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## SYNOPSIS OF BILLS

### 2000-2001

The following synopsis of Bills introduced during the Third Session of the Thirty-Fifth Parliament is intended only to give a brief outline of the main features of each Bill at the stage when the second reading motion of the Bill was moved. The full second reading speech for each Bill is available in *Parliamentary Debates (Hansard)* which are available from the State Law Publisher or from the Parliament of W.A. Internet site (address: [www.parliament.wa.gov.au](http://www.parliament.wa.gov.au)). The ultimate stage reached by each Bill is also indicated. While it does not take into account amendments made in either House, reference can be made to the *Minutes* of the Legislative Council and *Votes and Proceedings* of the Legislative Assembly where amendments have been agreed to.

- \* Indicates the Act, or parts thereof, comes into operation on a date or dates to be fixed by Proclamation.
- [E] Indicates an Explanatory Memorandum was presented with the Bill.
- LC Indicates the Bill originated in the Legislative Council; all other Bills originated in the Legislative Assembly.
- (P.D.p.) Indicates the *Hansard* page number for the second reading of the Bill in the House in which it was first introduced.
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#### **Acts Amendment (Australian Datum) Bill 2000 \* (No. 92) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to facilitate Western Australia's part in a nation-wide change in the geographical datum used in Australia. A datum is a reference system that defines the location of features commonly shown on maps. There is more than one system in existence. Each system is based on a particular model of the earth. The effect of this Bill is to remove references to a specific datum in Western Australian legislation. When a reference to a datum is required, that datum will be prescribed by regulations rather than specified within the Act itself. Therefore, any new datum can be adopted by regulations, which will be far more efficient in terms of cost and time than regular legislative changes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 March 2000 (P.D.p. 5465)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 5 September 2000 and the Legislative Council on 9 November 2000.

Referred to the Standing Committee on Constitutional Affairs on 6 September 2000.

(Act No. 54 of 2000 -- assented to on 28 November 2000)

**Acts Amendment (Evidence) Bill 1999 (LC No. 1) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend -

- the *Evidence Act 1906*;
- the *Justices Act 1902*;
- the *Children's Court of Western Australia Act 1988*; and
- The *Criminal Code*.

The amendments effected by the Bill will -

- facilitate the admission of documentary and foreign evidence in trials involving complex commercial crime;
- allow for the admission of documentary evidence created using modern information technology;
- permit child and vulnerable witnesses to give their evidence on video-tape to save them from the trauma of giving evidence in open court;
- remove inappropriate requirements for the tendering of statements of child witnesses at the early stages of the prosecution process;
- allow the use of witness statements in prosecutions for crimes in the children's court and where there is an ex officio indictment, if the witness has died, is too ill to come to court, or simply cannot be found before the trial;
- restore an element of fairness when an accused person makes unsubstantiated assertions against the character of a deceased victim of a crime;
- extend certain provisions in the Evidence Act to the prosecution of offences where the offender has been charged with repealed Criminal Code sections; and
- allow a complainant in a sexual offence to authorise the publication or communication of their name without being held to be committing a crime.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 14 September 1999. (P.D.p. 1054)

Amended in the Legislative Council on 16 March 2000 and in the Legislative Assembly on 11 May 2000.

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No. 71 of 2000 -- assented to on 6 December 2000)

**Acts Amendment (Fines Enforcement and Licence Suspension) Bill 2000 \* (No. 146) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend two Acts in a number of respects. These Acts and amendments are as follows -

1. The *Fines Penalties and Infringement Notices Enforcement Act 1994* is amended to -
  - allow the Fines Enforcement Registrar to have the discretion to not impose or uplift a licence when there is undue hardship on the offender, and to allow a period of time to pay;
  - restrict the ability of certain offenders from undertaking Work and Development Orders when they may pose a safety risk to the public or the supervising Community Corrections Officer;
  - allow greater flexibility to the Fines Enforcement Register to enforce matters;
  - allow for a full range of enforcement sanctions, for collection of bail surety monies, where current enforcement is restricted to the issue of a warrant of execution; and
  - ensure the right of the Crown to attend for re-hearing matters.

2. The *Road Traffic Act 1974* is amended to -
- create a separate offence of driving under fine default suspension and allows for a greater range of sentencing dispositions for offences of driving under suspension, as provided for under the *Sentencing Act 1995*;
  - provide for the Police to caution an offender when contacted in the first instance, in circumstances where the driver is suspected of being under fine default suspension; and
  - address an existing anomaly, so as to bring the cancellation of probationary drivers' licences in line with other drivers' licences, in providing for such drivers' licences to be suspended rather than cancelled.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 June 2000. (P.D.p. 8407)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 8 November 2000.

(Act No. 51 of 2000 -- assented to on 28 November 2000)

#### **Acts Amendment (Iron Ore Agreements) Bill 2000 (No. 11) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to vary the Iron Ore (mount Newman, (Mount Goldsworthy), (Goldsworthy-Nimingarra), (Marillana Creek), (McCamey's Monster), Iron-Ore Direct Reduced Iron (BHP) and Iron Ore Beneficiation (BHP) Agreements.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 September 2000. (P.D.p. 1155)

(Act No. 57 of 2000 -- assented to on 7 December 2000)

#### **Acts Amendment (Prisons Administration) Bill 2000 (No. 101) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to make a number of amendments to the *Prisons Act 1981* and associated legislation, which will improve the administration of custodial offender service in this State. The Bill amends various Acts in relation to certain functions of the Governor in Executive Council, and of the Chief Executive Officer of the Ministry of Justice.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 March 2000. (P.D.p. 5254)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Acts Amendment (Public Trustee and Trustee Companies) Bill 2000 \* (No. 27) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to: address the inequity in management fees paid by Public Trustee Common Fund participants; align the operations of the Public Trustee to those of private sector trustee companies; provide support to disadvantaged members of the community and extend range of services; and effect reforms to improve efficiency and transparency of Public Trustee's operations.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 October 2000. (P.D.p. 1912)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Acts Amendment (Sexuality Discrimination) Bill 1997 (LC No. 75) (Hon. H.G. Hodgson)**

The purpose of the Bill is to prohibit discrimination on the basis of an individual's sexuality, assumed sexuality or transgender identity by inserting new definitions and parts into the *Equal Opportunity Act 1994*. The Bill specifically addresses the following areas: work provisions, education, goods, services and facilities; accommodation, clubs and incorporated associations, discrimination in sport, land and other areas. The Bill amends the *Criminal Code* in respect of equalising the age of consent for gay men. The Bill also repeals the *Law Reform (Decriminalization of Sodomy) Act 1989*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 17 September 1997. (P.D.p. 6302)

Referred to the Standing Committee on Legislation in the Legislative Council on the 19 November 1997 and the 9 September 1998.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 21 March 2000.

