

TERMS OF REFERENCE

The Lesueur Community Consultative Committee

The Lesueur Community Consultative Committee (LCCC) will facilitate communication with the local community relating to the development of the Collie Hub project by the Collie Hub Joint Venture and the Department of Mines and Petroleum. The LCCC will be a forum through which information of interest related to the development of the Collie Hub can be disseminated and any issues or concerns can be brought to the attention of Government.

The LCCC will have access to information about the **Preparation phase** of the project including the technical investigation of the Lesueur as a suitable site for the sequestration of CO₂. Provided the technical investigation of the Lesueur site proves it is suitable, the LCCC will then have access to information relevant to the **Enabling case** of the project. This will entail the development of a proposed pipeline from the Kwinana area to the Lesueur and the injection of CO₂ into the Lower Lesueur for the purposes of testing its suitability as a sequestration site.

The purpose of the LCCC will be to make recommendations on the sharing of information with the community, community involvement and provide advice to the Department of Mines and Petroleum.

The LCCC will report to the Minister for Mines and Petroleum.

Terms of Reference

The LCCC will provide a forum:

- To ensure that all stakeholders are identified;
- For stakeholders to share information about the Lesueur and the Collie Hub project including its potential social, economic and environmental impacts; and,
- For the stakeholders to contribute to the collection and analysis of data to be used in the development of the Collie Hub proposal;

This will be achieved through:

- two way communication;
- disseminating information to the community to ensure that it has an understanding of the Lesueur as a potential CO₂ sequestration location;
- providing guidance to any future investigations and research related to issues of interest to the community; and,
- any other matters of interest to the community related to carbon capture and storage, as determined by the LCCC.

Membership and operation

The membership of the LCCC will consist of:

- An independent chair;
- A person nominated by the Federal Member for Forrest;
- A person nominated by the State Member for Murray-Wellington;
- Two members each nominated by the Shires of Harvey and Waroona;
- Three community members selected by the Director General of Mines and Petroleum following advertising in the Harvey-Waroona Reporter and the South West Times;
- An officer of the Department of Mines and Petroleum; and,
- A Representative of the Collie Hub Joint Venture.

The Department of Mines and Petroleum will provide organisational support for the LCCC.

It is anticipated that the LCCC will meet at least once every three months.

The LCCC will examine its role and operations in November 2012 to determine future directions, evaluate the terms of reference and operational matters and whether its membership should be amended to include representation from any other areas in proximity to carbon capture and transport infrastructure.

The LCCC will be a voluntary body.
