Schedule indicating the amendment made by the Legislative Council in the Domestic Violence Orders (National Recognition) Bill 2017

No. 1

New Clause 33A, page 21, after line 17 — To insert:

33A. Review of Act

- (1) The Minister must carry out a review of the operation and effectiveness of this Act as soon as is practicable after the 3rd anniversary of the day on which this section comes into operation.
- (2) The Minister must prepare a report based on the review and, as soon as is practicable after the report is prepared, cause it to be laid before each House of Parliament.

Ordered by leave, That Legislative Council Message No. 16 be considered in detail forthwith.

The Attorney General moved, That amendment No. 1 be agreed to.

Question put and passed.

Consideration in detail concluded.

Ordered, That the Legislative Council be acquainted accordingly.