Referred to the Standing Committee on Legislation in the Legislative Council on 23 March 2000.

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Acts Amendment and Repeal (Competition Policy) Bill 2000 \* (No. 132) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal two Acts (the *Bread Act 1982* and the *Racing Restriction Act 1927*) and amend a number of other Acts in accordance with recommendations of National Competition Policy reviews of those laws, undertaken to comply with the State's obligations under the 1995 Competition Policy Agreements.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 May 2000. (P.D.p. 7270)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Animal Welfare Bill 1999 \* (No. 79) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the protection of animals by -

- regulating the use of animals for scientific purposes; and
- prohibiting cruel, inhumane or improper treatment of animals.

The Bill intends to accomplish this by -

- promoting and protecting the welfare, safety and health of animals;
- ensuring the proper and humane care and management of animals in accordance with generally accepted standards; and
- reflecting the community's expectation that people who are in charge of animals will ensure that they are properly treated and cared for.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3699)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

### **Bail Amendment Bill 2000 \* (No. 96) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to address a range of procedural difficulties that have arisen with the operation of the *Bail Act 1982*. The principal matters dealt with by the Bill are as follows -

- clarifies the process of bail for persons appearing before the Court in answer to a summons;
- provides that judicial officers, in addition to their existing authority to grant or refuse bail, will be able to dispense with bail in cases of trivial offending;
- provides that a defendant who is charged with murder or wilful murder will only be considered for bail where an application has been made by the defendant or their counsel;
- provides that a decision to refuse release on bail will extend without further consideration for bail where a trial extends beyond one day, unless the defendant or a person on behalf of the defendant applies for bail to be re-considered;
- broadens the class of persons with powers to approve sureties;
- clarifies which Court Officer is responsible for instituting proceedings following a defendant's failure to attend at Court in compliance with a bail undertaking;
- establishes a formal appeal process to the Court of Criminal Appeal for appeals against bail decision made in the Supreme, District and Children's Court; and
- extends the period for an initial appearance in Court from 7 to 30 days, to enable a defendant to appear on their initial appearance before a Magistrate.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 March 2000. (P.D.p. 5466)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

### **Building Legislation Amendment Bill 2000 \* (No. 123) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Builders Registration Act 1939* and the *Home Building Contracts Act 1991* to enhance the ability of the Builders' Registration Board to maintain high building standards in Western Australia and to improve the operation of the Building Disputes Committee, which is to be renamed and hereafter referred to as the Building Disputes Tribunal, to a level of service which is acceptable to both government and the community.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 May 2000. (P.D.p. 7141)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 17 October 2000 and the Legislative Council on 22 November 2000.

(Act No. 76 of 2000 -- assented to on 7 December 2000)

#### **Child Welfare Amendment Bill 1998 \* (No. 164)**

The purpose of this Bill is to regulate the operations of the Child Protection Services Register. The Register is the formal mechanism to improve co-ordination and co-operation across Government agencies.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 June 1998. (P.D.p. 4772)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 4 May 1999.

Referred to the Standing Committee on Legislation in the Legislative Council on 23 May 2000.

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Referred to the Standing Committee on Legislation in the Legislative Council on 5 September 2000.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Conservation and Land Management Amendment Bill 1999 \* (No. 77) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Conservation and Land Management Act 1984* to establish a new conservation body to be known as the "Conservation Commission of Western Australia", in which national parks, nature reserves, conservation parks, State forests and timber reserves will be vested.

The Bill contains related amendments including abolition of three existing bodies: the Lands and Forest Commission; the Forest Production Council; and the National Parks and Nature Conservation Authority. Amendments will also be made to the functions of the "Department of Conservation and Land Management", which will be re-named the "Department of Conservation".

The ability to contract for the harvesting of forest products from public land and timber sharefarm land and for the sale of those products will be removed from the *Conservation and Land Management Act 1984*. Those functions will be undertaken by the Forests Products Commission provided for in the *Forest Products Bill 1999*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3855)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 4 April 2000.

Referred to the Standing Committee on Ecologically Sustainable Development in the Legislative Council on 25 May 2000.

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 5 September 2000.



(Act No. 35 of 2000 -- assented to on 10 October 2000)

**Criminal Code Amendment (Home Invasion) Bill 2000 (No. 5) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to introduce a new section 244 to the Criminal Code, which extends the right to defend against home invasion. It gives home occupiers the power to use such force as they believe, on reasonable grounds, to be necessary to defend against the invasion of their dwelling which includes the whole surroundings of the dwelling as well as the dwelling itself.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 August 2000. (P.D.p. 389)

(Act No. 45 of 2000 -- assented to on 17 November 2000)

**Criminal Code Amendment (Protection of Seniors) Bill 2000 (No. 24) (Dr G.I. Gallop) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to increase the maximum penalties the courts can impose for the offences of: assault; robbery; burglary and fraud - in situations where the victim is aged 60 years or more.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 6 September 2000. (P.D.p. 799)

Second Reading not agreed to in the Legislative Assembly 15 November 2000.

