1. Safeguarding of Children

Hon Sophia Moermond to move —

That the Legislative Council —

- (a) acknowledges the risk social media has for children on their emotional, physical, cognitive and social wellbeing;
- (b) supports calls for the restriction of access to explicit material for minors and for safeguarding measures to be implemented by social media platforms;
- (c) recognises the harm that porn causes to individuals and society through perpetuating and normalising violence against women; and
- (d) recognises that the hyper sexualisation of girls and the role social media plays in grooming is increasing.

2. Retention of State Emergency Services volunteers

Hon Sophia Moermond to move —

That the Legislative Council recognises —

- (a) there are challenges relating to volunteer retention in the State Emergency Service Volunteer's Association of Western Australia (SESVA);
- (b) the need for volunteers will increase due to population growth and urbanisation;
- (c) the need for volunteers will increase due to the reduction in precipitation and the abstraction of water from existing sources leading to dryer conditions
- (d) a lack of recognition and large volumes of administrative duties are factors that influence retention of volunteers negatively; and
- (e) one strategy to improve retention and reduce disenfranchisement could be to provide free certification courses via TAFE to improve employment opportunities as well as personal satisfaction and an overall improved skillset in the general community.
