## SYNOPSIS OF BILLS

### 2002-2004

The following synopsis of Bills introduced during the Second Session of the Thirty-Sixth Parliament is intended only to give a brief outline of the main features of each Bill at the stage when the second reading motion of the Bill was moved. The full second reading speech for each Bill is available in *Parliamentary Debates (Hansard)* which are available from the State Law Publisher or from the Parliament of W.A. Internet site (address: [www.parliament.wa.gov.au](http://www.parliament.wa.gov.au)). The ultimate stage reached by each Bill is also indicated. While it does not take into account amendments made in either House, reference can be made to the *Votes and Proceedings* of the Legislative Assembly and the *Minutes* of the Legislative Council where amendments have been agreed to.

- \* Indicates the Act, or parts thereof, comes into operation on a date or dates to be fixed by Proclamation.
- LC Indicates the Bill originated in the Legislative Council; all other Bills without LC originated in the Legislative Assembly.
- (P.D.p.) Indicates the *Hansard* page number for the second reading of the Bill in the House in which it was first introduced.

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#### **Acts Amendment and Repeal (Competition Policy) Bill 2002 \* (No. 162)**

This Bill repeals or amends a number of laws in accordance with recommendations of National Competition Policy reviews, undertaken to comply with the States obligations under the 1995 Competition Policy Agreements. The amendments and repeals implement reforms in respect to restrictions on competition found not to be in the public interest by the National Competition Policy reviews.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 November 2002 (P.D.p 3482).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and General Purposes on 10 April 2003.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 13 November 2003.

(Act No. 70 of 2003 -- assented to on 15 December 2003).

#### **Acts Amendment and Repeal (Courts and Legal Practice) Bill 2002 \* (No. 153)**

This Bill, in conjunction with the *Legal Practices Bill 2002* is to modernise many aspects of the practice of law. The particular purpose of the Bill is to repeal the *Legal Practitioners Act 1893* and set out the transitional arrangements to the new legislation. A number of consequential amendments to other related Acts are made in this Bill, largely to specify the *Legal Practice Act 2002* as the basis for defining legal practitioners.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 October 2002 (P.D.p 2256).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly (*pro forma*) on 26 February 2003 and in the Legislative Council on 18 November 2003.



(Act No. 65 of 2003 -- assented to on 4 December 2003).

**Acts Amendment (Carbon Rights and Tree Plantation Agreements) Bill 2002 \* (No. 119)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Transfer of Land Act 1893* to provide for the registration of carbon rights under the *Carbon Rights Bill 2002*; carbon covenants entered into under the *Carbon Rights Bill 2002*; and tree plantation agreements entered into under the *Tree Plantation Agreements Bill 2002*. The ability to register these things will remove the risk that a court might find, in the event of a dispute between the parties, that despite a person's investment in the right, covenant or plantation, the right or the trees belonged to the land-holder.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 22 May 2002 (P.D. p 10964).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Assembly to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 23 October 2002 and in the Legislative Council on 3 April 2003.

(Act No. 56 of 2003 -- assented to on 29 October 2003).

**Acts Amendment (Court of Appeal) Bill 2004 (No. 318)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Supreme Court Act 1935* to establish a permanent Court of Appeal in this State as a division of the Supreme Court.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 30 June 2004 (P.D. p 4610).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 19 August 2004 and in the Legislative Council on 21 October 2004.

(Act No. 45 of 2004 -- assented to on 9 November 2004).

**Acts Amendment (Domestic Violence) Bill 2004 (No. 301)**

{name changed to *Acts Amendment (Family and Domestic Violence) Bill 2004*}

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Restraining Orders Act 1997*, *The Criminal Code* and the *Bail Act 1892* to afford greater protection to victims of family and domestic violence.

**Note:** The short title to the *Acts Amendment (Domestic Violence) Bill 2004* was changed in the Legislative Council to *Acts Amendment (Family and Domestic Violence) Bill 2004*, agreed to by the Legislative Assembly on Tuesday 19 October 2004.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 2 June 2004 (P.D. p 3303).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 29 June 2004 and in the Legislative Council on 23 September 2004.

(Act No. 38 of 2004 -- assented to on 9 November 2004).

**Acts Amendment (Equality of Status) Bill 2002 \* (No. 141)**

The main purpose of this Bill is to ensure that all persons are equal before the law. The Bill will repeal the *Married Woman's Property Act 1892* and amend various Acts as a consequence so that married women and women who are single or living in a de facto relationship have equal legal status. Also, discrimination against partners in certain relationships other than marital, in matters such as transfer of property, dependent spouse rebate, compensation schemes, health related legislation and inheritance will be removed.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 September 2002 (P.D. p 746).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 8 April 2003.

(Act No. 28 of 2003 -- assented to on 22 May 2003).

**Acts Amendment (Prohibition of Human Cloning and other Practices) Bill 2003 (No. 235)  
{name changed from *Human Reproductive Technology Amendment (Prohibition of Human Cloning) Bill 2003*}**

The Bill was created as a consequence of *Human Reproductive Technology Amendment Bill 2003* (No. 212) being divided into two Bills. The purpose of this Bill is to make amendments necessary for Western Australia to be part of a national legislative scheme to prohibit human cloning and regulate research involving human embryos.

The motion for the Second Reading of Bill No. 212 in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 June 2003 (P.D. p 9404).

The Bill title was changed with Legislative Council message No. 145 dated 1 July 2004 as agreed to by the Legislative Assembly.

(Act No. 18 of 2004 -- assented to on 16 July 2004).

**Acts Amendment (Reserves and Reserve Boards) Bill 2003 (No. 209)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Land Administration Act 1997* (LAA) and the *Parks and Reserves Act 1895* (PRA). The Bill seeks to apply the provisions of the LAA to reserves created under special Acts, such as Reserves Acts enacted over the years and dealing with amendments to Class A reserves. The amendments to the PRA provide for dissolution of boards and management created under that Act, and transfer of their responsibilities to a relevant Minister.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 June 2003 (P.D. p 8875).

(Act No. 76 of 2003 -- assented to on 15 December 2003).

**Acts Amendment (Sentencing) Bill 2004 (No. 324)**

The purpose of this Bill seeks to strengthen WA sentencing laws in terms of giving further recognition to the reviews of victims. The Bill also contains a range of amendments to the *Sentencing Act 1995*, *Sentence Administration Act 2003* and the *Sentencing Legislation Amendment and Repeal Act 2003* to make the sentencing regime more workable.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 September 2004 (P.D. p 6477).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Acts Amendment (Student Guilds and Associations) Bill 2002 \* (No. 123)**

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal the amendments imposed on the university Acts (*Curtin University of Technology Act 1966; Edith Cowan University Act 1984; Murdoch University Act 1973; University of Notre Dame Australia Act 1989* and the *University of Western Australia Act 1911*) by the *Voluntary Membership of Student Guilds and Associations Act 1994*. Also, this Bill amends the Acts of the public universities in relation to the Guilds and to amend the Acts of the public universities to enable them to establish a student amenities and service fee.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 August 2002 (P.D. p 180).

(Act No. 44 of 2003 -- assented to on 3 January 2003).

**Adoption Amendment Bill 2002 (No. 126) (Dr E. Constable)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Adoption Act 1994* in order to delete the restrictive age requirements applying to prospective adoptive parents.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 June 2002 (P.D. p 12107).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Assembly to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Adoption Amendment Bill (No. 2) 2002 \* (No. 137)**

The purpose of this Bill is to give effect to the recommendations of the 1997 review of the *Adoption Act 1994*. The basis for the amendments are grounded in the principle that Adoption is a service for children. The Bill furthers the conceptual change that occurred in 1995, which introduced open adoption amongst the three main parties to adoption - the adoptee, the adoptive parents and the birth parents. The Bill also introduces additional amendments that are related to administrative matters. These amendments will improve the operation of the Act.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 August 2002 (P.D.p 99).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 26 November 2002 and in the Legislative Council on 13 March 2003.

(Act No. 8 of 2003 -- assented to on 1 April 2003).

**Animal Welfare Bill 2001 \* (No. 41)**

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal the current *Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act 1920* and provide for the protection of animals by regulating the use of animals for scientific purposes, and prohibiting cruel, inhumane or improper treatment of animals.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 1 August 2001 (P.D.p 1858).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No. 33 of 2002 -- assented to on 15 November 2002).

#### **Anzac Day Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 195)**

The purpose of this Bill is to remove the legislative restriction which prohibits a race meeting being held on a Sunday when Anzac Day falls on that day. The Bill also repeals section 10(2)(A) of the principal Act relating to occasional liquor licenses and section 11(3)(B) to reflect the current name for the Returned and Services League WA Branch Incorporated.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 4 June 2003 (P.D. p 8162).

(Act No. 62 of 2003 -- assented to on 26 November 2003).

#### **Anzac Day Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 274)**

The Bill amends the *Anzac Day Act 1960*. The Bill amends the preamble and amends it to define ANZAC Day as a day for the commemoration of the landing of Australian troops on the shores of Gallipoli on 25 April 1915 and recognises the sacrifices made by all Australian men and women serving their country in times of war, conflict and in peacekeeping duties. Further amendments transfer the Act from the Treasurer's portfolio to the Premier's portfolio.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 March 2004 (P.D. p 982).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Appropriation Bill (Consolidated Fund) Bill (No. 1) 2003 (No. 193)**

The purpose of this Bill is to seek supply and appropriation for Consolidated Fund recurrent services and purposes for the 2003-2004 financial year.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 8 May 2003 (P.D. p 7362).

(Act No. 45 of 2003 -- assented to on 30 June 2003).

#### **Appropriation (Consolidated Fund) Bill (No. 4) 2002 (No. 146)**

The purpose of this Bill is to appropriate out of the Consolidated Fund the sums of -

- \$88,240,000.00 (for capital payments made during the financial year ended 30 June 2000, purpose outlined in Schedule One);
- \$119,634,748.10 (for capital payments made during the financial year ended 30 June 2001, purpose outlined in Schedule Two); and
- \$39,012,000.00 (for capital payments made during the financial year ended 30 June 2002, purpose outlined in Schedule Three).

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 October 2002 (P.D. p 2252).

(Act No. 27 of 2003 -- assented to on 16 May 2003).

**Appropriation (Consolidated Fund) Bill (No. 3) 2004 (No. 326)**

The purpose of this Bill seeks to appropriate out of Consolidated Fund the sums of \$146,527,783.50 (one hundred and forty six million, five hundred and twenty seven thousand, seven hundred and eighty three dollars and fifty cents) for recurrent payments made during the financial year ended 30 June 2004, for the purposes and services detailed in Schedule 1 of the Bill.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 10 November 2004 (P.D. p 7838).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Appropriation (Consolidated Fund) Bill (No. 4) 2004 (No. 327)**

The purpose of this Bill seeks to appropriate out of the Consolidated Fund the sums of \$81,776,310.87 (eighty one million, seven hundred and seventy six thousand three hundred and ten dollars and eighty seven cents) for capital payments made during the financial year ended 30 June 2004, for the purpose detailed in Schedule 1 of the Bill.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 10 November 2004 (P.D. p 7838).

**Appropriation (Consolidated Fund) Bill (No. 2) 2004 (No. 290)**

The purpose of this Bill is to grant supply and to appropriate out of the Consolidated Fund certain sums for the capital purposes of the year ending June 2005.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 6 May 2004 (P.D. p 2496).

**Appropriation (Consolidated Fund) Bill (No. 3) 2002 (No. 145)**

The purpose of this Bill is to appropriate out of the Consolidated Fund the sums of -

- \$129,131,221.79 (for recurrent payments made during the financial year ended 30 June 2000, for the purposes detailed in Schedule One);
- \$346,593,096.73 (for recurrent payments made during the financial year ended 30 June 2001, for the purposes outlined in Schedule Two); and
- \$223,119,996.57 (for recurrent payments made during the financial year ended 30 June 2002, for the purposes outlined in Schedule Three).

**Architects Bill 2003 (No. 241)**

The purpose of this Bill is to identify members of the architectural profession. The Bill will also provide for effective registration of architects and the maintenance of nationally consistent professional standards. It controls the use of the title "architect" and seeks to prevent conduct from non-architects that may be misleading to consumers and the general public.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 November 2003 (P.D. p 13679).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and General Purposes on 6 May 2004.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 17 November 2004.

(Act No. 75 of 2004 -- assented to on 8 December 2004).

### **Australian Crime Commission (Western Australia) Bill 2003 (LC No. 266)**

The purpose of this Bill is to -

- provide for the operation of the Australian Crime Commission (the ACC) in Western Australia;
- repeal the *National Crime Authority (State Provisions) Act 1985*; and
- make consequential amendments to various Acts to effect the transition of the National Crime Authority to the newly created ACC.

The ACC is established under the Commonwealth Act, and came into operation on 1 January 2003. The ACC combines the investigative functions of the former NCA with the criminal intelligence functions of the former Australian Bureau of Criminal Intelligence and the former Office of Strategic Crime Assessments.

