Treasurer's Advance Authorisation Bill 2022

(Treasurer) (No. 64)

The purpose of this bill is to authorise expenditure in the financial year ending on 30 June 2022 to make certain payments or to make advances for certain purposes.

Introduced and read a first time.

Railway (METRONET) Amendment Bill 2022

(Minister for Transport) (No. 63)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Railway (METRONET) Act 2018*.

Bill read a third time and forwarded to the Legislative Council for concurrence.

Mutual Recognition (Western Australia) Amendment Bill 2021

(Premier) (LC No. 58)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Mutual Recognition (Western Australia) Act 2020* and to make consequential amendments to other Acts.

Introduced and read a first time.

Second reading, debated and agreed.

Consideration in detail.

Bill read a third time and forwarded to the Legislative Council for concurrence.

Transport Legislation Amendment (Identity Matching Services) Bill 2021

(Minister for Transport) (LC No. 26)

The purpose of this bill is to amend the *Road Traffic (Administration) Act 2008*, the *Road Traffic (Authorisation to Drive) Act 2008* and the *Western Australian Photo Card Act 2014* to give effect to an intergovernmental agreement on identity matching services, and for related purposes.

Introduced and read a first time.

Second reading, adjourned debate.
