SYNOPSIS OF BILLS

The following synopsis of Bills dealt with by the Legislative Assembly this week, is intended only to give a brief outline of the purpose of each Bill at the second reading stage of the Bill and the stages it was dealt with in the Legislative Assembly.

[Reserves Bill 2024](#)

(Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Planning) (No.171)

The purpose of this Bill is to reserve land for the purposes of national parks, conservation parks and other purposes; and to change the classification or purpose of certain reserves; and to excise certain areas of land from reserves; and to effect other changes to land; and to amend the Reserves (National Parks, Conservation Parks, Nature Reserves and Other Reserves) Act 2004 consequentially.

Second reading agreed.

Bill read a third time and presented to the Legislative Council for concurrence.

[Mining Amendment \(Transfer of Royalty Administration\) Bill 2024](#)

(Minister for Mining) (No.172)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the Mining Act 1978 and the Taxation Administration Act 2003.

Second reading agreed.

Bill read a third time and presented to the Legislative Council for concurrence.

[Associations and Co-operatives Legislation Amendment Bill 2024](#)

(Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Commerce) (No.186)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the Associations Incorporation Act 2015 and the Co-operatives Act 2009.