This Bill implements a key element of the agreement reached by Australian Government Leaders at the Summit on Terrorism and Multi-jurisdictional Crime last year and forms part of a National Cooperative Scheme to combat serious and organised crime in this country.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 4 December 2003 (P.D. p 14149).

Referred to the Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and General Purposes. on 4 December 2003.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 17 November 2004.

### **Barrow Island Bill 2003 (No. 230)**

The purpose of this Bill is to -

- ratify and authorise the implementation of an agreement between the State and the Gorgon Joint Venturers for a gas processing and infrastructure project; minimise environmental disturbance on Barrow Island; and provide for the support of conservation programs in similar bio-regions;
- with the approval of the appropriate Ministers, allow the grant of titles, totalling no more than 300 hectares of uncleared land for gas processing project purposes on Barrow island, over the class A nature reserve (No 11648) which covers the land; and
- allow the underground injection and disposal of carbon dioxide on Barrow Island.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 September 2003 (P.D. p 11272).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 16 October 2003.

(Act No. 61 of 2003 -- assented to on 20 November 2003).

### **Boxing Control Amendment Bill 2001 \* (No. 45)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Boxing Control Act 1987* to include all styles of professional combat sport to provide adequate and minimum safety standards for the industry. The Western Australian Boxing Commission will be expanded by two further members, and the Commission will be renamed the Western Australian Professional Combat Sports Commission.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 12 September 2001 (P.D. p 3618).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

**Building and Construction Industry Training Fund and Levy Collection Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 227)**

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal the sunset provisions in the *Building and Construction Industry Training Fund and Levy Collection Act 1990* to ensure it will not expire on 30 June 2004. This will enable the continuation of the levy for the purpose of ensuring future skill needs in the industry are met.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 September 2003 (P.D. p 11379).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 23 October 2003 and in the Legislative Council on 2 June 2004.

**Bulk Handling Amendment Bill 2002 (No. 144)**

The purpose of this Bill is to make amendments to the *Bulk Handling Act 1967* to -

- enable the effective operation of the merged entity of Grain Pool Pty Ltd and CBH;
- comply with national competition policy; and
- modernise the Act by removing outdated provisions.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 September 2002 (P.D. p 759).

(Act No. 29 of 2002 -- assented to on 25 October 2002).

**Burrup Peninsula (Crown Land) Bill 2002 (LC No. 172) (Hon. R.H. Chapple)**

The purpose of this Bill is to make certain proposals for the use of Crown land on the Burrup Peninsula subject to the consent of both Houses of Parliament.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 19 December 2002 (P.D. p 4502).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Business Names Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 222)**

The purpose of this Bill is to re-introduce a renewal fee for the registration of business names. The renewal fee will help improve the integrity of the Business Names Register and the revenue from the renewal fee will support the provision of Government services for business development and regulation.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 August 2003 (P.D.p 10266).

(Act No. 63 of 2003 -- assented to on 26 November 2003).



**Business Tax Review (Assessment) Bill 2003 \* (No. 175)**

This Bill, together with the *Business Tax Review (Taxing) Bill 2003*, seeks to implement the Business Tax Review recommendations for pay-roll and land tax. The reforms are designed to improve the efficiency, equity and simplicity of the State's tax system, with a particular focus on minimizing compliance costs. This Bill also includes a minor additional amendment in the land tax legislation to provide an exemption for life tenancies held in trust where the property is used as the principal place of residence of the life tenant.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 12 March 2003 (P.D.p 5222).

(Act No. 40 of 2003 -- assented to on 30 June 2003).

**Business Tax Review (Assessment) Bill (No.2) 2003 \* (No. 208)**

The purpose of this Bill, together with the *Business Tax Review (Taxing) Bill (No.2) 2003*, is to give effect to the stamp duty and debits tax recommendations of the Review of State Business Taxes. This Bill will amend the -

- *Stamp Act 1921*;
- *Taxation Administration Act 2003*;
- *Debits Tax Assessment Act 2002*, and
- *Land Tax Assessment Act 2002*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 June 2003 (P.D.p 9238).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 21 August 2003 and in the Legislative Council on 20 November 2003.

(Act No. 66 of 2003 -- assented to on 5 December 2003).

**Business Tax Review (Taxing) Bill 2003 (No. 176)**

This Bill complements the *Business Tax Review (Assessment) Bill 2003*. The purpose of this Bill specifically is to -

- replace the current variable marginal pay-roll tax rate scale with a single marginal rate of 6.0%; and
- restructure and simplify the land tax scale by reducing the number of threshold brackets from ten to six.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 12 March 2003 (P.D.p 5224).

(Act No. 41 of 2003 -- assented to on 30 June 2003).

**Business Tax Review (Taxing) Bill (No.2) 2003 \* (No. 207)**

The purpose of this Bill, together with the *Business Tax Review (Assessment) Bill (No.2) 2003*, is to give effect to the stamp duty and debits tax recommendations of the Review of State Business Taxes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 June 2003 (P.D.p 9240).

(Act No. 59 of 2003 -- assented to on 26 November 2003).

**Cannabis Control Bill 2003 \* (No. 188)**

The core purpose of this Bill is to allow police officers to issue Cannabis Infringement Notices (CIN) to persons who are found cultivating or in possession of cannabis within defined limits.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 March 2003 (P.D.p 5694).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 12 September 2003.

(Act No. 52 of 2003 -- assented to on 1 October 2003).

**Carbon Rights Bill 2002 \* (No. 117)**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the registration on the title to land of a "carbon right", and accompanying "carbon covenant". Under the Bill the land owner, or someone else with the land owner's agreement, can register a carbon right in respect of land. Registration will clarify the ownership of the right to the benefits from sequestration on the land, but it gives no guarantee as to how much carbon is there, whether it will remain there, or what value it may have. Registration of a carbon right and carbon covenant by a party who is not the landowner will remove the risk that a court might find, in the event of a dispute between the parties, that, despite that person's investment in the right or covenant, the right to the carbon sequestration benefits belongs to the land-holder. The Bill, therefore, gives certainty to those wishing to trade in carbon rights and gain the credits or emission offsets which arise from sequestration.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 22 May 2002 (P.D.p 10960).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Assembly to the stage reached in the previous Session.

**Carers Recognition Bill 2004 (No. 310)**

The purpose of the Bill is to formally recognise carers and their needs as partners in the provision of care for people who are frail, chronically ill or have a disability. The legislation aims at improving the culture of service providers by their involving and partnering with carers in the delivery of care.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 1 July 2004 (P.D.p 4760).

(Act No. 37 of 2004 -- assented to on 28 October 2004).

**Casino (Burswood Island) Agreement Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 215)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Casino (Burswood Island) Agreement Act 1985*, in order to -

- ratify the amendments to the Eighth Supplementary Agreement and authorise its implementation;
- provide for the Eighth Supplementary Agreement to operate and take effect to the extent that it amends the entrenched provisions as defined in section 10 of the *Casino (Burswood Island) Agreement Act 1985*, despite the operation of section 10; and

- require shareholders of an approved company holding a relevant interest in more than 10% of the voting shares of an approved company, to hold a probity approval notice issued by the Gaming Commission of Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 June 2003 (P.D. p 9241).

(Act No. 51 of 2003 -- assented to on 2 September 2003).

#### **Cat Bill 2003 (LC No. 269) (Hon. G. Watson)**

The purpose of this Bill is to -

- promote and provide for the welfare of domestic cats;
- reduce the negative effects on native wildlife caused by domestic and feral cats;
- minimise community nuisance caused by cats; and
- promote responsible cat ownership.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 11 December 2003 (P.D. p 14753).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Censorship Amendment Bill 2002 \* (No. 96)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Censorship Act 1996* to make Western Australia a full participant in the National Co-operative Censorship Scheme and to ensure that Western Australia's censorship legislation is consistent with that in other States and Territories. The Bill proposes to introduce new offences for persons who supply X films or RC films and computer games to minors.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 February 2002 (P.D. p 7707).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and General Purposes on 14 August 2002.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 10 April 2003.

(Act No. 30 of 2003 -- assented to on 26 May 2003).

#### **Child Support (Adoption of Laws) Amendment Bill 2001 (No. 47)**

The purpose of this Bill is to adopt recent changes to the relevant Commonwealth legislation to allow ex-nuptial children to be treated in the same way as nuptial children.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 August 2001 (P.D. p 3296).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 6 November 2001 and in the Legislative Council on 28 November 2002.

Referred to Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 14 November 2001.

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No. 41 of 2002 -- assented to on 9 December 2002).

#### **Child Welfare Amendment Bill 2001 (No. 49)**

The purpose of this Bill is to implement a national agreement between the Governments of Western Australia, other Australian States and Territories and New Zealand, for the efficient transfer of child protection orders and proceedings for children who move between jurisdictions.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 19 September 2001 (P.D. p 3966).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No. 22 of 2002 -- assented to on 29 August 2002).

#### **Children and Community Development Bill 2003 (No. 265)**

{name changed to *Children and Community Services Bill 2003*}

The purpose of this Bill is to -

- confer functions in relation to the provision of social services, the provision of financial and other assistance, and other matters concerning the well-being of children, other individuals, families and communities;
- make provisions about the protection and care of children, the employment of children, and child care services;
- repeal the *Child Welfare Act 1947*, the *Welfare and Assistance Act 1961* and the *Community Services Act 1972*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 4 December 2003 (P.D. p 14244).

The short title of the Bill was changed from *Children and Community Development Bill 2003* to *Children and Community Services Bill 2003* in the Legislative Assembly during Consideration in Detail on 6 April 2004.

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 6 April 2004 and in the Legislative Council on 26 August 2004.

(Act No. 34 of 2004 -- assented to on 20 October 2004).

#### **Civil Judgements Enforcement Bill 2003 (No. 256)**

This Bill is part of a legislative package that reforms the lower courts of Western Australia. The purpose of the Bill is to implement recommendations of the Law Reform Commission (LRC) and provide for a uniform system of enforcing the civil judgements of the Supreme, District and Magistrates Courts. The Bill also provides for the overarching role of the Sheriff and the appointment of bailiffs.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 4 December 2003 (P.D. p 14278).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 17 August 2004.

(Act No. 28 of 2004 -- assented to on 14 October 2004).

**Civil Liability Amendment Bill 2003 \* (No. 186)**

The purpose of this Bill is to expand on the *Civil Liability Act 2002* by codifying, and in some cases varying, certain common law rules of negligence in relation to foreseeability, standard of care, causation and remoteness of damage and contributory negligence. Most of the amendments give effect to key recommendations of the Review of the Law of Negligence (the 'Ipp Report').

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 March 2003 (P.D. p 5691).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 19 June 2003 and in the Legislative Council on 15 October 2003.

(Act No. 58 of 2003 -- assented to on 30 October 2003).

**Civil Liability Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 275)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Civil Liability Act 2002* in two respects -

- to introduce a new evidentiary test in relation to the standard of care required of health professionals; and
- to make further provision with respect to proportionate liability.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 6 April 2004 (P.D. p 1743).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 19 August 2004.

(Act No. 43 of 2004 -- assented to on 9 November 2004).

**Civil Liability Bill 2002 \* (No. 138)**

The objective of this Bill is to reduce public liability insurance premiums and/or improve insurance availability, through regulating the recovery of damages for death or injury. The aim is to achieve cost reduction, claims cost containment for the future, improving certainty and predictability in the insurance system and changing social and legal attitudes toward the assumption of and liability of risk. The Bill also places restrictions on advertising for personal injury legal services.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 August 2002 (P.D. p 94).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 22 October 2002.

(Act No. 35 of 2002 -- assented to on 20 November 2002).

**Coal Industry Superannuation Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 270)**

The purpose of this Bill is to give the Coal Industry Superannuation Board the ability to be competitive with other superannuation funds through being able to provide for spouse accounts and allocated pensions. The Bill also implements the legislative amendments recommended in the "Review of the Coal Industry Superannuation Board and the *Coal Industry Superannuation Act 1989*"

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 4 March 2004 (P.D. p 411).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 17 June 2004.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Coal Miners' Welfare Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 278)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Coal Miners' Welfare Act 1947* in order to improve the effectiveness of the operation of the Coal Miners' Welfare Board and the Coal Miners' Welfare Fund. The amendments implement the recommendations of the October 2002 Review, which was carried out in response to the Report of the Machinery of Government Taskforce.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 2 June 2004 (P.D. p 3307).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 30 June 2004.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Commission For Children And Young People Bill 2004 (No. 340) (Hon. C.J. Barnett)**

The purpose of this Bill is to establish a Commission For Children And Young People in Western Australia to promote and advocate the welfare and special interests of children and young people. It enables the Commission for Children and Young People to perform its functions consistently with, and promote voluntary compliance by public and private sector agencies with the principles of international agreements so far as they relate to children and young people.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 22 September 2004 (P.D. p 6311).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Commonwealth Powers (De Facto Relationships) Bill 2003 (No. 239)**

The purpose of this Bill is to refer legislative power to the Commonwealth Parliament in relation to the superannuation interests of de facto partners whose relationship has broken down for the purposes of section 51(xxxvii) of the *Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 22 October 2003 (P.D. p 12450).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and General Purposes on 4 December 2003.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Community Protection (Offender Reporting) Bill 2004 (No. 336)**

The purpose of this Bill is to require certain offenders who commit sexual or certain other serious offences to keep police informed of their whereabouts and other personal details for a period of time to reduce the likelihood that they will re-offend and to facilitate the investigation and prosecution of any future offences that they may commit, to enable courts to make orders prohibiting certain offenders from engaging in specified conduct.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 22 September 2004 (P.D. p 6279).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 25 November 2004.