**Criminal Code Amendment Bill (No. 3) 2000 (No. 30) (Mr J. A. McGinty) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for liability of husband and wife for offences committed by either of them with respect to others property.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 September 2000. (P.D.p. 1548)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Criminal Code Amendment Bill (No.2) 2000 (LC No. 17) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to address criminal law reform in the areas of -

- Paedophile sex tours;
- Acts or omissions causing bodily harm or danger;
- Disclosure of official secrets by contractors;
- Chapter IX - Unlawful assemblies and Breaches of the Peace;
- Restrictions on publication of stalking proceedings;
- Attempted infanticide;
- Stealing of mussels and other species raised using aquaculture;
- Property offences by spouses;
- Presence of accused at trial;
- Deletion of reference to "masters" and "servants" in The Criminal Code;
- Procuring, inciting or encouraging a child to commit an indecent act; and

- Offences concerning persons being found armed or similar with intent to commit an offence.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 19 September 2000. (P.D.p. 1347)

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Criminal Code Amendment Bill 2000 (LC No. 8) (Hon. H. Hodgson)**

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal the mandatory sentencing laws, known in this state as the three strike laws, as they have been applied to the offence of home burglary in this State.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 17 August 2000. (P.D.p. 476)

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Criminal Investigation (Identifying People) Bill 2000 \* (No. 46) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to expand the current ability in the Police Act for police to take fingerprints and photographs for identification purposes to include the ability to take dental impressions, foot and ear prints, as well as samples for DNA profiling.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 November 2000. (P.D.p. 3156)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Criminal Property Confiscation (Consequential Provisions) Bill 2000 \* (No. 25) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend various acts as a consequence of the changes proposed by the *Criminal Property Confiscation Bill 2000*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 6 September 2000. (P.D.p. 768)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 14 November 2000.

(Act No. 69 of 2000 -- assented to on 6 December 2000)

**Criminal Property Confiscation Bill 2000 \* (No. 145) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the confiscation in certain circumstances of property acquired as a result of criminal activity and property used for criminal activity, to provide for reciprocal enforcement of certain Australian legislation relating to the confiscation of profits of crime and the confiscation of other property, and for connected purposes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 June 2000. (P.D.p. 8611)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 19 October 2000.

(Act No. 68 of 2000 -- assented to on 6 December 2000)

**Culture, Libraries and the Arts (Consequential Provisions) Bill 1998 \* (No. 36) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to deal with the amendments that can now be made to the *Art Gallery Act 1959* and to the *Museum Act 1969* as a result of the process began over a year ago to ensure that the Art Gallery of Western Australia and the Western Australian Museum become service agencies of the new Ministry for Culture and the Arts. The Bill removes the Corporate Status of these statutory authorities and creates two statutory advisory bodies, the Art Gallery Advisory Board and the Museum Council. The Bill also re-establishes the Art Gallery Foundation and creates the Museum Science and Humanities Foundation. Finally, the Bill repeals the *Perth Theatre Trust Act 1979* and the *Library Board of Western Australia Act 1951*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 October 1998. (P.D.p. 2669)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Culture, Libraries and the Arts Bill 1998 \* (No. 35) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to, in conjunction with the *Culture, Libraries and the Arts (Consequential Provisions) Bill 1998*, makes the changes consequential to the formation of the Ministry of Culture and the Arts. The Bill has three major objectives -

- it establishes the Minister as a Body Corporate - The Corporate Minister;
- it defines the powers and responsibilities of the Body Corporate; and
- it establishes the Libraries Council of Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 October 1998. (P.D.p. 2667)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Director of Public Prosecutions Amendment Bill 2000 (No. 93) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to make a limited number of amendments to the *Director of Public Prosecutions Act 1991*, the effect of which will give the Director of Public Prosecutions the authority to bring and conduct, or take over, prosecutions for prescribed summary offences. The intention behind the Bill is limited in that it is presently planned only for prosecutions currently undertaken by the Western Australian Police Service. It will not impact upon the prosecution functions conducted by other agencies. The Crown Solicitor's Office will continue to undertake prosecutions on behalf of government agencies and those public sector agencies that prosecute their own cases, such as the Minister for Fair Trading and the Department of Transport, will continue to do so.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 March 2000. (P.D.p. 5253)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Electoral Amendment (Constitutional Provisions) Bill 2000 (LC No. 155) (Hon. J. A. Cowdell)**

The purpose of this Bill is to give effect to the Report of the Joint Select Committee on the Constitution (1991) and the Fiftieth Report of the Standing Committee on Legislation. This Bill amends the *Electoral Act 1907* and the *Constitution Acts Amendment Act 1899*. It contains provisions dealing with the eligibility and disqualification of persons elected to Parliament.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 12 October 2000. (P.D.p. 1980)

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Electoral Amendment Bill 2000 \* (No. 134) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to implement a number of changes recommended by the Western Australian Electoral Commissioner, including -

- providing for the formal registration of political parties;
- enabling greater efficiency and convenience in the casting and processing of absentee and postal votes, and in candidate nominations; and
- removing a number of obsolete provisions from the *Electoral Act 1907*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 June 2000. (P.D.p. 7621)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 20 September 2000.

(Act No. 36 of 2000 -- assented to on 10 October 2000)

**Electronic Transactions Bill 2000 \* (LC No. 4) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to facilitate and promote business and community confidence in the use of electronic transactions. The Bill will remove existing legal obstacles to conducting electronic transactions, and put in place default rules for the time and place of sending and receipt of electronic communications. It will allow complex administrative transactions to be delivered online. The Bill also gives legal effect to electronic signatures. The Bill also seeks to encourage industry to develop reliable solutions to e-commerce security issues. It provides guidance to users as to which information security functions are required for certain purposes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 6 September 2000. (P.D.p. 737)

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Financial Administration and Audit Amendment Bill 1999 (No. 67) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Financial Administration and Audit Act 1985* to allow for the implementation of accrual appropriations and a capital user charge. The Bill also contains an amendment to facilitate E-Commerce.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 October 1999. (P.D.p. 2787)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Referred to the Standing Committee on Estimates and Financial Operations in the Legislative Council on 5 September 2000.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 15 November 2000.

(Act No. 65 of 2000 -- assented to on 7 December 2000)

**First Home Owner Grant Amendment Bill 2000 (No. 13) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to extend access to the first home owner grant to New Zealand citizens who reside permanently in Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 October 2000. (P.D.p. 1911)

**Fish Resources Management Amendment Bill 1999 \* (No. 78) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Fish Resources Management Act 1994* to provide for a new type of licence (a "fishing tour operators licence") to be created by regulation. The commercial activity which the licence will regulate is the provision of "fee for service" recreational fishing tours, whether they are conducted

on board a "charter boat" or through another form of guided fishing service.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3456)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

### **Forest Products Bill 1999 \* (No. 76) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to establish the Forest Products Commission as the body that will be responsible for contracting for the harvesting of forest products on public land and for selling those products. It will also have similar responsibilities with respect to timber sharefarming agreements entered into under section 34B of the *Conservation and Land Management Act* 1984 if harvesting or sale of forest products is provided for under such an agreement.

