SYNOPSIS OF BILLS

The following synopsis of Bills dealt with by the Legislative Assembly this week, is intended only to give a brief outline of the purpose of each Bill at the second reading stage of the Bill and the stages it was dealt with in the Legislative Assembly.

Electricity Industry Amendment (Distributed Energy Resources) Bill 2023

(Minister for Energy) (No. 127)

The purpose of this bill is to amend the *Electricity Industry Act 2004* in relation the State electricity objective, distributed energy resources and the regulation of network access, distribution networks and power system security, and to make consequential amendments to other Acts.

Second reading debated and agreed.

Consideration in detail.

Bill read a third time and forwarded to the Legislative Council.

Public Education Endowment Repeal Bill 2023

(Minister for Education) (No. 133)

The purpose of this bill is to repeal the *Public Education Endowment Act 1909*, to consequentially amend certain Acts and for related matters.

Introduced and read a first time.

Second reading speech delivered and debate adjourned.

Health Practitioner Regulation National Law Application Bill 2023

(Minister for Health) (No. 131)

The purpose of this bill is to apply the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (with modifications) as a law of the State; and to repeal the *Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (WA) Act 2010*; and to make consequential amendments to other Acts; and for related purposes.

Introduced and read a first time.

Second reading speech delivered and debate adjourned.

Reserves Bill 2023

(Minister for Lands) (No. 134)

The purpose of this bill is to excise certain areas of land from class A reserves; and to amend the classification of certain reserved land; and to amend the purpose of certain reserved land.

Introduced and read a first time.

Second reading speech delivered and debate adjourned.

Electoral Amendment (Finance and Other Matters) Bill 2023

(Minister for Electoral Affairs) (No. 130)

The purpose of this bill is to amend the *Electoral Act 1907* and to make consequential amendments to the *Adoption Act 1994*, the *Local Government Act 1995* and the *Referendums Act 1983*.

Second reading debated and agreed.

Consideration in detail and amended.

Primary Industries in Western Australia (11/10/23)

Mr P.J. Rundle, on behalf of Mr R.S. Love, moved –

This House condemns the WA Labor Government for its blatant disregard for primary industries, as evidenced by the ill-considered fishing policies, its abrupt ban of native forest harvesting, and its failure to stand against Federal Labor's devastating live sheep export ban, weakening the foundation of Western Australia's economy and betraying the livelihoods of regional Western Australians.

Perth Children's Hospital (10/10/23)

Ms L. Mettam, moved –

That this House condemns the Cook Labor Government for not ensuring Ward 5A in Perth Children's Hospital is a safe environment, almost two years after an alleged sexual assault within the unit and calls on the government to publicly release the reviews into the incident, without identifying information, as a priority to restore confidence in the hospital system.