(Act No. 72 of 2004 -- assented to on 8 December 2004).

### **Conservation and Land Management Amendment Bill 2002 (No. 101)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the management planning provisions of the *Conservation and Land Management Act 1984*. The Bill seeks to establish the pre-eminence of the Conservation Commission of Western Australia as the body responsible for the preparation of proposed management plans for the lands that it has vested in it on behalf of the state and the presentation of those plans to the Minister for approval.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 March 2002 (P.D. p 9025).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No. 43 of 2002 -- assented to on 11 December 2002).

### **Constitution Acts Amendment (Voting Ability in the Houses of Parliament) Bill 2002 (No. 157) (Mr M.W. Trenorden)**

The purpose of this Bill is to ensure that any proposed alteration to the voting structure in the Legislative Council (including altering the voting ability of the President) or the Legislative Assembly (including altering the voting ability of the Speaker), will require the second reading and third readings of the Bill to pass with the concurrence of an absolute majority of the members of the Legislative Council and Assembly, and receive the approval of the electors in a referendum.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 October 2002 (P.D. p 2284).

Second reading not agreed to in the Legislative Assembly on 13 November 2002.

### **Constitution Amendment Bill 2002 \* (LC No. 156)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Constitution Acts Amendment Act 1889* to give the President a deliberative vote on all questions and remove the President's casting vote.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 24 October 2002 (P.D. p 2335).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

### **Constitution (Parliamentary Privileges) Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 328) (Hon. P.G. Pental)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Parliamentary Privileges Act 1891* and the *Constitution Act 1891* so that the privileges in the Western Australian Parliament be as they applied to the UK Commons House of Parliament as at 1 January 1989.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 August 2004 (P.D. p 5165).

(Act No. 41 of 2004 -- assented to on 3 November 2004).

### **Construction Contracts Bill 2004 (No. 271)**

The purpose of this Bill is to introduce security of payment legislation for the building and construction industry by -

- prohibiting payment provisions in contracts that slow or stop the movement of funds through the contracting chain;
- implying fair and reasonable payment terms into contracts that are not in writing;
- clarifying the right to deal in unfixed materials when a party to the contract becomes insolvent; and
- providing an effective rapid adjudication process for payment disputes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 3 March 2004 (P.D. p 274).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 25 June 2004.

(Act No. 16 of 2004 -- assented to on 8 July 2004).

### **Consumer Credit (Western Australia) Amendment Bill 2002 \* (No. 167)**

The Bill makes amendments to the *Consumer Credit (Western Australia) Act 1996*. The amendments will enable Western Australia to adopt the national Uniform Consumer Credit Code, as in force from time to time in Queensland under the Appendix of the *Consumer Credit (Queensland) Act 1994*. The Consumer Credit Code provides protection for all users of consumer credit. Financial Institutions and credit providers who provide credit for personal, domestic or household purposes are required to comply with the Code.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 4 December 2002 (P.D. p 3913).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 18 March 2003 and in the Legislative Council on 24 June 2003.

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and General Purposes on 3 April 2003.

(Act No. 43 of 2003 -- assented to on 30 June 2003).

### **Consumer Protection Legislation Amendment and Repeal Bill 2004 (No. 334)**

The purpose of this Bill seeks to make amendments to a number of Acts within the Consumer Protection Portfolio, which of themselves do not justify separate Bills. The amendments will correct anomalies, improve consumer protection, streamline administrative practice and remove unnecessary legislation.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 August 2004 (P.D. p 5721).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.



**Contaminated Sites Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 339)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend section 27 of the *Contaminated Sites Act 2003*. That section specifies the hierarchy of responsibility for recommendation for remediation of contamination relating to land owners.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 October 2004 (P.D. p 7091).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Contaminated Sites Bill 2002 \* (No. 164)**

The purpose of this Bill is to enable and facilitate the identification of contaminated sites so they may be recorded on a free public database. It facilitates the management and remediation of contaminated sites, and informs the land transaction process so no one should acquire a contaminated site not knowing it to be contaminated.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 November 2002 (P.D. p 3479).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 3 April 2003 and in the Legislative Council on 22 October 2003.

(Act No. 60 of 2003 -- assented to on 7 November 2003).

**Coroners Amendment Bill 2001 \* (No. 60)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Coroners Act 1996* and the *Evidence Act 1906* to provide for the Attorney General, on the recommendation of the State Coroner, to appoint a person to be a coroner for a specific period and on terms as specified in the appointment. Further, the Bill provides for a number of amendments emanating from the review of the *Coroners Act 1996* and those subsequently identified by the State Coroner.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 October 2001 (P.D. p 4497).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No. 15 of 2003 -- assented to on 17 April 2003).

**Coroners Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 276)**

The purpose of this Bill is to enable the Coroner to refer information and contact details in relation to all deceased individuals under his jurisdiction to Donate West. Donate West will then contact families to discuss tissue donation for transplantation. The Bill provides that Donate West will destroy all information provided by the Coroner within 2 days of receipt.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 31 March 2004 (P.D. p 1363).

(Act No. 22 of 2004 -- assented to on 8 September 2004).

**Corporations (Consequential Amendments) Bill (No. 2) 2001 (No. 53)**

The purpose of this Bill is to make consequential amendments to State laws additional to those made by the *Corporations (Consequential Amendments) Act 2001* (WA) in order to avoid inconsistency between the new federal legislation and State law.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 October 2001 (P.D. p 4499).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 1 April 2003.

(Act No. 20 of 2003 -- assented to on 23 April 2003).

**Corporations (Consequential Amendments) Bill (No.3) 2001 (No. 78)**

The purpose of this Bill is to make consequential amendments to WA State laws which are required as a result of the commencement of amendments proposed to be made to the *Corporations Act 2001* (Commonwealth) by the *Financial Services Reform Act 2001* (Commonwealth). The Bill will amend references used in WA State laws such as "stock exchange", "futures contract" and "futures market" which require amendment because they will no longer be used in the *Corporations Act 2001* (Commonwealth) as amended by the *Financial Services Reform Act 2001* (Commonwealth).

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 5 December 2001 (P.D. p 6451).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 1 April 2003.

(Act No. 21 of 2003 -- assented to on 23 April 2003).

**Corruption and Crime Commission Amendment and Repeal Bill 2003 (No. 218)**

This Bill has been created as a result of splitting the *Corruption and Crime Commission Bill 2003* [LA 203-2B] into two Bills. Please see the synopsis of Bill [LA 203-2B] and *Corruption and Crime Commission Bill 2003* [217-1]. *Corruption and Crime Commission Amendment Bill 2003* [218-1] provides for other amendments originally contained in the *Corruption and Crime Commission Bill 2003* [LA 203-2B] that are not contained in the *Corruption and Crime Commission Bill 2003* [217-1].

Referred to Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 26 June 2003.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 12 December 2003.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 December 2003 (P.D. p 14908).

(Act No. 78 of 2003 -- assented to on 22 December 2003).

**Corruption and Crime Commission Bill 2003 \* (No. 203)**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the establishment and operation of a Corruption and Crime Commission, which will have the powers to investigate Western Australian Judges, Ministers, Members of Parliament, police officers and other public officers.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 May 2003 (P.D.p 7861).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 5 June 2003 and in the Legislative Council on 26 June 2003.

Referred to Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 26 June 2003.

(Act No. 48 of 2003 -- assented to on 3 July 2003).

**Courts Legislation Amendment and Repeal Bill 2003 (No. 263)**

This Bill is the last in a package of legislation which will reform the Western Australian lower court system. The Bill implements six Western Australian Law Reform Commission recommendations and introduces a uniform system of enforcing the civil judgments of the Magistrates Court, District Court and Supreme Court.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 4 December 2003 (P.D. p 14293).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 1 April 2004 and in the Legislative Council on 20 October 2004.

Referred to Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 29 June 2004.

(Act No. 59 of 2004 -- assented to on 23 November 2004).

**Criminal Appeals Bill 2004 (No. 332)**

This Bill implements recommendations made in the Western Australian Law Reform Commission's report on the review of our criminal and civil justice system. In particular, this Bill specifies the limitations on appeals and the procedure to be followed on appeals.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 August 2004 (P.D. p 5726).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 21 September 2004.

(Act No. 60 of 2004 -- assented to on 23 November 2004).

**Criminal Code Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 187)**

This Bill implements a number of significant reforms of the criminal law. The reforms serve to address deficiencies in the law which have been identified by the Standing Committee of Attorneys General (Murray Report of an extensive review of the *Criminal Code* (WA)). The substantive reforms are contained in Parts 2 to 8 of the Bill which includes -

Part 2 - amendments to the *Criminal Code* in response to "paedophile sex tours";

Part 3 - amendments to the *Criminal Code* in respect to unlawful assemblies, breaches of the peace and other offences against public authority;

Part 4 - amendments about infanticide. Reference to sentencing process for wilful murder and murder are no longer contained in this bill. They were deleted when the bill was divided and are now contained in Bill 231;

Part 5 - concerns offences about endangering life or health; including a new specific offence of "female genital mutilation";

Part 6 - addresses the crime of sexual servitude;

Part 7 - reclassifies some indictable offences with the intention of pushing less serious indictable offences to the summary courts; and

Part 8 - miscellaneous amendments to the *Criminal Code*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 3 April 2003 (P.D. p 6151).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 11 September 2003 and in the Legislative Council on 1 April 2004.

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and General Purposes on 19 September 2003.

(Act No. 4 of 2004 -- assented to on 23 April 2004).

#### **Criminal Code Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 283) (Mr B.J. Grylls)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend *The Criminal Code* by altering mandatory sentencing provisions relating to burglary.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 7 April 2004 (P.D.p 1906).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Criminal Code Amendment Bill (No. 2) 2003 (No. 231)**

This Bill was created when the *Criminal Code Amendment Bill 2003* (No. 187) was divided into two in the Legislative Assembly on 10 September 2003. It provides for amendments to the *Criminal Code* in reference to wilful murder and murder and consequentially amends various other Acts.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 9 December 2003 (P.D. p 14625).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Criminal Code Amendment Bill (No. 3) 2003 (No. 267) (Mr R.A. Ainsworth)**

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal Section 29 of *The Criminal Code* and inserts a new Section 29. The new amendment provides the following -

- a person under the age of 10 years is not criminally responsible for any act or omission;
- a person under the age of 14 years is not criminally responsible for an act or omission, unless it is proved that at the time of doing the act or making the omission he had the capacity to know that he ought not to do the act or make the omission; and
- first time offenders are to be counselled on what may constitute an unlawful act or omission and the potential consequences as a result of engaging in such activity.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 3 December 2003 (P.D. p 14087).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Criminal Code Amendment (Racial Vilification) Bill 2004 (No. 331)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend Chapter XI of *The Criminal Code* dealing with racial harassment and incitement to racial hatred. The Bill broadens the application of, and increases the penalties for, the existing provisions, as well as introduces strict liability offences, including defences to those offences.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 August 2004 (P.D. p 5158).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 19 October 2004.

(Act No. 80 of 2004 -- assented to on 8 December 2004).

#### **Criminal Injuries Compensation Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 223) (Ms S.E Walker)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Criminal Injuries Compensation Amendment Act 1985*, in order to increase the amount of compensation payable to victims of crime for injuries suffered by them.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 August 2003 (P.D. p 9890).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Criminal Injuries Compensation Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 291)**

This Bill amends the *Criminal Injuries Compensation Act 2003* to ensure that a secondary victim claiming for mental and nervous shock consequent upon injury to another person is eligible for compensation, and to ensure that the recovery procedures in the 2003 Act are available to assist recovery of orders made under the repealed *Criminal Injuries Compensation Act 1985*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 12 May 2004 (P.D. p 2752).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 17 June 2004.

(Act No. 29 of 2004 -- assented to on 14 October 2004).

#### **Criminal Injuries Compensation Bill 2003 (No. 232)**

In summary, the purpose of this Bill is to -

- provide assistance to victims of crime by such measures as increasing the maximum award to \$75,000, providing for interim awards, and providing for future medical costs;
- consolidate the *Criminal Injuries Compensation Act 1985* and all previous legislation into one Act;
- clarify technical issues and simplify current legislation;
- ensure better targeting of scarce resources so that only deserving and qualified applicants will receive compensation; and

- improve recovery from offenders.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 September 2003 (P.D. p 11682).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 21 October 2003 and in the Legislative Council on 2 December 2003.