The Forest Products Commission will effectively take over the commercial responsibilities that the Department of Conservation and Land Management presently has with respect to the harvesting and sale of forest products and matters related to the forest products industry.

### **Government Railways (Access) Amendment Bill 2000 (No. 112) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to establish an independent office of the Rail Access Regulator.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 3 May 2000. (P.D.p. 6428)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 19 October 2000 where Short Title amended to *Railways (Access) Amendment Bill 2000*.

(Act No. 55 of 2000 -- assented to on 28 November 2000)

**Guardianship and Administration Amendment Bill 1999 (LC No. 41) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to -

- amend the *Guardianship and Administration Act 1990*;
- allow for the appointment of alternative, conditional donees for Enduring Powers of Attorney;
- provide a hierarchy of persons who would be responsible to be able to provide consent without the need to apply to the Board for the appointment of a Guardian;
- provide additional functions for Plenary Guardians; and
- have donees of Enduring Powers of Attorney inform the Board if they become subject to bankruptcy provisions.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 23 September 1999. (P.D.p. 1595)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 11 May 2000.

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

**Heritage (Consequential Provisions) Bill 1999 \* (No. 94)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend various acts as a consequence of the changes proposed by the Heritage Bill 1999.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 June 1999. (P.D.p. 9558)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Heritage (Consequential Provisions) Bill 2000 \* (No. 19) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill amends or modifies certain related legislation in order to give effect to the provisions of the Heritage Bill 2000.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 November 2000. (P.D.p. 3290)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Heritage Bill 1999 \* (No. 95)**

The purpose of this Bill is to re-write the present legislation in a more logical arrangement, with greater use of "plain English", and retaining the fundamentals of the existing legislation. However, small but significant changes to the system have been made which will make it more effective and easier to administer, and will provide greater transparency in decision making responsibility together with better focussed review procedures to provide greater accountability.

### **Heritage Bill 2000 \* (No. 38) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to strengthen heritage protection in WA, simplify the registration process, require State Government agencies to compile their own heritage inventories, extend revaluation provisions to registered places, introduce a new Works Approval process, simplify Heritage Agreement provisions, introduce a new form of Conservation Order and increase monetary penalties for contraventions of the Act.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 November 2000. (P.D.p. 3286)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

### **Hope Valley-Wattleup Redevelopment Bill 2000 \* (No. 114) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to -

- provide for the development and redevelopment of certain land in the local government districts of Cockburn and Kwinana (particularly in Hope Valley and Wattleup);
- appoint the Western Australian Land Authority as the Authority to undertake the development and redevelopment; and
- provide the necessary powers for the Authority to undertake the development and redevelopment.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 60 April 2000. (P.D.p. 6135)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 29 June 2000.

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 21 November 2000.

(Act No. 77 of 2000 -- assented to on 7 December 2000)

### **Industrial Relations Amendment Bill 2000 (No. 51) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Industrial Relations Act 1979* to ensure that police officers have access to the public service arbitrator and to recognise the Western Australian Police Union of Workers as an organisation of employees.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 November 2000. (P.D.p. 3214)



Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 16 November 2000.

(Act No. 58 of 2000 -- assented to on 4 December 2000)

### **Labour Relations Legislation Amendment (No. 2) Bill 1997 (LC No. 64) (Hon. H.G. Hodgson)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Labour Relations Legislation Amendment Act 1997* ("principal Act"). Provisions of the Bill include -

- repealing Part 3 of the principal Act and inserting new provisions relating to pre-strike ballots resulting in the requirements that the ballot be secret, that a scrutineer be appointed by the Commission and that all known members of the union are available to vote;
- providing limited immunity from legal action in two situations: (i) where union action has been sanctioned by the secret ballot process; and (ii) where an employer or an employee engages in industrial action for the purpose of compelling the other party to enter into a workplace agreement;
- repealing Part 5 of the principal Act which removed the dual system of registration and awards at Federal and State levels;
- repealing the prohibition on the collection of union dues by employers;
- repealing section 34 of the principal Act so that the powers of entry revert to the former arrangements under which an employee could request that information relating to his or her employment be kept confidential;
- repealing Part 4 of the principal Act relating to political expenditure and transferring it, in an amended form that extends the requirement for disclosure to all public companies as defined in the *Corporations Law*, into the *Electoral Act 1907*.

**Law Reform (Miscellaneous Provisions(Asbestos Diseases))Bill 2000 (No. 18) (Mr L. Graham) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the survival of claims for damages in certain causes of action in relation to asbestos-related conditions by amend the *Law Reform (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1941*  
The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 6 September 2000. (P.D.p. 798)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Legal Contribution Trust Amendment Bill 2000 \* (No.137) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Legal Contribution Trust Act 1967* to widen the range of potential beneficiaries of surplus funding from the Legal Contribution Trust to include community legal centres and their peak organisations.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 June 2000. (P.D.p. 8614)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 20 September 2000.

(Act No. 38 of 2000 -- assented to on 10 October 2000)

**Local Government (Political Donations and Electoral Expenditure) Amendment Bill 1997 \* (No. 108) (Dr G.I. Gallop)**

The purpose of this Bill is to incorporate recommendation 142 of the Commission on Government requiring the disclosure of political donations received and electoral expenditure relating to local government elections.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 19 November 1997. (P.D.p. 8219)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Maritime and Transport Legislation Amendment and Repeal Bill 1999 \* (No. 37) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to consolidate into one Act matters relating to the Western Australian maritime industry that were previously covered under eight separate Acts. The Bill is presented in conjunction with the *Maritime Bill 1999*.

