The Minister for Planning on amendments to the Residential Design Codes that aim to boost housing supply by granting some exemptions to compliant granny flats.

The Minister for Housing on the completion of the second stage of the Spalding Urban Renewal Project.

The Minister for Youth on the RSL WA Cadet of the Year Awards.