(Act No. 77 of 2003 -- assented to on 15 December 2003).

#### **Criminal Law Amendment (Criminal Property) Bill 2004 (No. 286)**

This Bill contains two reforms in relation to criminal property. Firstly, it extends the law in *The Criminal Code* to better deal with money and property laundering crimes. Secondly, it amends the *Sentencing Act 1995* so that offenders whose assets have been confiscated do not receive lighter penalties due to the fact that their assets have been confiscated.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 8 April 2004 (P.D. p 2020).

(Act No. 26 of 2004 -- assented to on 7 October 2004).

#### **Criminal Law Amendment (Sexual Assault and Other Matters) Bill 2004 (No. 315)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend *The Criminal Code* to allow multiple charges to be dealt with more readily on one indictment. The Bill also amends the *Evidence Act 1906* in relation to sexual assault matters.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 30 June 2004 (P.D. p 4607).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 26 October 2004.

(Act No. 46 of 2004 -- assented to on 9 November 2004).

#### **Criminal Law Amendment (Simple Offences) Bill 2004 (No. 341)**

The purpose of this Bill is to modernise and tackle inefficiencies in the administration of justice, and tackling criminal behaviour in Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 September 2004 (P.D. p 6531).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 27 October 2004 and in the Legislative Council on 25 November 2004.

(Act No. 70 of 2004 -- assented to on 8 December 2004).

#### **Criminal Law (Procedure) Amendment Bill 2002 \* (No. 104)**

The purpose of this Bill is to abolish preliminary hearings through amendments to the *Justices Act 1902* and the *Criminal Code*. In addition, the Bill seeks to reform the law as it relates to pre-trial disclosure by introducing an onerous, ongoing statutory disclosure requirement for the Police, DPP, and limited formal pre-trial disclosure requirements for defendants.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 March 2002 (P.D.p 9026).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 18 September 2002.

(Act No. 27 of 2002 -- assented to on 25 September 2002).

**Criminal Procedure and Appeals (Consequential Provisions) Bill 2004 (No. 335)**  
{name changed to *Criminal Procedure and Appeals (Consequential and Other Provisions) Bill 2004*}

The purpose of this Bill is to make a large number of amendments to a range of Acts, all of which are aimed at facilitating the speedier resolution of criminal justice by contributing to the modernisation and streamlining of our courts. These amendments are consequential to the passing of the *Criminal Procedure Bill 2004* and the *Criminal Appeals Bill 2004*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 August 2004 (P.D. p 5727).

The short title of the Bill was changed to *Criminal Procedure and Appeals (Consequential and Other Provisions) Bill 2004* in the Legislative Council on 18 November 2004 and agreed to by the Legislative Assembly on 26 November 2004.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 18 November 2004.

(Act No. 84 of 2004 -- assented to on 16 December 2004).

**Criminal Procedure Bill 2004 (No. 333)**

The purpose of this Bill will modernise and consolidate criminal proceedings for both summary and indictable matters and bring procedures in the summary jurisdiction in line with those in superior courts. It will prescribe criminal procedures for matters in the new Magistrates Court and in the Supreme and District Courts to give this State a consolidated statute covering criminal procedure for both summary and indictable matters. In doing so, this Bill will repeal the *Justices Act 1902*, but still retain the substantive criminal procedural provisions of that Act.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 August 2004 (P.D. p 5722).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 21 September 2004 and in the Legislative Council on 18 November 2004.

(Act No. 71 of 2004 -- assented to on 8 December 2004).

**Dangerous Goods Safety Bill 2002 \* (No. 168)**

The purpose of this Bill is to replace the outdated *Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act 1961*. It amalgamates the provisions of the *Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act 1961* and the *Dangerous Goods (Transport) Act 1998* to create a single consolidated *Dangerous Goods Safety Act 2004*. The Bill primarily relates to the safe storage, handling and transport of dangerous goods for related purposes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 4 December 2002 (P.D. p 3915).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 17 June 2003 and in the Legislative Council on 11 May 2004.

(Act No. 7 of 2004 -- assented to on 10 June 2004).

**Debits Tax Assessment Bill 2001 \* (No. 84)**

The purpose of this Bill is to replace the existing *Debits Tax Assessment Act 1990* with an up-to-date, contemporary statute in an easy to follow format. The repeal and, where relevant, the saving of the *Debits Tax Assessment Act 1990* can be found in the *Taxation Administration (Consequential Provisions) Bill 2001*. It should be noted that many of the administrative provisions of the 1990 Act have not been reproduced in this Bill. The common administrative provisions will be located in the *Taxation Administration Bill 2001*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 5 December 2001 (P.D. p 6456).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Assembly to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No. 50 of 2003 -- assented to on 20 March 2003).

**Debits Tax Bill 2001 \* (No. 85)**

The purpose of this Bill is to impose a tax on certain debits made to accounts kept with financial institutions. This Bill will replace the existing *Debits Tax Act 1990*. The repeal and, where relevant, the saving of the *Debits Tax Act 1990* can be found in the *Taxation Administration (Consequential Provisions) Bill 2001*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 5 December 2001 (P.D. p 6456).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Assembly to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No. 49 of 2003 -- assented to on 20 March 2003).

**Dental Prosthetists Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 252) (Mr M.W. Trenorden)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Dental Prosthetists Act 1985* to allow dental prosthetists to construct and fit partial dentures.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 November 2003 (P.D. p 13722).

Bill discharged from the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper on 10 March 2004.



**Dental Prosthetists Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 277) (Mr M.W. Trenorden)**

The purpose of this Bill is to enable dental prosthetists to construct and fit partial dentures.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 12 May 2004 (P.D. p 2785).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Director of Public Prosecutions Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 281)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Director of Public Prosecutions Act 1991* to allow the Director to bring, take over or prosecute summary offences.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 1 April 2004 (P.D. p 1536).

(Act No. 21 of 2004 -- assented to on 8 September 2004).

**Disability Services Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 311)**

The purpose of this Bill is to implement the recommendations from the Ministerial Review of the *Disability Services Act 1993*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 1 July 2004 (P.D.p 4759).

(Act No. 57 of 2004 -- assented to on 18 November 2004).

**Economic Regulation Authority Bill 2002 \* (No. 170)**

The purpose of this Bill is to establish the Economic Regulation Authority as an independent body to assume responsibility for economic regulatory functions currently performed by a variety of Ministers, sector-specific regulators and public sector officials. The regulatory functions of the Authority will apply to electricity, gas, rail and water industries.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 4 December 2002 (P.D. p 3911).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Public Administration and Finance on 10 April 2003.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 24 October 2003.

(Act No. 67 of 2003 -- assented to on 5 December 2003).

**Electoral Act Amendment (Fixed Terms) Bill 2004 (No. 348) (Mr L. Graham)**

The purpose of this Bill is to introduce fixed election dates in Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 October 2004 (P.D. p 6973).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Electoral and Constitution Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 253)**

The main purpose of this Bill is to introduce fixed election dates being the third Saturday of February every four years. The Bill also includes clarification of the qualifications for nominating as a candidate, minor revision of the counting method for the Legislative Council, simplified early voting procedures, increased voting rights for prisoners and general provisions that improve electoral administration.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 November 2003 (P.D. p 13496).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Electoral Legislation Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 243)**

This Bill introduces a number of important electoral amendments. The key aspects of the legislation are -

- the introduction of public electoral funding of candidates and political parties;
- provision of a fixed election date for conjoint elections (the third Saturday in February in the election year);
- changing the expiry date of the Legislative Council to 21 March in each election year; and
- a range of machinery provisions that will serve to assist electors and make the administration of the electoral process simpler and more timely.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 October 2003 (P.D. p 12744).

Bill discharged from the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper on 19 November 2003.

**Electoral Reform Bill 2002 \* (No. 155)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Electoral Act 1907* (WA) and the *Constitution Acts Amendment Act 1899* (WA). It will also repeal the *Electoral Distribution Act 1947* (WA). In addition, it will make consequential amendments to other Acts.

The three principal provisions of the Bill are -

- Legislative Assembly electorate districts will have equal enrolments subject to a tolerance of up to 10 percent above or below the average district enrolment;
- this 10 percent will be varied in respect of electoral districts within an area greater than 100,000 square kilometres where the tolerance will be 20 percent below the average district enrolment; and
- the State will be divided into six electoral regions each returning six Members of the Legislative Council with equal representation in city and country regions.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 October 2002 (P.D. p 2257).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Electricity Corporations Bill 2003 (No. 246)**

This Bill is the second in a package of three Bills to facilitate the implementation of electricity reform. The purpose of this Bill is to give effect to the restructure of Western Power and create four new Government entities in the form of the Electricity Generation Corporation, the Electricity Networks Corporation, the Electricity Retail Corporation and the Regional Power Corporation.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 30 October 2003 (P.D. p 12836).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

### **Electricity Industry Bill 2003 (No. 249)**

This Bill is the first of a package of three Bills which will overhaul the way in which the electricity industry operates. The purpose of this particular Bill is to -

- create a wholesale electricity market;
- provide for the development of an Electricity Access Code;
- establish an independent licensing regime and Tariff Equalisation Fund; and
- grants the heads of power to develop measures to protect customers in the new market.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 30 October 2003 (P.D. p 12833).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 12 March 2004.

### **Electricity Legislation (Amendments and Transitional Provisions) Bill 2003 (No. 247)** {name changed to *Electricity Legislation Amendment Bill 2003*}

This Bill is the third Bill in a package of three Bills to facilitate the implementation of electricity reform. The purpose of this Bill is to provide a number of transitional provisions and amendments to several Acts as a result of the restructure of Western Power. Primarily this Bill amends the *Electricity Corporation Act 1994* to repeal all provisions except those relating to access to Western Power's transmission and distribution systems.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 30 October 2003 (P.D. p 12838).

Short title of the Bill changed to *Electricity Legislation Amendment Bill 2003* by the Legislative Council on 26 August 2004 and agreed to by the Legislative Assembly on 23 September 2004.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 26 August 2004.

(Act No. 33 of 2004 -- assented to on 20 October 2004).

### **Electronic Transactions Bill 2001 \* (No. 38)**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide a regulatory framework for the use of electronic transactions. The Bill seeks, subject to certain exclusions, to allow an electronic communication the same validity as a written communication. The proposed Act also provides rules for determining the time and place of dispatch of electronic documents and the authority of the originator of the electronic communication.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 1 August 2001 (P.D. p 1856).

Referred to Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 23 October 2001.

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No. 3 of 2003 -- assented to on 24 March 2003).

**Emergency Management Bill 2004 (No. 349)**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for prompt and coordinated organisation of emergency management in the State, and for related purposes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 October 2004 (P.D. p 7372).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Emergency Services Levy Bill 2002 \* (No. 150)**

The purpose of this Bill is to impose the Emergency Services Levy, which is the cornerstone of the new funding arrangements planned for emergency services in Western Australia. The Levy imposed will ensure all persons in Western Australia contribute to funding for the fire and emergency services. The *Emergency Services Levy Bill 2002* compliments the *Fire and Emergency Services Legislation (Emergency Services Levy) Amendment Bill 2002*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 September 2002 (P.D. p 1572).

(Act No. 39 of 2002 -- assented to on 5 December 2002).

**Energy Legislation Amendment Bill 2003 \* (No. 210)**

The purpose of this Bill is to implement energy reform measures in order to provide a greater choice to customers, improve the ability of Government to plan for the State's energy needs and promote sustainable energy research, as well as rectify technical deficiencies in Western Power's legislation.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 June 2003 (P.D. p 9401).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 18 September 2003.

(Act No. 53 of 2003 -- assented to on 8 October 2003).

**Energy Operators and Water Agencies (Powers) Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 183)  
(Mr J.L. Bradshaw)**

The purpose of this Bill is to clarify by amendment to section 45(2) of the *Energy Operators (Powers) Act 1979* and to section 81(2) of the *Water Agencies (Powers) Act 1984* in terms of Government Agencies putting public facilities on private land. This Bill does not make any changes but clarifies Acts of Parliament already in place.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 12 March 2003 (P.D.p 5254).

Second reading not agreed to in the Legislative Assembly on 9 April 2003.

**Environmental Protection Amendment Bill 2002 \* (No. 131)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* to ensure: the independence of the Environmental Protection Authority; effective protection of native vegetation and clearing controls; the incorporation of sustainability principles into the *Environmental Protection Act*

1986; improved impact assessment processes under the *Act*; and more effective post-approval monitoring of major projects.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 June 2002 (P.D. p 12302).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Assembly to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Referred to a Legislative Assembly Legislation Committee on 24 September 2002.

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 24 October 2002 and in the Legislative Council on 18 September 2003.

Referred to Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 9 April 2003.

(Act No. 54 of 2003 -- assented to on 20 October 2003).

#### **Evidence Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 300)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Evidence Act 1906* to prescribe a process for the provision of DNA evidence in court.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 June 2004 (P.D.p 4185).