The Acts to be repealed are the -

- *Harbours and Jetties Act 1928*;
- *Jetties Act 1926*;
- *Lights (Navigation) Protection Act 1938*;
- *Marine and Harbours Act 1981*;
- *Marine Navigation Aids Act 1973*;

- *Pilots Limitation of Liability Act 1962;*
- *Shipping and Pilotage Act 1967; and*
- *Western Australian Marine Act 1982.*

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3876)

#### **Maritime Bill 1999 \* (No. 39) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to enable the provision of infrastructure necessary for the efficient and safe conduct of maritime activities and industries in Western Australia and to facilitate safety in relation to the design standards, construction, operation and navigation of vessels. The Bill has been drafted to provide government, industry and the community the flexibility to meet the current and future needs of this State's vibrant maritime industries and the demands of water based recreation. It will also provide government the flexibility for any future shift from direct provision and management of maritime services and activities.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3875)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Maritime Fees and Charges (Taxing) Amendment Bill 1999 (No. 34) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to validate any mooring or maritime dues and charges to be imposed under the *Maritime Bill 1999*, to the extent that any of those fees is a tax.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3877)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Medical Amendment Bill 2000 \* (No. 153) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Medical Act 1894* by creating a new category of conditional registration for suitably qualified overseas trained doctors who enter a scheme to provide general practitioner services in remote and rural parts of the state. The Bill also provides for the appointment to the Medical Board of a second legal practitioner.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 August 2000. (P.D.p. 386)

(Act No. 48 of 2000 -- assented to on 17 November 2000)

**Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Amendment Bill 2000 (LC No. 3) (Hon. N. Kelly)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act 1959*. The primary intent is to introduce into the Act the ability to make partial disallowance of omnibus amendments to the Metropolitan Region Scheme.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 10 August 2000. (P.D.p. 158)

Amended in the Legislative Council on 17 August 2000.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Mining Amendment Bill 2000 \* (LC No. 149) [E]**

The Bill provides an opportunity for prospectors to search for alluvial mineral deposits which may occur on land held under granted exploration licences.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 16 August 2000. (P.D.p. 375)

(Act No. 63 of 2000 -- assented to on 4 December 2000)

**Mount Yokine Land Acquisition Repeal Bill 2000 (No. 131) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal the *Mount Yokine Land Acquisition Act 1960*, to permit alternative land tenure to be put in place in favour of the Western Australian Golf Club (Inc.).

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 June 2000. (P.D.p. 8409)

**Nuclear Activities (Prohibition) Bill 2000 (LC No. 29) (Hon. G. Watson)**

The purpose of this Bill is to prohibit exploration and mining for uranium or thorium. It will also prohibit the construction or operation of certain facilities associated with the nuclear fuel chain.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 14 November 2000. (P.D.p. 2744)

**Occupational Safety and Health Amendment Bill 1999 (No. 109) (Dr G.I. Gallop)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the definition of an "employee" in the *Occupational Safety and Health Act 1984* to include officers of the Western Australian Police Service, thus bringing police officers under the

provisions of the Act.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 June 1999. (P.D.p. 9461)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Offenders (Legal Action) Bill 2000 (No. 16) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to prevent offenders and others from taking legal action in respect of harm suffered in the course of committing an offence.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 August 2000. (P.D.p. 390)

(Act No. 46 of 2000 -- assented to on 17 November 2000)

#### **Offshore Minerals (Consequential Amendments) Bill 2000 \* (No. 127) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the various Acts to be affected by the proclamation of the *Offshore Minerals Act 2000*. These Acts are -

- the *Mining Act 1978*;
- the *Conservation and Land Management Act 1984*; and
- the *Fish Resources Management Act 1994*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 May 2000. (P.D.p. 6889)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Offshore Minerals (Registration Fees) Bill 2000 \* (No. 128) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to effectively mirror the Commonwealth *Offshore (Registration Fees) Act 1994* and provides for the method of calculation and payment of fees required for the registration of certain documents affecting titles in State coastal waters - titles to be granted under the *Offshore Minerals Act 2000*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 May 2000. (P.D.p. 6890)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Offshore Minerals Bill 2000 \* (No. 126) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the administration of mineral exploration and development in coastal waters adjacent to the State.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 May 2000. (P.D.p. 6888)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Parks and Reserves Amendment Bill 1998 (No. 14)**

The purpose of this Bill is to enable the appointment of Boards to manage reserves regardless of which Act of Parliament created them. This will assist the Government in its program of efficient management of Crown land in the public interest.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 October 1998. (P.D.p. 2188)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

**Parliamentary Superannuation Legislation Amendment Bill 1999 (No. 81) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to introduce a number of changes to the superannuation arrangements for State parliamentarians. These are -

- closing the existing scheme to future Members of Parliament;
- allowing certain current Members to withdraw from the existing scheme and transfer to the new arrangements;
- transferring responsibility for changes to the rules of the existing scheme to an independent statutory authority, the Salaries and Allowances Tribunal; and
- empowering the Salaries and Allowances Tribunal to determine the level of superannuation for future Members of Parliament and for any current Members who choose to withdraw from the existing scheme.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3454)

Amended in the Legislative Council on 28 June 2000.

Reinstated to the stage reached in the Session.

(Act No. 37 of 2000 -- assented to on 10 October 2000)

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**Petroleum Legislation Amendment (LPG) Bill 2000 (No. 156) (Dr G. I. Gallop) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Petroleum Retailers Rights and Liabilities Act 1982* and the *Petroleum Products Pricing Act 1983*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 October 2000. (P.D.p. 2316)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Petroleum Products Pricing Amendment Bill 2000 (No. 49) [E]**

The purpose of the Bill is to achieve greater transparency in the pricing of motor fuels in Western Australia. The Bill implements most of the recommendations for legislation made by the Select Committee on the Pricing of Petroleum Products which was tabled in the Legislative Assembly on 12 October 2000.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 November 2000. (P.D.p. 3187)

(Act No. 73 of 2000 -- assented to on 4 December 2000)

**Planning Appeals (Transitional and Consequential Provisions) Bill 1999 \* (No. 103)**

The purpose of this Bill is to make various other amendments required to other pieces of legislation as a consequence of the proposals contained in the *Planning Appeals Bill 1999*, under which the existing Tribunal and Ministerial planning appeal systems will be replaced by one new appeals system.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 June 1999. (P.D.p. 9555)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Planning Appeals Bill 1999 \* (No. 102)**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the abolition of the Tribunal and Ministerial planning appeal systems, replacing them with a single entirely new system. This new system will not materially affect the manner in which appeals arise or are lodged, but will substitute a new process by which they are handled and determined. A new position of "Director of Planning Appeals" will be created. The person occupying this position will, with the assistance of a community representative, a Registrar, a number of professional and experienced assessors, and necessary staff, arrange for the appeals to be processed and determined.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 June 1999. (P.D.p. 9551)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Planning Legislation Amendment Bill 2000 (No. 154) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the planning legislation to ensure that State agencies are not required to obtain development approval under the Metropolitan Region Scheme in respect of public works.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 7 September 2000. (P.D.p. 949)

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Police (Confidence Power and Review) Amendment Bill 1998 (No. 6) (Dr G.I. Gallop)**

Synopsis to follow when second reading of the Bill commences.

