr C.J. Tallentire, Mrs J.M.C. Stojkovski, Ms A. Sanderson, Mr R.H. Cook, Mr D.R. Michael and the Speaker.

Question put and passed unanimously with members and officers of the Assembly standing in their places as a mark of respect.

#### 3. Questions

Questions without Notice were taken.

Questions on Notice Nos 5339 to 5373 were asked.

Questions on Notice Nos 5189, 5199 to 5202, 5205, 5231, 5236, 5240, 5241, 5244, 5245 and 5248 were answered.

### 4. Petition

Geraldton Sobering Up Centre – Mr I.C. Blayney presented a petition from 453 people asking the Legislative Assembly to call on the Premier to re-open the Geraldton Sobering Up Centre (P. 142).

# 5. Education and Health Standing Committee

The Acting Speaker reported that responses by the Premier; Treasurer; Minister for Health; and Minister for Housing to the recommendations of the Education and Health Standing Committee's Report No. 6, The Food Fix: The role of diet in type 2 diabetes prevention and management, had not been received by the required time.

# 10. Suspension of Standing Orders

The Minister for Police, without notice, moved, That so much of the Standing Orders be suspended as is necessary to enable –

- (a) Government Business to have precedence after 4.00 pm today to allow the Minister for Health to move the first and second reading of the Voluntary Assisted Dying Bill 2019 and complete his second reading speech; and
- (b) Private Members' Business to commence immediately after debate has been adjourned on that Bill following the Minister's speech and to take precedence for three hours from that point.

Debate ensued.

Question put.

The Acting Speaker having counted the House, and an absolute majority being present and there being no dissentient voice, declared the motion to be carried with the concurrence of an absolute majority of the whole number of members of the House.

#### 11. Voluntary Assisted Dying Bill 2019

The Minister for Health, pursuant to notice, moved,

That a bill for "An Act -

- to provide for and regulate access to voluntary assisted dying; and
- to establish the Voluntary Assisted Dying Board; and
- to make consequential amendments to other Acts." be introduced and read a first time.

Question put and passed.

The Minister for Health presented an explanatory memorandum and bill read a first time.

The Minister for Health moved, That the bill be now read a second time.

The following papers were presented and ordered to lie upon the Table of the House – By the Minister for Health –

Health, Minister for – Voluntary Assisted Dying Bill 2019, Process Flowchart (2634). Health, Minister for – Voluntary Assisted Dying Bill 2019, Summary of Safeguards (2635).

Mrs A.K. Hayden moved, That the debate be adjourned.

Question put and passed.

# 13. Western Australia Country Medical Services

Ms M.J. Davies, pursuant to notice, moved,

That this House expresses its grave concern about the medical crisis in country Western Australia and the lack of resources and priority for country health.

Debate ensued.

Debate interrupted by the Chair (Mr D.T. Punch speaking) and adjourned until a later stage of the sitting.
