1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 9.00 a.m. pursuant to adjournment.

The Speaker took the Chair.

Prayers were read.

2. Paper

The following paper was presented and ordered to lie upon the Table of the House –

5. Education and Health Standing Committee

Schedule indicating the amendments made by the Legislative Council in the Criminal Investigation Amendment Bill 2010

No. 1

Page 2, lines 12 to 19 — To delete the lines and insert —

- (a) in item 4 delete “Doctor” and insert:

Doctor, or a qualified person who is a nurse, midwife or other prescribed person

- (b) in item 6 delete “Doctor” and insert:

Doctor, or a qualified person who is a nurse, midwife or other prescribed person

No. 2

Page 2, after line 9 — To insert —

4A. Section 73 amended

In section 73 insert in alphabetical order:

midwife means a person registered under the *Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (Western Australia)* whose name is entered on the Register of Midwives kept under that Law;

Ordered, That consideration in detail of Legislative Council Message No. 140 be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting of the Assembly.