Bill introduced and first read in the Legislative Assembly on 12 August 1998.

Reinstated to the stage reached on the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Prisons (Pyrton) Amendment Bill 2000 (No. 139) (Mr C.M. Brown) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to ensure that the proclamation made by the Governor under section 5 of the *Prisons Act 1981*, declaring the land known as Pyrton as a prison is revoked, and to remove any power for the Governor to make a proclamation of that nature in the future.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 June 2000. (P.D.p. 7644)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Protective Custody Bill 2000 \* (No. 97) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to extend the provisions of Part VA of the *Police Act 1892* to include all intoxicated persons, whatever the cause of the intoxication. Part VA provides police with the power to apprehend and detain persons intoxicated by alcohol.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 March 2000. (P.D.p. 5466)

Reinstated to the stage in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 8 November 2000.

(Act No. 50 of 2000 -- assented to on 28 November 2000)



**Public Scrutiny of Bills and Regulations Bill 1997 \* (No. 113) (Mr C.M. Brown)**

The purpose of this Bill is to establish a framework and process to facilitate scrutiny of Government legislation by the Parliament and the people of Western Australia. The Bill seeks to achieve this objective by

-

- opening up the legislative process to make it more transparent and accountable;
- encouraging greater public participation in the assessment of legislation;
- creating better legislative outcomes by testing the economic, social and environmental impact of proposed laws and regulations.

Provisions of the Bill include requiring the Minister to table an impact statement on the day of the second reading of a Bill in the House in which the Bill originates; requiring that all Bills be referred to a committee with the mandate to review the proposed legislation; and, giving the public an opportunity to comment on the proposed legislation through submissions to the parliamentary committee considering the Bill. The Bill includes similar provisions in relation to regulations.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 November 1997. (P.D.p. 8698)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Railway (Narngulu to Geraldton) Bill 2000 (LC No. 32) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to authorise the construction of a railway from the railway yard at Narngulu to the Port of Geraldton.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 October 2000. (P.D.p. 1889)

**Railway Discontinuance Bill 2000 (LC No. 15) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to formally discontinue the Midland Junction to Welshpool Railway and the Fremantle to Kwinana Railway.

The purpose of this Bill is to allow low-income self-funded retirees a 50% discount in their local government rates each year.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 September 2000. (P.D.p. 1186)

**Reserves (Neerabup National Park) Bill 2000 (No. 45) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to excise an area of 122.5494 hectares from the Neerabup National Park being Class "A" Reserve No. 27575, situated in the City of Wanneroo.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 November 2000. (P.D.p. 3156)

(Act No. 74 of 2000 -- assented to on 4 December 2000)

**Rights in Water and Irrigation Amendment Bill 1999 \* (No. 100) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to establish objectives for managing water. It sets out the scope of water resource management, the types of resource use that should be fostered and an obligation for the Water and Rivers Commission to work with the community. The objectives of the Bill are to manage water resources sustainably; protect environmental values; encourage the efficient use of water; and actively engage local communities in management.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 1 July 1999. (P.D.p. 9936)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 23 November 1999.

Referred to Standing Committee on Legislation in the Legislative Council on 29 March 2000.

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 17 October 2000.

(Act No. 49 of 2000 -- assented to on 28 November 2000)

**Road Traffic Amendment (Vehicle Licensing) (Taxing) Bill 2000 \* (No. 147) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to accommodate changes consequent upon the *Road Traffic Amendment (Vehicle Licensing) Bill 2000*, which includes amendments that transfer the Second Schedule of the Act containing vehicle licence fees to the regulations. This Bill imposes certain charges under section 19(3) *Road Traffic Act 1974* to the extent that those fees or charges may be a tax.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 June 2000. (P.D.p. 8590)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Road Traffic Amendment (Vehicle Licensing) Bill 2000 \* (No. 148) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to align vehicle licensing practices in Western Australia with the National Registration Scheme under the national competition policy agreement.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 June 2000. (P.D.p. 8589)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Road Traffic Amendment Bill (No.2) 2000 \* (LC No. 124) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to make minor amendments to the *Road Traffic Act 1974* necessary to empower the making of regulations which will introduce two national road transport reforms in Western Australia. These reforms are the Australian Vehicle Standards Rules and the Heavy Vehicle Operating Standards.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 23 May 2000. (P.D.p. 6966)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Road Traffic Amendment Bill 1999 \* (No. 40) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to implement aspects of the Driver Licence Module developed by the National Road Transport Commission Reform Package and the Government's road safety objectives as outlined in the report entitled "The Way Ahead - Road Safety Directions for Western Australia". Changes include the introduction of nationally agreed drivers licence classifications, Graduated Driver Training and Licensing System, compulsory photographs and signatures on drivers licences, and the storage of digital photographic images. The Bill also provides for the service of demerit point suspension notices by mail.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3700)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 6 April 2000.

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 19 September 2000.

(Act No. 39 of 2000 -- assented to on 10 October 2000)

### **Rural Business Development Corporation Bill 2000 \* (No. 26) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the operation of a corporate body known as the Rural Business Development Corporation and to simplify the legislation that enables the provision of financial assistance to rural industry, businesses and persons.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 7 September 2000. (P.D.p. 911)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 17 October 2000.

Referred to Standing Committee on Constitutional Affairs in the Legislative Council on 7 November 2000.