(Act No. 24 of 2004 -- assented to on 7 October 2004).

#### **Fair Trading Amendment Bill 2001 (No. 44) (Hon. P.G. Pandal)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Fair Trading Act 1987* to make it unlawful for a person to make a false or misleading statement concerning the place from which, or at which, goods or services are supplied. Furthermore, such an amendment would trigger S 69 of the existing Act, thus applying the penalties of \$20,000 for an individual and \$100,000 for a body corporate.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 March 2002 (P.D. p 8221).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Assembly to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Family Court Amendment Bill 2001 \* (No. 46)**

The purpose of this Bill is to make provisions for the resolution of de facto property and maintenance disputes. The *Family Court Amendment Bill 2001* recognises de facto spouses in opposite and same sex relationships and provides them with the same property and maintenance rights as married couples.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 August 2001 (P.D. p 3290).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 6 November 2001 and in the Legislative Council on 11 September 2002.

### **Finance Brokers Control Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 257)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Finance Brokers Control Act 1975* to provide increased protection for persons using the services of finance brokers and to reflect changes that have occurred in the market place since the Act was originally enacted in 1975.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 3 December 2003 (P.D. p 14062).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 30 June 2004.

### **Financial Administration Legislation Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 325)**

The Bill amends the *Financial Administration and Audit Act 1985* and the *Government Financial Responsibility Act 2000* for the purposes of -

- consolidating the annual financial reporting by the Treasurer;
- improving the timeliness of annual and quarterly financial reporting by the Treasurer and annual reporting by Government departments;
- amending the title and strengthening the role of Principal Accounting Officers, and
- providing for two machinery changes, being
- the process for disbursing 27th pay provisions to Government departments; and
- to legislatively recognise the creation of the Parliamentary Services Department.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 August 2004 (P.D. p 5727).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

### **Fines, Penalties and Infringement Notices Enforcement Amendment Bill 2002 (No. 152)**

The purpose of this Bill is to address the anomaly in the legislation by allowing time to pay be afforded to offenders following the issue of a warrant of execution in fines enforcement actions. The amendments will increase the time to pay options for offenders and are consistent with the Government's justice system initiatives by improving access to justice and reducing the rate of imprisonment. Other minor amendments are proposed to clarify related issues.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 October 2002 (P.D. p 2253).

### **Fire and Emergency Services Legislation Amendment Bill 2001 \* (No. 75)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Fire and Emergency Services Authority of Western Australia Act 1998* to include provisions relating to the State Emergency Service (SES) and Volunteer Marine Rescue Services (VMRS). The Bill seeks to recognise the SES and VMRS and to provide the functions and powers necessary for their members to operate effectively.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 4 December 2001 (P.D. p 6348).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 16 April 2002 and in the Legislative Council on 13 November 2002.

(Act No. 38 of 2002 -- assented to on 20 November 2002).

### **Fire and Emergency Services Legislation (Emergency Services Levy) Amendment Bill 2002 \* (No. 151)**

The purpose of this Bill provides for the introduction of the Emergency Services Levy from 1 July 2003. The Bill involves amendments to the *Fire and Emergency Services Authority of Western Australia Act 1998*, the *Fire Brigades Act 1942* and consequential amendments to the *Rates and Charges (Rebates and Deferments) Act 1992*. All property owners throughout the State will be charged the new levy depending on the level of fire and emergency services available to them. The funding will cover -

- the career and volunteer Fire and Rescue Service;
- local governments' Volunteer Bush Fire Brigades;
- the State Emergency Service;
- FESA's new multi-service FESA units;
- its Emergency Management Services; and
- its community safety programs.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 September 2002 (P.D. p 1570).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 28 November 2002.

(Act No. 42 of 2002 -- assented to on 11 December 2002).

### **Firearms Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 251)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Firearms Act 1973* in order to -

- introduce a new circumstance of aggravation and penalty where a person carries an unlicensed firearm and drugs or money;
- implement the requirements of the Council of Australian Governments (COAG)/ Australian Police Ministers' Council (APMC) resolutions on handguns;
- modernise some provisions and penalties of the Act;
- remove ambiguity about the lawfulness of playing paintball in Western Australia and provide for the licensing of paintball guns; and
- implement the Machinery of Government recommendation to repeal the Firearms Advisory Committee.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 19 November 2003 (P.D. p 13385).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 4 March 2004 and in the Legislative Council on 12 November 2004.

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and General Purposes on 30 March 2004.

#### **First Home Owner Grant Amendment Bill 2002 (No. 105)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *First Home Owner Grant Act 2000* to provide for an additional \$3 000 grant, together with the existing \$7 000 grant, for the construction or purchase of eligible new homes where the contract is entered into (or in the case of owner builders, where construction starts) between 1 January 2002 and 30 June 2002 (inclusive).

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 March 2002 (P.D. p 9120).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 2 April 2003.

#### **First Home Owner Grant Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 308)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *First Home Owner Grant Act 2000* in order to -

- specify a minimum age of eligibility for the grant of 18 years;
- specify a six month residence requirement;
- clarify the eligibility for a grant subsequent to the repayment of a previous grant;
- clarify the offence provision concerning the submission of false or misleading information to the Commissioner; and
- clarify the confidentiality provisions.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 June 2004 (P.D. p 4181).

(Act No. 52 of 2004 -- assented to on 18 November 2004).

#### **Flags Protection Bill 2003 (No. 192) (Hon. C.J. Barnett)**

This Bill declares a flag to be the Western Australian State Flag and protects both this flag and the Australian National Flag from acts of physical desecration which are intended to, or cause, offence to members of the public.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 April 2003 (P.D. p 6825).

Second Reading not agreed to in the Legislative Assembly on 7 April 2004.



**Forest Products Amendment Bill 2004 (LC No. 307)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Forest Products Act 2000*, to provide a level of resource security to the plantation timber processing industry that will encourage and maintain investment.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 24 June 2004 (P.D.p 4242).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 22 October 2004.

**Freedom of Information Amendment Bill 2003 (LC No. 206) (Hon. J.A. Scott)**

The purpose of this Bill is to make a minor amendment to the *Freedom of Information Act 1992* that will have a significant effect on the effective application of the Act. This will enable the release of requested documents that are currently exempt under Schedule 1, Clause 5(1)(b).

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 26 June 2003 (P.D.p 9319).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 11 September 2003 and in the Legislative Assembly on 27 October 2004.

**Gas and Electricity Safety Legislation Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 221)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Energy Coordination Act 1994*, the *Gas Standards Act 1972* and the *Electricity Act 1945*, in order to make improvements to the electrical and gas technical and safety regulation regime, especially in respect to enforcement.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 August 2003 (P.D.p 10392).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Gas Pipelines Access (Western Australia) (Reviews) Amendment Bill 2003 \* (LC No. 173)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Gas Pipelines Access (Western Australia) Act 1998* to clarify certain provisions of the Act and to give effect to matters dealt with by a proposed change to the National Third Party Access Code for Natural Gas Pipeline Systems. The Bill clarifies the time at which the right of appeal arises, expands appeal rights, streamlines procedures for the classification of pipelines and makes necessary consequential changes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 12 March 2003 (P.D. p 5205).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and General Purposes on 12 March 2003.

**Gene Technology Amendment Bill 2001 \* (No. 40)**

The purpose of this Bill is to enable annual charges to be levied on licences authorising certain dealings with genetically modified organisms (GMOs).

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 7 August 2001 (P.D. p 2081).

Referred to Legislative Council Standing Committee on Environment and Public Affairs on 26 June 2002.

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Gene Technology Bill 2001 \* (No. 39)**

The purpose of this Bill is to establish the Western Australian component of a national scheme that regulates activities involving gene technology, and genetically modified organisms, by applying precisely the same system as applies under the Commonwealth Act in those situations where the Commonwealth Act is constitutionally unable to reach.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 7 August 2001 (P.D. p 2078).

**Genetically Modified Crops Free Areas Bill 2003 (No. 189)**

The purpose of this Bill is to allow the State Government to designate areas of the State, or the whole of the State, as areas where specified genetically modified (GM) food crops may not be grown. This will be done by Ministerial order.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 7 May 2003 (P.D. p 7208).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 10 December 2003.

(Act No. 79 of 2003 -- assented to on 24 December 2003).

**Grain Marketing Bill 2002 \* (No. 143)**

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal the *Grain Marketing Act 1975*, introduce new grain marketing arrangements for the Western Australian grains industry and effect the merger of the Grain Pool of WA and Co-operative Bulk Handling Limited. This is to ensure the continued prosperity of the Western Australian grain industry while allowing it to keep pace with changes occurring both nationally and internationally.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 September 2002 (P.D. p 751).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 17 October 2002.

**Health Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 216)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Health Act 1911* to provide improved communicable disease reporting and treatment requirements.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 June 2004 (P.D.p 4186).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Health Legislation Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 285)**

The purpose of this Bill is to make amendments to various Acts administered by the health portfolio, including the -

- *Health Act 1911*;
- *Health Services (Quality Improvement) Act 1994*;
- *Hospitals and Health Services Act 1927*; and
- *Queen Elizabeth II Medical Centre Act 1966*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 8 April 2004 (P.D. p 2021).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 23 June 2004.

(Act No. 61 of 2004 -- assented to on 24 November 2004).

**Health (Smoking in Enclosed Public Places) Amendment Bill 2003 \* (No. 200)  
(Dr J.M Woollard)**

This Bill amends Part IXB of the *Health Act 1911* by making it offence for a person to smoke in an enclosed public space. The Bill proposes to substitute the existing discretionary regime as to the circumstances in which smoking is permitted in an enclosed public space with an outright prohibition to smoke in an enclosed public space.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 May 2003 (P.D. p 7691).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Heathcote Hospital Site (Reservation) Bill 2001 (No. 63) (Dr J.M. Woollard)**

The purpose of this Bill is to protect the Heathcote Hospital site from undesirable interference by reserving the land as a class 'A' reserve under the *Land Administration Act 1997*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 October 2001 (P.D.p 4543).

Reinstated on 15 August 2002 in the Legislative Assembly to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Higher Education Bill 2003 (No. 191)**

The purpose of this Bill is to implement the *National Protocols for Higher Education Approval Processes* in Western Australia. The main emphasis in the Bill is on accreditation, authorisation and quality assurance matters in the private non-university sector of higher education.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 6 May 2003 (P.D. p 7044).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and General Purposes. on 24 June 2003.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 19 November 2004.

**Home Building Contracts Amendment Bill 2002 (No. 127)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Home Building Contracts Act 1991* in relation to home indemnity insurance and the approval of funds providing corresponding cover; and to amend the *Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1960* consequentially.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 June 2002 (P.D.p 12076).

Reinstated on 24 September 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

**Human Reproductive Technology Amendment Bill 2003 \* (No. 212)**

The purpose of this Bill is to replace existing prohibitions under the *Human Reproductive Technology Act 1991*. Prohibitions are framed in terminology that reflects current scientific knowledge and ensures consistency with the way the offences are described in the national scheme.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 June 2003 (P.D.p 9404).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 30 October 2003 and in the Legislative Council on 1 July 2004.

### **Industrial Hemp Bill 2003 (No. 250)**

The purpose of this Bill is to facilitate the development of an industry for the cultivation and processing of Industrial Hemp in Western Australia. The Bill provides for a system of licensing for legal persons wishing to cultivate, harvest or process Industrial Hemp.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 November 2003 (P.D. p 13680).

### **Inspector of Custodial Services Bill 2003 (No. 228)**

The purpose of this Bill is to extend the jurisdiction of the Inspector of Custodial Services to juvenile detention centres. The Bill will also draw the current spread of the Inspector's jurisdiction from several pieces of legislation into a discrete statute.

### **Insurance Commission of Western Australia Amendment Bill 2002 (No. 136)**

This will enable the Government to provide insurance cover to "eligible community organisations" based in Western Australia, which are currently unable to access affordable, or any, private insurance cover; particularly Public Liability insurance.

The purpose of this Bill is to ratify the Iron Ore Processing (Mineralogy Pty. Ltd.) Agreement dated 5 December 2001 between the State of Western Australia, Mineralogy Pty. Ltd., and six co-proponent companies.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 19 February 2002 (P.D. p 7522).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

#### **Juries Amendment Bill 2003 \* (No. 161)**

The principle purpose of this Bill is to protect the security of jurors and, thereby the integrity of the jury system. This means introducing two major reform initiatives -

- providing for jury anonymity by identifying jurors by a court-designated number rather than by name; and
- changing the method by which reserve jurors participate in the jury process by removing the distinction between jurors and reserve jurors so that all participate fully during the course of the trial.

This Bill is part of a package of legislation to reform Western Australia's lower court system. The Bill addresses the issues of recruitment and training for Justices of the Peace. This Bill has three components which -

- establish specific criteria and guidelines to be considered by the Minister when recommending to the Governor appointments and the termination of appointments of JP's;
- provide that prior to their appointment, JP's must satisfactorily complete an approved training course; and
- require current JP's to take up these training opportunities, unless they have previously completed an approved training course.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 4 December 2003 (P.D. p 14289).

