# **TUESDAY, 10 OCTOBER 2023 1.00pm**

#### 1. Meeting of Council

The Council assembled at 1.00pm pursuant to order.

The President, Hon Alanna Clohesy, took the Chair.

Prayers and an Acknowledgement of Country were read.

#### 2. Statement by President — Filling of Casual Vacancy — Hon Louise Kingston

The President made the following Statement —

I advise that I have received correspondence from the Electoral Commissioner, Mr Robert Kennedy, stating that he has declared Ms Louise Kingston to be elected as a Member of the Legislative Council to fill the vacancy in the South West Region.

I advise the Council that on Thursday, 28 September I presided over the swearing-in of Hon Louise Kingston as a Member of the Legislative Council.

I take this opportunity to congratulate and welcome the new Member to the Chamber.

The President tabled correspondence from the Electoral Commissioner Mr Robert Kennedy, advising that there is a vacancy in the South West region and that Ms Louise Kingston has been elected to fill that vacancy. (Tabled Paper 2684).

Point of Order

A third reading contribution is quite specific. It is about summarising the Bill as it has come through the Committee stage and articulating why a Member does or does not want to support it.

President's Ruling

The President ruled as follows —

I remind the Honourable Member of the limited scope of third reading debates, and that, in particular, contributions should be limited to the contents of the Bill as agreed by the Council in the Committee of the Whole stage, and not venture outside those very tight confines.

  - the first to have the title of the *Aboriginal Heritage Legislation Repeal Bill* 2023 and is to consist of
    - (i) Long Title "An Act to repeal the *Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act 2021* and regulations under that Act."; and
    - (ii) the following clauses
      - Clause 1, Short Title "This is the Aboriginal Heritage Legislation Repeal Act 2023."
      - Clause 2, Commencement "This Act comes into operation on a day fixed by proclamation."; and
      - Clause 3 as printed.
  - (b) the second Bill to have the title of the *Aboriginal Heritage Legislation*Amendment Bill 2023 and is to consist of
    - (i) Long Title —

"An Act —

- to amend the Aboriginal Heritage Act 1972; and
- to make consequential and related amendments to other written laws."; and
- (ii) the following clauses
  - Clause 1, Short Title "This is the Aboriginal Heritage Legislation Amendment Act 2023."; and
  - Clause 2, Commencement "This Act comes into operation as follows —
    - (a) Sections 1 and 2 on the day on which this Act receives the Royal Assent (assent day);
    - (b) the rest of the Act on a day fixed by proclamation, and different days may be fixed for different provisions.";
    - (c) Clauses 4 to 34 as printed,

(c) and to do such things as may be necessary to achieve that purpose, and thereafter report the Bills separately to the House.

Debate ensued.

Question — put.