(Act No. 72 of 2000 -- assented to on 6 December 2000)

### **Salaries and Allowances Amendment Bill 1999 (No. 12) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to remedy an inequity that exists with regard to the process of review and determination of remuneration for part-time members of tribunals and boards. The present provisions of the *Salaries and Allowances Act 1975* limits the power of the Salaries and Allowances Tribunal to make determinations of remuneration only in respect to persons who hold an office of a full-time nature.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 October 1999. (P.D.p. 2464)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

### **Scrutiny of Government Publicity Bill 1997 (No. 72) (Dr G.I. Gallop)**

The purpose of this Bill is to restrict the expenditure of public money on Government publicity for a partisan political purpose, ie. government publicity that has, or is likely to have, the capacity to influence public support for a political party or its candidates or for a member of a House of Parliament.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 September 1997. (P.D.p. 6391)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

### **Sentencing Amendment (Adjustment of Sentences) Bill 2000 (LC No. 10) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill seeks to provide amendments to the *Sentencing Legislation Amendment and Repeal Act 1999* in respect of the adjustment of sentences under that Act and transitional provisions. The provisions of this Bill will allow a timely response to resolve anomalies in respect of the adjustment of sentences and the further transitional provisions will complement those provisions already contained in the parent Act.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 6 September 2000. (P.D.p. 738)

Amended in the Legislative Council on 15 November 2000.

(Act No. 62 of 2000 -- assented to on 7 December 2000)

### **Sentencing Amendment Bill 2000 \* (LC No. 99)**

The purpose of this Bill is to -

- amend the *Sentencing Act 1995*;
- amend the *Young Offenders Act 1994*; and
- provide for a sentencing matrix enabling a clear and consistent sentencing regime that the public will be able to understand. This Bill was created after the *Sentencing Legislation Amendment and Repeal Bill 1998* [50-2] had its second reading agreed to and the House further agreed to divide that Bill into two Bills, thus enabling this part of the Bill to be referred to the Standing Committee on Legislation.

This Bill was created after the *Sentencing Legislation Amendment and Repeal Bill 1998* [50-2] had its second reading agreed to and the House further agreed to divide that Bill into two Bills, thus enabling this part of the Bill to be referred to the Standing Committee on Legislation.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 27 May 1999. (P.D.p. 8515)

Referred to the Standing Committee on Legislation in the Legislative Council on 27 May 1999.

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 8 November 2000 where Short Title amended to *Sentencing Amendment Bill 2000*.

**Soil and Land Conservation Amendment Bill 2000 \* (No. 142) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to give effect to the thrust of the proposed *Tree Plantation Agreements Act 2000*, by providing protection from a prohibition of harvest that may be applied under the *Soil and Land Conservation Act 1945*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 June 2000. (P.D.p. 8405)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Stamp Amendment Bill (No. 2) 2000 \* (No. 141) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to exempt tree plantation agreements from duty under the *Stamp Act 1921*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 June 2000. (P.D.p. 8407)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Stamp Amendment Bill (No. 3) 2000 (LC No. 43) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Stamp Act 1921* and address stamp duty avoidance practices that involve the purchase of property through company structures in a way that circumvents the operation of the conveyance duty provisions of the Act.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 October 2000. (P.D.p. 1910)

**State Records (Consequential Provisions) Bill 1999 \* (No. 84) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend all State Acts, which make reference to record keeping, to conform with the provisions laid out in the *State Records Bill 1999*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3699)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No. 53 of 2000 -- assented to on 28 November 2000)

**State Records Bill 1999 \* (No. 83) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to replace the record keeping aspects of the *Library Board of Western Australia Act 1951* and provide for the establishment of an independent State Records Commission, which will strengthen public sector accountability through effective record keeping, provide a standard-setting and monitoring function reportable directly to the Parliament and take account of technological and administrative trends in record keeping.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 November 1999. (P.D. p. 3697)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 12 September 2000 and in the Legislative Council on 9 November 2000.

(Act No. 52 of 2000 -- assented to on 28 November 2000)

**State Superannuation (Transitional and Consequential Provisions) Bill 1999 \* (No. 62) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill, as a consequence of the *State Superannuation Bill 1999*, is to -

- allow for the transition of the Government Employees Superannuation Board and the Government Employees Superannuation Fund from the existing legislative framework contained in the *Government Employees Superannuation Act 1987* and the *Superannuation and Family Benefits Act 1938*, to the new legislative framework proposed in the *State Superannuation Bill 1999*;
- amend various other Acts to replace references to the *Government Employees Superannuation Act 1987* and the *Superannuation and Family Benefits Act 1938* with the new references required as a result of the *State Superannuation Bill 1999*; and
- delete references in the enabling legislation of various statutory authorities and statutory office holders that recognise those authorities and office holders for superannuation purposes, so that these provisions can be incorporated within the regulations of the new legislative framework.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 October 1999. (P.D.p. 2790)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 12 October 2000.

(Act No. 43 of 2000 -- assented to on 2 November 2000)

**State Superannuation Bill 1999 \* (No. 63) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal the legislation governing the State's public sector superannuation schemes and establish a new framework to provide better superannuation for public sector employees. At the broad level the proposed changes will -

- provide more flexibility for members and access to industry standard superannuation and new products and services;
- remove unintended anomalies and inequities;

- ensure timely compliance with relevant Commonwealth legislation; and
- support more efficient administration, which has the potential to deliver lower costs to members and savings to Government.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 October 1999. (P.D.p. 2789)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Referred to the Standing Committee on Legislation in the Legislative Council on 5 September 2000.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 12 October 2000.

(Act No. 42 of 2000 -- assented to on 2 November 2000)

#### **Therapeutic Goods (Western Australia) Bill 1999 \* (No. 88) (Ms S. M. McHale) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide Western Australia with legislation complementary to the Commonwealth *Therapeutic Goods Act 1989*, which provided for state jurisdictions to enact their own complementary legislation to enable trade through each State. The Bill will ensure the development of a national system of controls relating to quality, safety, efficacy and timely availability of therapeutic goods.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3724)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Therapeutic Goods (Western Australia) Bill 2000 \* (No. 138) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to complement the Commonwealth *Therapeutic Goods Act 1989*, in further advancing towards the achievement of a unified national system of controls in relation to products with the potential to affect public health.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 June 2000. (P.D. p. 8410)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Totalisator Agency Board Betting Amendment Bill 2000 (LC No. 28) [E]**

(see also *Totalisator Agency Board Betting (Modification of Operation) Bill 2000*)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the profit distribution provisions of the *Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act 1960*. It will fix the annual distribution of the first \$50 million of Totalisator Agency Board (TAB) profits to the Western Australian Turf Club (WATC), the Western Australian Trotting Association (WATA) and the Western Australian Greyhound Racing Authority (WAGRA) in the ratio of - WATC 55.26%, WATA 29.76%, WAGRA 14.98%.