#### **Kambalda Water and Wastewater Facilities (Transfer to Water Corporation) Bill 2004 (No. 350)**

The purpose of this Bill is to transfer ownership of the Kambalda Water and Wastewater Facilities and certain associated rights to the Water Corporation. To apply section 84 of the *Water Agencies (Powers) Act 1984* to pipes and other things that are part of those facilities; and to make incidental and related provisions.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 October 2004 (P.D. p 7397).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 9 November 2004.

(Act No. 64 of 2004 -- assented to on 30 November 2004).

**Land Tax Assessment Bill 2001 \* (No. 82)**

The purpose of this Bill is to replace the existing *Land Tax Assessment Act 1976* with an up-to-date, contemporary statute in an easy to follow format. The repeal and, where relevant, saving of the *Land Tax Assessment Act 1976* can be found in the *Taxation Administration (Consequential Provisions) Bill 2001*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 5 December 2001 (P.D. p 6455).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No. 52 of 2003 -- assented to on 20 March 2003).

**Land Tax Bill 2001 \* (No. 83)**

The purpose of this Bill is to reconstitute the *Land Tax Act 1976* due to the large number of consequential changes that are necessary to amalgamate and standardise the administrative provisions of four taxation statutes in the *Taxation Administration Bill 2001*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 5 December 2001 (P.D. p 6455).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No. 51 of 2003 -- assented to on 20 March 2003).

**Law Reform (Contributory Negligence and Tortfeasors' Contribution) Amendment Bill 2001 (No. 74)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the apportionment provisions of the *Law Reform (Contributory Negligence and Tortfeasors' Contribution) Act 1947* so as to extend those provisions to claims for a breach of a contractual duty of care that is concurrent and co-extensive with a tortious duty of care.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 November 2001 (P.D. p 6011).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 21 February 2002.

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

**Legal Practice Bill 2002 \* (No. 154)**

This Bill is part of a package of reforms for a more modern and relevant framework for the legal profession and the courts. The purpose of the Bill is to -

- bring greater clarity to the standards required of and regulation of legal practitioners;
- modernise the structure and functions of the Legal Practice Board and the operations of the Complaints Committee and Disciplinary Tribunal;
- enable the creation of incorporated legal practises (ILP's) and multi-disciplinary partnerships (MDP's);
- regulate foreign lawyers who advise clients in this State on matters pertaining to foreign law; and
- introduce national practising certificates into Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 October 2002 (P.D. p 2254).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 19 June 2003 and in the Legislative Council on 18 November 2003.

(Act No. 64 of 2003 -- assented to on 4 December 2003).

#### **Limitation Bill 2004 (No. 344)**

The purpose of this Bill is to update and modernise Western Australia's law in relation to time limits for commencing civil legal proceedings and arbitrations.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 October 2004 (P.D. p 6949).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 28 October 2004.

Referred to Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 24 November 2004.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Limitation Legislation Amendment and Repeal Bill 2004 (No. 345)**

The purpose of this Bill is to make consequential amendments as a result of the *Limitation Bill 2004*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 October 2004 (P.D. p 6952).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 28 October 2004.

Referred to Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 24 November 2004.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Liquor Licensing Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 319) (Hon. P.G. Pental)**

The purpose of this Bill is to allow certain liquor stores to trade from 10am to 10pm on Sundays.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 30 June 2004 (P.D. p 4639).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Loan Bill 2003 (No. 196)**

The purpose of this Bill is to seek necessary authority for the raising of loans for public purposes. It also permanently appropriates from the Consolidated Fund to meet principal repayments, interest and other expenses of borrowing under this authority.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 4 June 2003 (P.D. p 8162).

(Act No. 13 of 2004 -- assented to on 30 June 2004).



**Loans (Co-operative Companies) Bill 2004 (No. 338)**

The purpose of this Bill is to establish a scheme enabling loans to be made by the Government to eligible Western Australian Co-operative Companies. Eligible companies meet requirements set out in section 120(1)(c) of the Commonwealth *Income Tax Assessment Act 1936*. The effect for eligible co-operative companies is that if they borrow money from a government of the Commonwealth or a State, then the company may claim the capital repayments of the loan as an Income Tax deduction.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 October 2004 (P.D. p 6944).

**Lobbying Disclosure and Accountability Bill 2003 (No. 205) (Dr E. Constable)**

The purpose of this Bill is to introduce measures to ensure openness and accountability of professional lobbying activities intended to inform and influence Members of Parliament, ministerial staff and other public officials in Western Australia. The Bill is confined to paid lobbyists, both employed lobbyists and consultants.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 June 2003 (P.D. p 8612).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Local Government Amendment Bill 2003 (LC No. 262)**

The purpose of this Bill is to make a wide range of amendments to the *Local Government Act 1995* following the completion of a major review of the Act. The Bill contains amendments, which are designed to remove any inefficient or impractical provisions, which have been of concern to local governments since the Principal Act came into operation.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 3 December 2003 (P.D. p 13988).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 17 August 2004.

(Act No. 49 of 2004 -- assented to on 12 November 2004).

**Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 240)**

The purpose of this Bill is to regulate local governments' delegation of authority to approve plans and specifications, to their employees; and secondly to provide a framework to retrospectively authorise building work carried out without the prior approval of the local government.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 30 October 2003 (P.D. p 12839).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Local Government (Straying Stock) Bill 2004 (LC No. 293) (Hon. P. Embry)**

The purpose of this Bill is to enable local governments to require remedial action by the owners of properties to prevent animals straying onto a road.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 12 May 2004 (P.D.p 2698).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Machinery of Government (Miscellaneous Amendments) Bill 2003 (No. 254)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend various Acts to implement certain recommendations of the Machinery of Government Taskforce, and to help reduce the number and fragmented nature of departments and agencies within the Western Australian Public Sector.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 4 December 2003 (P.D. p 14260).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 4 May 2004.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Machinery of Government (Water Resources) Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 238)**

This Bill is one of two which will implement the Machinery of Government Taskforce's recommendation to amalgamate the environmental protection and water resources management administration. It repeals the *Water and Rivers Commission Act 1995* and the powers and responsibilities from this Act will be transferred to the Minister and the CEO of the Department of Environment. The Department of Environment will also administer the *Environmental Protection Act 1986*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 October 2003 (P.D. p 12747).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Magistrates Court Bill 2003 (No. 260)**

This Bill is the foundation of a legislative package that reforms the lower courts in Western Australia. The Bill is the vehicle to implement a range of Law Reform Commission recommendations and to set up a new court, the Magistrates Court of Western Australia, with the capacity to deal with both civil and criminal matters, and able to sit at various locations throughout the state.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 4 December 2003 (P.D.p 14275).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 10 March 2004 and in the Legislative Council on 20 October 2004.

Referred to Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 29 June 2004.

(Act No. 47 of 2004 -- assented to on 12 November 2004).

**Magistrates Court (Civil Proceedings) Bill 2003 (No. 261)**

This Bill is the second in a package of legislation to reform the lower Courts in Western Australia. The purpose of this particular Bill is to provide for the civil jurisdiction of the proposed new Magistrates Court. The Court will have jurisdiction in relation to monetary claims up to \$50,000. As from 1 January 2009 the jurisdictional limit will be raised to \$75,000. The Court will also have jurisdiction within the monetary limit in relation to claims for equitable relief and consumer/ trading claims.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 4 December 2003 (P.D. p 14277).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 9 March 2004 and in the Legislative Council on 20 October 2004.

**Main Roads Amendment Bill 2001 \* (No. 48) (Mr M.W. Trenorden)**

The purpose of this Bill is to ensure that ongoing funds are committed to road investment by providing that a dedicated sum of the GST revenue pool be transferred to the Main Roads Trust Fund each year.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 August 2001 (P.D.p 3324).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Marketing Of Eggs Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 302)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Marketing of Eggs Act 1945* to provide for the expiry of the Act and the dissolution of the W.A. Egg Marketing Board on or before 31 December 2005. The expiry of the Act will fulfil the State's National Competition Policy obligations in relation to egg marketing.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 3 June 2004 (P.D.p 3505).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 23 June 2004.

(Act No. 20 of 2004 -- assented to on 26 August 2004).

**Metropolitan Region Improvement Tax Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 317)**

This Bill arises from the consequential and transitional provisions of the *Planning and Development Bill 2004*. Amendments are required to the *Metropolitan Region Improvement Tax Act 1959* to ensure continuity in the imposition and payment of the metropolitan region improvement tax through the repeal of the *Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act 1959*, *Town Planning and Development Act 1928* and the *Western Australian Planning Commission Act 1985* and the enactment of the *Planning and Development Act 2004*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 30 June 2004 (P.D.p 4619).

Referred to a Legislative Assembly Legislation Committee on 16 September 2004.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Metropolitan Region Scheme (Fremantle) Bill 2004 (No. 321) (Hon. M.F. Board)**

The purpose of this Bill is to reinstate into the Metropolitan Region Scheme the road reserve known as the Fremantle Eastern Bypass.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 August 2004 (P.D. p 5622).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Mines Safety and Inspection Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 330)**

The purpose of this Bill is to strengthen and improve the existing provisions of the *Mines Safety and Inspection Act 1994* resulting from a statutory review of that Act.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 August 2004 (P.D. p 5584).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 26 October 2004 and in the Legislative Council on 18 November 2004.

(Act No. 68 of 2004 -- assented to on 8 December 2004).

#### **Mining Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 297)**

The purpose of this Bill is to implement important and strategic amendments required to the *Mining Act 1978* that will ensure the Act remains dynamic and able to meet the needs of the mining industry into the future.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 August 2004 (P.D. p 5728).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 26 October 2004.

(Act No. 39 of 2004 -- assented to on 3 November 2004).

#### **Misuse of Drugs Amendment Bill 2003 \* (No. 202)**

The purpose of this Bill is to -

- place legislative controls on the sale and supply of chemicals and apparatus used in the illicit manufacture of amphetamines and other drugs;
- close a sentencing anomaly whereby principle offenders in drug trafficking matters are able to receive discounted sentences; and
- enable interstate chemical analysts to tender certificates of their analysis as evidence.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 June 2003 (P.D. p 8582).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 10 November 2004.

(Act No. 62 of 2004 -- assented to on 24 November 2004).

**Motor Vehicle Dealers Amendment Bill (No. 2) 2002 \* (No. 129)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Motor Vehicle Dealers Act 1973* to constitute a Motor Vehicle Industry Board with licensing, registration and other functions in respect of persons involved in motor vehicle dealing and motor vehicle repair work. The Bill also includes transitional provisions to ensure that the change in title of the Board doesn't affect any right, power or obligation of the Board, any proceedings in progress or anything previously done by the Board.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 5 December 2002 (P.D. p 4079).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 3 December 2003.

(Act No. 73 of 2003 -- assented to on 15 December 2003).

**Motor Vehicle Repairers Bill 2002 \* (No. 130)**

The purpose of this Bill is to improve consumer protection, general standard of repairs conducted on motor vehicles and enhance consumer confidence in the motor vehicle repair industry. The main provisions of the Bill are as follows -

- the requirement for licensing of motor vehicle repair businesses and certification of individual repairers;
- classes of repair work to be prescribed by regulation;
- the disciplining of licensed businesses and individual repairers who contravene the Act or otherwise engage in unjust conduct;
- it also establishes a Motor Vehicle Repair Industry Compensation Fund to compensate owners of vehicles who suffer loss as a result of incompetent repairs; and
- the Bill will also establish an Education and Research Fund.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 5 December 2002 (P.D. p 4078).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 19 June 2003.

(Act No. 68 of 2003 -- assented to on 9 December 2003).

**National Crime Authority (State Provisions) Amendment Bill 2002 \* (No. 102)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *National Crime Authority (State Provisions) Act 1985* so that it more closely reflects the *National Crime Authority Act 1984* of the Commonwealth. The primary aim of the Bill is to enhance the effectiveness of the National Crime Authority (NCA) in combating organised crime. This will be achieved principally through the provision of greater penalties for failing to answer a question at a NCA hearing; the removal of the defence "without reasonable excuse"; and the removal of derived-use immunity.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 March 2002 (P.D. p 9153).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and General Purposes on 14 August 2002.

**Nuclear Activities (Prohibition) Bill 2002 (LC No. 139) (Hon. G. Watson)**

The purpose of this Bill is to prohibit exploration and mining for uranium and thorium. It will also prohibit the construction or operation of certain facilities associated with the nuclear fuel chain.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 18 September 2002 (P.D. p 1144).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Nuclear Waste Storage (Prohibition) Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 220)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Nuclear Waste Storage (Prohibition) Act 1999* in order to extend the application of the Act to all nuclear waste whether generated in Australia or overseas. It will also introduce a new offence of transporting nuclear waste, and a power for the responsible Minister to seek an injunction to restrain activities associated with the storage or transportation of nuclear waste.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 August 2003 (P.D. p 9857).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 11 March 2004.

