- (c) if no to (b), why were tenders not called; and
- (d) which individual and organisations received payments, and how much did each receive?

7600. Mr M.P. Murray to the Minister for Police

- (1) In relation to the fatal stabbing of 40 year old Graham Stanley Wallum in his Brunswick Junction home on Sunday 4 March 2012, and attempts of residents to call police for assistance, I ask:
 - (a) was a call made to the Australiad Police Station to report the incident and was that call diverted to Perth;
 - (b) did the person taking the call advise the resident reporting the incident that they had no idea where Brunswick Junction was:
 - (c) why weren't police dispatched immediately when the resident told the operator the late Mr Graham Wallum was banging on the resident's door;
 - (d) why did the operator tell the caller that the person banging on the door was harmless and that the caller should ring Australind police station in the morning;
 - (e) what time was the first call reporting this event recorded;
 - (f) how many calls were logged to report this event;
 - (g) are recordings of these calls available;
 - (h) what time were the police dispatched to attend the event; and
 - (i) what time did the police arrive at the Mr Wallum's property?

7601. Mr R.H. Cook to the Minister for Health

I refer to the scandal around Poly Implant Prosthete (PIP) breast implants, in which industrial grade silicon was used instead of medical grade silicon resulting in rupture rates as high as 34 per cent and further medical complications, and ask:

- (a) estimations by the Therapeutic Good Association show that at least 12,000 PIP implants have been sold in Australia, does the Minister acknowledge that there are potentially over a thousand Western Australian women with PIP implants;
- (b) will the Department of Health cover the cost of ultrasounds for Western Australian women with PIP implants, who have no private health insurance, to determine whether or not their implants have ruptured; and

(c) given that many affected women cannot afford to have their implants removed, will the Minister consider the case for Western Australian women with ruptured implants to have their implants removed via the public elective surgery waitlist?

7602. Ms L.L. Baker to the Minister representing the Minister for Electoral Affairs

In relation to Local Government elections held in Western Australia, I ask:

- (a) what is the total number of complaints received by the Western Australian Electoral Commission (WAEC) in relation to alleged breaches of the *Local Government Act* 1995 where the allegation is that election material was not correctly authorised, for every Local Government election held between January 2008 and March 2012; and
 - (i) will the Minister provide a breakdown of the total number of complaints of this type against the relevant Local Government elections;
 - (ii) in how many cases were charges laid or disciplinary action instigated; and
 - (iii) in how many subsequent prosecutions have the WAEC been successful?

7603. Mr T.G. Stephens to the Minister for Local Government

I refer to the process of dealing with applications from local government authorities for a reduction in their meeting quorum, and I ask:

- (a) how many applications to reduce a meeting quorum have been received since October 2008:
- (b) will the Minister table a list of those applications and the outcome in each case, and if not, why not;
- (c) has the approval process for these applications been delegated by the Minister to the Department of Local Government, and if so, when was it delegated and for what reason;
- (d) what written policy setting is in place to guide the decision maker in reference to such quorum applications;
- (e) when was the policy written and will the Minister table the policy, and if not, why