It will fix the annual distribution of the first \$50 million of Totalisator Agency Board (TAB) profits to the Western Australian Turf Club (WATC), the Western Australian Trotting Association (WATA) and the Western Australian Greyhound Racing Authority (WAGRA) in the ratio of - WATC 55.26%, WATA 29.76%, WAGRA 14.98%.

The objective of the arrangement is to remove regulatory barriers to the movement of goods and services between Australian jurisdictions and New Zealand.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 October 1999. (P.D.p. 2092)

Referred to Standing Committee on Constitutional Affairs in the Legislative Council on 27 October 1999.

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

### **Transport Co-ordination Amendment Bill 1998 (No. 120) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for private sector management through competitive tendering of the Transperth Bus Fleet, which was purchased by Transport in June 1996. The Bill will provide a regulatory regime for the setting of fares, the conduct of passengers and the issue of infringement notices for non-payment of fares on contract bus services, as well as the introduction of standards for the bus and coach industry in Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 9 April 1998. (P.D.p. 1849)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 6 May 1999 and the 3 June 1999.

Referred to Standing Committee on Estimates and Financial Operations on 14 March 2000.

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No. 40 of 2000 -- assented to on 2 November 2000)

**Tree Plantation Agreements Bill 2000 \* (No. 140) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the making of agreements between owners, or lessees of land with the consent of the owners, and persons who wish to establish joint ventures with them for the purpose of planting, maintaining and harvesting a tree plantation on the land.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 June 2000. (P.D.p. 8402)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Trust Removal (Mount Claremont Land) Bill 1998 (No. 22)**

The purpose of this Bill is to effect the removal of a trust from Lot 87 held by the Crown in Certificate of Title Volume 1809 Folio 190. Lot 87 is bounded by Rochdale Road and Whitney Crescent, Mount Claremont.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 12 November 1998. (P.D.p. 3372)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Trustee Legislation (GST Consequential Amendments) Bill 2000 (No. 150) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide trustee companies and the Public Trustee with the power to pass on the cost of GST by amending the *Public Trustee Act 1941* and the *Trustee Companies Act 1987*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 7 September 2000. (P.D.p. 912)

(Act No. 67 of 2000 -- assented to on 4 December 2000)

**Universities Legislation Amendment Bill 2000 (No. 151) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to -

- amend the *University of Western Australia Act 1911* in relation to the size and membership of the Senate and the definition of the University;
- amend the *Murdoch University Act 1973* and the *University of Western Australia Act 1911* in regard to the role of the Governor as "Visitor";

- repeal the *University Endowment Act 1904* and the *University Endowment Amendment Act 1927*, and to incorporate the related investment provisions within the *University of Western Australia Act 1911*; and
- make consequential amendments to the *Public Education Endowment Act 1909*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 September 2000. (P.D.p. 1158)

(Act No. 75 of 2000 -- assented to on 7 December 2000)

### **Vexatious Proceedings Restriction Bill 2000 \* (LC No. 136) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to address the difficulties of having persons declared to be vexatious under the existing *Vexatious Proceedings Restriction Act 1930*, which is proposed to be repealed. Importantly, the Bill will widen the range of persons who may seek an order that a person is a vexatious litigant. Another key feature of the Bill is that it also provides for the rescission or variation of an order that a person is a vexatious litigant and for the recognition of orders made in another jurisdiction. The Bill also provides protection to a person who may be the target of a vexatious litigant.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 28 June 2000. (P.D.p. 8354)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

### **Voluntary Euthanasia Bill 2000 (LC No. 2) (Hon. N. Kelly)**

The purpose of this Bill is to permit a person to end his or her life deliberately with medical assistance where the person has an illness or medical condition that will most likely cause the death of that person and the pain and suffering arising from or relating to that illness or medical condition has, or is in the process of becoming, unbearable to the person.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 19 October 2000. (P.D.p. 2390)

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

### **Wood Processing (WESFI) Agreement Bill 2000 (No. 42) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to ratify an agreement dated 8 August 2000 between the State and WESFI Limited. It is intended to replace the *Wesply (Dardanup) Agreement Authorization Act 1975*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 19 October 2000. (P.D.p. 2441)

(Act No. 66 of 2000 -- assented to on 4 December 2000)

**Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation Amendment Bill 2000 (No. 104) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to ensure that injured workers are not precluded from making an election where a question regarding the degree of disability, properly referred, has not been agreed or determined before the termination day. The purpose of the changes is to remove an unintended anomaly which may arise due to the current timeframes for the processing of a question regarding the degree of disability referred to the Director by the worker pursuant to section 93D(6), read in conjunction with section 93E(6).

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 March 2000. (P.D.p. 5014)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 28 March 2000 and the Legislative Council on 1 June 2000.

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No. 44 of 2000 -- assented to on 17 November 2000)

**Zoological Parks Authority Bill 2000 \* (No. 80) [E]**

The purpose of this Bill is to bring the legislation governing all aspects of the operation of Perth Zoo into a modern environment. Specifically, the Bill will -

- provide a definition of a modern zoo;
- enable the zoo to participate in its own right in the federally funded cooperative centre for the conservation and management of marsupials or in future Cooperative Research Centres;
- recognise the educational role of the zoo in the community;
- enable the zoo to enter business arrangements for profit;
- enable the zoo to expand to other geographical locations and varieties of premises;
- enable the Board to appoint committees to assist it in the performance of its functions; and
- provide clear statutory powers with respect to the issuing of infringement notices for breaches of the Zoological Gardens By-laws, the removal, detention or prosecution of offenders.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 March 2000. (P.D.p. 5680)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.