**Nurses Amendment Bill 2002 (No. 159)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend a number of Acts and Regulations in order to provide an operational framework for Nurse Practitioners in Western Australia. The Bill will enable Registered Nurses who have attained further qualifications as a Nurse Practitioner to practice at an advanced level in "designated areas" within Western Australia.

**Oaths, Affidavits and Statutory Declarations Bill 2003 (No. 259)**

The purpose of this Bill is to -

- consolidate legal provisions relevant to making oaths, affirmations, affidavits and statutory declarations; and
- provide for a religiously neutral oath.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 4 December 2003 (P.D. p 14290).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 4 May 2004.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Oaths, Affidavits and Statutory Declarations (Consequential Provisions) Bill 2003 (No. 255)**

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal the *Declarations and Attestations Act 1913* (WA) and four adopted Imperial Acts relating to oaths and amends a number of other Western Australian Acts as a consequence of the enactment of the proposed *Oaths, Affidavits and Statutory Declarations Act 2003* (WA).

#### **Occupational Safety and Health Amendment Bill 2002 (No. 110)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Occupational Safety and Health Act 1984* to gradually extend its operation to police officers.

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

#### **Occupational Safety and Health Legislation Amendment and Repeal Bill 2004 (No. 282)**

The purpose of this Bill is to deal with a number of administrative matters that require clarification, extends coverage to accommodate a range of non-traditional working arrangements and focuses on encouraging occupational safety and health matters to be dealt with by the individual employers and employees who have to manage and work with workplace hazards.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 8 April 2004 (P.D.p 10414).

#### **Ocean Gardens (Inc.) Bill 2003 (No. 242)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the Constitution of Ocean Gardens Retirement Village in order to implement the Ombudsman's recommendations in his report entitled "Report on an Investigation into a Complaint by the Town of Cambridge Concerning the City of Perth" dated September 2001. The intent of the Bill is to return the Constitution to a controlling membership of nominees from the Town of Cambridge.

**Offshore Minerals Bill 2001 \* (No. 35)**

Referred to Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 8 August 2001.

**Offshore Minerals (Consequential Amendments) Bill 2001 \* (No. 37)**

The purpose of this Bill is to ensure that *The Mining Act 1978*, the *Conservation and Land Management Act 1984* and the *Fish Resources Management Act 1994* are consistent with the provisions of the Offshore Minerals Bill.

The purpose of this Bill is to mirror the Commonwealth *Offshore (Registration Fees) Act 1994* and provides for the method of calculation and payment of fees required for certain documents affecting titles in State coastal waters, that is titles to be granted under the *Offshore Minerals Act*.

The purpose of this Bill is to replace the existing *Pay-roll Tax Act 1971*. The Act is to be repealed due to the large number of consequential changes necessary to amalgamate and standardise the administrative provisions of four taxation statutes in the *Taxation Administration Bill 2001*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 5 December 2001 (P.D. p 6454).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No. 47 of 2003 -- assented to on 20 March 2003).

**Perth International Centre for Application of Solar Energy Amendment Bill 2003 \* (No. 182)**

The purpose of this Bill is to facilitate the wind up of the Centre for the Application of Solar Energy (CASE). The Bill amends the *Perth International Centre for Application of Solar Energy Act 1994*, which legislate the functions and financial operation of CASE, and provides for the phasing out and expiry of that Act.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 February 2003 (P.D. p 4712).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Petroleum Legislation Amendment and Repeal Bill 2004 (No. 343)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Petroleum (Submerged Lands) Act 1982*, the *Petroleum Act 1967* and the *Petroleum Pipelines Act 1969* with respect to the occupational safety and health of persons at offshore petroleum facilities, petroleum operations and petroleum pipeline operations. This Bill also repeals the *Petroleum Safety Act 1999* and makes consequential amendments to the *Barrow Island Act 2003*, the *Industrial Relations Act 1979* and the *Occupational Safety and Health Act 1984*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 October 2004 (P.D. p 6941).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Pig, Potato and Poultry Industries (Compensation Legislation) Repeal Bill 2003 (No. 248)**

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal the *Pig Industry Compensation Act 1942*, the *Potato Growing Industry Trust Fund Act 1947*, and the *Poultry Industry Trust Fund Act 1948*. The Bill puts in place transitional arrangements, including the transfer of moneys in the Funds established under the repealed Acts to the Agricultural Produce Commission for the benefit of the relevant Committees and deals with accountability issues such as financial reporting.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 November 2003 (P.D.p 13498).

(Act No. 40 of 2004 -- assented to on 3 November 2004).

**Planning and Development Bill 2004 (No. 313)**

The purpose of this Bill is to consolidate the existing planning legislation. The Bill also includes several amendments to the current planning legislation to streamline planning processes and provide a more clear, certain and workable planning system.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 30 June 2004 (P.D. p 4614).

Referred to a Legislative Assembly Legislation Committee on 16 September 2004.

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 23 September 2004.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Planning and Development (Consequential and Transitional Provisions) Bill 2004 (No. 314)**

The purpose of this Bill is to make consequential and transitional amendments to various Acts as a consequence of the *Planning and Development Bill 2004*. Most of the amendments are minor amendments replacing reference to titles of the current planning Acts by the new Bill, or referring to new descriptions of regional and local planning schemes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 30 June 2004 (P.D. p 4618).

Referred to a Legislative Assembly Legislation Committee on 16 September 2004.

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 23 September 2004.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Planning Appeals Amendment Bill 2001 \* (No. 23)**

The purpose of this Bill is to abolish the Ministerial appeal system and directs all planning appeals to the Town Planning Appeal Tribunal.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 June 2001 (P.D. p 1580).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 21 August 2001 and in the Legislative Council on 22 August 2002.

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Public Administration and Finance on 8 November 2001.

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No. 24 of 2002 -- assented to on 24 September 2002).

**Plant Pests and Diseases (Eradication Funds) Amendment Bill 2002 (No. 147)**

The purpose of this Bill is to extend the current *Plant Pests and Diseases (Eradication Funds) Act 1974* for a further year (until 31 October 2003). The Government plans to replace the current Act with a new one, however that will not be possible prior to its expiry.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 12 September 2002 (P.D. p 894).

(Act No. 31 of 2002 -- assented to on 28 October 2002).

**Plant Pests and Diseases (Eradication Funds) Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 234)**

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal the expiry provision contained in section 18 of the *Plant Pests and Diseases (Eradication Funds) Act 1974*. Under section 18 the Act is set to expire on 31 October 2003.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 September 2003 (P.D. p 11380).

(Act No. 57 of 2003 -- assented to on 29 October 2003).

**Police Amendment Bill 2002 \* (No. 160)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Police Act 1892*, in order to clarify the circumstances in which police officers may be removed from office. It also affords those officers an independent right of appeal to the West Australian Industrial Relations Commission. The Bill will provide a suitable appeal mechanism to ensure fairness without undermining the Commissioner of Police's ability to summarily remove officers whose suitability is in doubt.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 November 2002 (P.D. p 3072).

(Act No. 7 of 2003 -- assented to on 27 March 2003).

**Ports and Marine Legislation Amendment Bill 2003 \* (No. 171)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Port Authorities Act 1999* and also the *Pollution of Waters by Oil and Noxious Substances Act 1987*, in order to overcome shortcomings in port authorities leasing powers, improve the State's capacity to respond to or prevent oil spills from ships, and fix an administrative problem relating to ownership of navigational aids.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 February 2003 (P.D. p 4830).

(Act No. 71 of 2003 -- assented to on 15 December 2003).

**Prisons Amendment Bill 2002 \* (No. 98)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Prisons Act 1981* to provide a mechanism to ban a person either from entering a particular prison, or a number of prisons, for a set period, for prescribed reasons, which would be detailed in Regulations. Furthermore, the Bill seeks to make provision for the taking of a visitor's biometric identification by means including palmprints, eyeprints etc to achieve more accurate identification of visitors. The Bill also seeks to provide an incentive for good behaviour and work in prison by extending the early discharge powers of the Director General of the Department of Justice from 10 to 30 days.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 March 2002 (P.D. p 8191).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 8 April 2003.

(Act No. 24 of 2003 -- assented to on 24 April 2003).

**Professional Standards Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 304)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Professional Standards Act 1997* so that it will remain consistent with the *Professional Standards Act 1994* of New South Wales.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 30 June 2004 (P.D. p 4613).

(Act No. 25 of 2004 -- assented to on 28 September 2004).

**Prostitution Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 190)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Prostitution Act 2000* to repeal the provision of the expiry of that Act.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 2 April 2003 (P.D. p 6007).

(Act No. 33 of 2003 -- assented to on 23 June 2003).

**Prostitution Control Bill 2003 \* (No. 166)**

This Bill covers a wide range of issues for sex workers including -

- the establishment of a Prostitution Control Board;
- providing for increased penalties to protect children and incapable persons from being induced into prostitution;
- providing the Board and police with strong laws to prevent and deter the involvement of organised crime in prostitution;
- the requirement for operators/owners and managers of brothels and escort agencies to be licensed;
- the requirement for prostitutes employed by brothels or escort agencies to be engaged as employees giving prostitutes the industrial protections, such as unfair dismissal and coverage under the *Occupational Safety and Health Act 1984*;
- generally incorporating the provisions of the *Prostitution Act 2000*;
- promotion of safe sexual practices;
- encouragement of prostitutes to undertake regular health checks; and
- the regulation of the mode and content of advertising.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 2 April 2003 (P.D. p 6003).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 26 June 2003.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Public and Bank Holidays Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 284)**

The purpose of the Bill is to amend the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1972* to allow banks in Western Australia to open on Saturdays.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 7 April 2004 (P.D. p 1873).

(Act No. 32 of 2004 -- assented to on 14 October 2004).

**Public Interest Disclosure Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 229) (Hon. C.L. Edwardes)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Public Interest Disclosure Act 2003* in order to remove the restriction on whistleblowers talking to the media about their claims and enabling them to defend themselves without threats of dismissal or discipline.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 10 September 2003 (P.D.p 10979).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Public Interest Disclosure Bill 2002 (No. 103)**

{named changed from *Whistleblowers Protection Bill 2002*}

The purpose of this Bill is to enable and encourage whistleblowers to disclose wrongdoing or improper conduct by providing them with a framework for making such disclosures, either to the agency concerned or to another "watchdog" authority. The Bill requires State and local government departments and agencies to investigate disclosures and remedy any defects and wrongdoing.

Furthermore, the Bill provides protection for whistleblowers including confidentiality, employment protection and immunity from any criminal or civil liability.

Short title of the Bill was changed to *Public Interest Disclosure Bill 2002* during Consideration in Detail in the Legislative Assembly on 7 May 2002.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 12 March 2003 and further amended in the Legislative Assembly 19 March 2003

(Act No. 29 of 2003 -- assented to on 22 May 2003).

#### **Public Notaries Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 287)**

This Bill repeals subsections 10(1) and (4) of the *Public Notaries Act 1979* and transfers the functions currently conferred on the Attorney General under those subsections to The Legal Practice Board, which will be able to report directly to the Chief Justice.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 12 May 2004 (P.D. p 2753).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Public Transport Authority Bill 2003 \* (No. 177)**

The purpose of this Bill is to -

- establish the Public Transport Authority as the State agency responsible for providing public passenger transport services throughout Western Australia. Western Australian Government Railways, Transperth and the school bus section of the Department of Planning and Infrastructure will be brought together into this consolidated passenger transit agency;
- place with the authority responsibility for residual rail issues that fall outside the ambit of the rail freight system act; and
- place with the authority responsibility for management of the "rail freight corridor".

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 February 2003 (P.D. p 4751).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 8 April 2003 and in the Legislative Council on 15 May 2003.

(Act No. 31 of 2003 -- assented to on 26 May 2003).

#### **Racing and Gambling Legislation Amendment and Repeal Bill 2003 \* (No. 180)**

This Bill is part of a package of four Bills establishing the single controlling authority to be known as *Racing and Wagering Western Australia* (RWWA). The purpose of this particular Bill is to provide the transitional provisions necessary to manage the establishment of RWWA and the consequential amendments needed to other Acts to recognise RWWA and to achieve complementary aspects of the governance restructure.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 March 2003 (P.D. p 5345).

(Act No. 35 of 2003 -- assented to on 26 June 2003).

**Racing and Wagering Western Australia Bill 2003 \* (No. 178)**

The purpose of this Bill is to establish *Racing and Wagering Western Australia* (RWWA) as the controlling authority for thoroughbred harness and greyhound racing in Western Australia. The Bill also outlines the structure of this new agency, its subsequent board of directors and its particular purpose.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 March 2003 (P.D. p 5341).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 7 May 2003 and in the Legislative Council on 12 June 2003.

(Act No. 36 of 2003 -- assented to on 26 June 2003).

**Racing and Wagering Western Australia Tax Bill 2003 \* (No. 181)**

This Bill is part of a package of four Bills to restructure the racing industry governance system in WA by creating the *Racing and Wagering Western Australia* (RWWA). The purpose of this particular Bill is to apply the taxation regime that is currently in place in respect of the TAB under the *Totalisator Agency Board Betting Tax Act 1960* to the newly formed RWWA's off-course wagering turnover.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 March 2003 (P.D. p 5348).

(Act No. 37 of 2003 -- assented to on 26 June 2003).

**Racing Restriction Bill 2003 \* (No. 179)**

This Bill is part of a package of four Bills aiming to establish a single controlling authority to be known as *Racing and Wagering Western Australia* (RWWA). The purpose of this particular Bill is to ensure that no thoroughbred, harness or greyhound race for a stake or prize, or the purpose of betting, may be held unless the race is licensed by RWWA and is held at a racecourse that is licensed by RWWA. The Bill also implements a National Competition Policy Review recommendation to provide for the establishment of an 'approved racing organisation' as the controlling authority for horse racing that is not thoroughbred racing or harness racing.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 March 2003 (P.D. p 5347).

(Act No. 34 of 2003 -- assented to on 26 June 2003).

**Railway and Port (The Pilbara Infrastructure Pty Ltd) Agreement Bill 2004 (LC No. 351)**

The purpose of this Bill is to -

- ratify and authorise an Agreement (scheduled to the Bill) between the State, Fortescue Metals Group Ltd and The Pilbara Infrastructure Pty Ltd for the development of a new multi-user infrastructure in the Pilbara;
- facilitate the development of a multi-user railway and multi-user port facilities, and additional infrastructure that may be required, for the transport and export of iron ore, freight goods and other products;
- gain parliamentary approval for the railway and enable the grant of a licence for the railway; and
- give statutory backing to open access arrangements for the multi-user railway and put in place a process to establish open access arrangements for the port facilities.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 16 November 2004 (P.D. p 8147).

(Act No. 77 of 2004 -- assented to on 8 December 2004).

### **Railway (Jandakot to Perth) Bill 2002 (No. 135)**

The purpose of this Bill is to authorise the construction of the Jandakot to Perth section of the South West Metropolitan Railway and will supplement the *Railway (Northern and Southern Urban Extensions) Act 1999*. This new railway will be an extension of the urban passenger railway network and will provide for a new urban passenger railway service to operate from Perth to Mandurah via Jandakot, Kwinana and Rockingham.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 August 2002 (P.D. p 92).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 26 November 2002.

(Act No. 40 of 2002 -- assented to on 5 December 2002).

### **Regional Development Commissions Amendment Bill 2002 (No. 109)**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for an amendment to Section 24 of the *Regional Development Commissions Act 1993*. Whereby a new subsection is to be included clearly stating that a commission may provide financial support in the form of a grant. Such grants are to be for, or in connection with, the performance of the functions of Regional Development Commissions. A further provision is included in the Bill to validate the previous where grants have been given.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 22 August 2002 (P.D. p 498).

(Act No. 5 of 2003 -- assented to on 24 March 2003).

### **Regional Investment Fund Bill 2001 (No. 54)**

The purpose of this Bill is to enable the establishment and operation of a Regional Investment Fund to encourage, promote and assist the development of regional Western Australia through the provision of financial support.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 October 2001 (P.D. p 4495).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

### **Reserves (Dampier to Bunbury Natural Gas Pipeline Corridor) Bill 2002 (No. 148)**

The purpose of this Bill is to excise areas from three conservation reserves so that the land can be set apart for the widening of the Dampier to Bunbury Gas Pipeline Corridor. The land needs to be excised from the following areas -

- Minyulo Nature Reserve (6.8 hectares or 3.4% of land in the reserve);
- Badgingara National Park (12.8 hectares or 0.1% if land in the reserve); and
- Cane River Reserve (269 hectares or 0.2% of land in the reserve).

A total of 288.2358 hectares is to be excised from the conservation estate.

### **Reserves (National Parks and Conservation Parks) Bill 2004 (No. 337)**

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 22 September 2004 (P.D. p 6278).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 21 October 2004.

(Act No. 63 of 2004 -- assented to on 30 November 2004).

### **Reserves (National Parks, Conservation Parks and Nature Reserves) Bill 2004 (No. 306)** **{name changed to *Reserves (National Parks, Conservation Parks, Nature Reserves and Other Reserves) Bill 2004*}**

The purpose of this Bill is to excise certain areas of land from State forest and timber reserves, to reserve land for the purposes of national parks, conservation parks and nature reserves, and to effect certain other changes to land.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 June 2004 (P.D. p 4182).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and General Purposes on 21 September 2004.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 24 November 2004.

Short title changed to *Reserves (National Parks, Conservation Parks, Nature Reserves and Other Reserves) Bill 2004* during Committee of the Whole in the Legislative Council on 24 November 2004 and agreed to by the Legislative Assembly on 26 November 2004.

(Act No. 66 of 2004 -- assented to on 8 December 2004).

### **Reserves (National Parks, Conservation Parks and Other Reserves) Bill 2004 (No. 346)**

The purpose of this Bill is to excise certain areas of land from State forest and timber reserves and other reserves; to cancel the purpose of timber reserves and to cancel other reserves: to reserve land for the purpose of national parks, conservation parks, a nature reserve and another reserve: and to effect certain other changes to land.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 October 2004 (P.D. p 6940).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and General Purposes. on 12 November 2004.

(Act No. 79 of 2004 -- assented to on 8 December 2004).

**Reserves (Reserve 43131) Bill 2003 (No. 201)**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for -

- a change of management of Reserve 43131 (situated in the Swan Valley); and
- the management powers that will apply to the land in the Reserve in the future, and how those powers may be exercised and given effect to.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 May 2003 (P.D. p 7896).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 16 May 2003 and further amended in the Legislative Assembly on 3 June 2003.

(Act No. 32 of 2003 -- assented to on 12 June 2003).

**Residential Parks (Long-stay Tenants) Bill 2004 (No. 355)**

The purpose of this Bill seeks to regulate the relationship between operators of residential parks and tenants who live in the park for extended periods, to make consequential amendments to the *Residential Tenancies Act 1987*, and for related purposes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 November 2004 (P.D. p 8042).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Retail Shops and Fair Trading Legislation Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 236)**

The purpose of this Bill is to -

- confirm the current trading hours regime in the metropolitan and non-metropolitan area;
- extend weeknight trading to 9.00 p.m. for all general retail stores in the metropolitan area on 2 May 2005;
- confirm existing standard hours and policy for non-metropolitan trading hours; and
- introduce the Small Business Legislative Protection Package.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 October 2003 (P.D. p 12047).

Second reading not agreed to in the Legislative Council on 19 August 2004.

**Retail Trading Hours Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 211) (Mr D.F. Sullivan)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend Section 12 of the *Retail Trading Hours Act 1987*, so that an order made under section 12 of the Act will effectively be treated, for the purposes of the *Retail Trading Hours Act 1987* only, as a regulation and thus subject to the disallowance provision contained in section 42 of the *Interpretation Act 1984*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 June 2003 (P.D. p 8907).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Retail Trading Hours Amendment (Referendums) Bill 2004 (No. 354)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Retail Trading Hours Act 1987* to provide for two questions relating to retail trading hours to be submitted to the electors under the *Referendums Act 1983*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 10 November 2004 (P.D. p 7836).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 23 November 2004.

(Act No. 78 of 2004 -- assented to on 8 December 2004).

**Revenue Laws Amendment and Repeal Bill 2004 (No. 295)**

This Bill proposes -

- an exemption from land tax for land that is the subject of an approved conservation covenant;
- amendments to the *Stamp Act 1921* to support the budget measures;
- the repeal of a number of redundant taxation Acts; and
- a range of measures designed to increase the efficiency of administrative arrangements and improve outcomes for taxpayers.

**Revenue Laws Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 294)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Stamp Act 1921* in order to -

- increase stamp duty relief to eligible first home buyers;
- reduce stamp duty rates on conveyance of property; and
- adjust the thresholds of the concessional rates of stamp duty for purchases of a principal place of residence or business property.

**Revenue Laws Amendment (Tax Relief) Bill 2004 (No. 353)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Pay-roll Tax Assessment Act 2002* and the *Taxation Administration Act 2003* to facilitate the simplification of the pay-roll tax regime by aligning pay-roll tax administration with modern business practices and electronic commerce initiatives.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 9 November 2004 (P.D. p 7694).

**Revenue Laws Amendment (Tax Relief) Bill (No. 2) 2004 (No. 352)**

The Bill proposes amendments to the *Land Tax Act 2002*, *Pay-roll Tax Act 2002* and the *Stamp Act 1921* to provide further assistance to first home buyers and help create new jobs.

This Bill amends the *Road Traffic Act 1974* to give Government the flexibility to sell the right to display optional number plates by lease or other arrangement.

**Road Traffic Amendment (Dangerous Driving) Bill 2004 (No. 299)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Road Traffic Act 1974 (WA)* to address deficiencies in the law relating to dangerous driving causing death or serious injury.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 June 2004 (P.D. p 4184).

Referred to Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 21 September 2004.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 28 October 2004.

(Act No. 44 of 2004 -- assented to on 9 November 2004).

**Road Traffic Amendment (Impounding and Confiscation of Vehicles) Bill 2004 (No. 273)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the definition of reckless driving to include any offence of speeding where speed involved exceeds the posted speed limit by 45 kilometres per hour (45 km/h) or more. The Bill will also create a new offence where a driver deliberately causes excessive noise and smoke to be emanated from vehicles tyres. The Bill also toughens other existing offences under the *Road Traffic Act 1974*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 4 March 2004 (P.D. p 410).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 8 April 2004 and in the Legislative Council on 4 June 2004.

(Act No. 10 of 2004 -- assented to on 23 June 2004).

**Royal Commission (Powers) Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 320)**

The purpose of this Bill is to implement a number of recommendations of the Kennedy Police Royal Commission -

- give Royal Commissions the power to arrest and conditionally release persons who will not attend to give evidence before the Commission;
- give Royal Commissions the power to use electronic surveillance devices; and
- improve the procedures for dealing with contempt in the face of a Royal Commission and clearly provides the types of offences which will constitute contempt of a Royal Commission.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 30 June 2004 (P.D.p 4611).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 24 August 2004.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Sentence Administration Bill 2002 \* (No. 132)**

The purpose of this Bill is to replace the *Sentence Administration Act 1995*. Part 3 of the Bill establishes a new regime for parole based around the recommendations arising from the 1998 Review of Remission and Parole and provides for -

- the Director General of the Ministry of Justice to make a parole order for prisoners serving terms of less than 12 months;
- the issues to be taken into account when considering release on parole; and
- any release on parole, by the Parole Board or Director General, be for the balance of the sentence.

Much of the remainder of the Bill is largely consistent with the current provisions of the *Sentence Administration Act 1995*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 August 2002 (P.D. p 175).

Referred to Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 19 December 2002.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 26 June 2003.

**Sentencing Legislation Amendment and Repeal Bill 2002 \* (No. 133)**

The purpose of this Bill is to make the sentencing process easier to understand both for the community and for those people who are directly involved in the criminal justice system. The key aspects contained in the Bill involve the following - prohibition on sentences of six months or less, *Road Traffic Act 1974* reforms, adjournment of sentencing, remission and parole and also repeal of the Sentencing Matrix legislation.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 August 2002 (P.D. p 177).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 28 November 2002 and in the Legislative Council on 26 June 2003.

Referred to Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 19 December 2002.

**Sentencing Legislation Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 316)**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide in a new Part 12 of the *Sentencing Act 1995* for a post sentence order in the form of Conditional Suspended Imprisonment. Conditional Suspended Imprisonment is a harsher penalty than Suspended Imprisonment and will be the severest penalty apart from immediate imprisonment.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 1 July 2004 (P.D.p 4761).

(Act No. 27 of 2004 -- assented to on 14 October 2004).

**Small Business Guarantees Repeal Bill 2004 (No. 272)**

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal the *Small Business Guarantees Act 1984*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 10 March 2004 (P.D. p 713).

(Act No. 31 of 2004 -- assented to on 14 October 2004).

**Stamp Amendment Bill 2001 \* (No. 86)**

The purpose of this Bill is to delete the majority of the administrative provisions of the *Stamp Act 1921*. The administrative provisions common to four major taxation Acts are located in the *Taxation Administration Bill 2001*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 5 December 2001 (P.D. p 6455).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Assembly to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 26 September 2002 and in the Legislative Council on 11 December 2002.

(Act No. 2 of 2003 -- assented to on 20 March 2003).

**Stamp Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 342)**

The purpose of this Bill seeks to amend the *Stamp Act 1921* provide an exemption from insurance duty for that part of an insurance premium that relates to property or risk outside of Australia. These amendments are proposed to have retrospective application to 1 July 1997.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 October 2004 (P.D. p 6939).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Stamp Amendment (Budget) Bill 2003 (No. 198)**

The purpose of this Bill is to increase the stamp duty rates on general insurance policies and the conveyance or transfer of property.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 May 2003 (P.D. p 7526).

(Act No. 44 of 2003 -- assented to on 30 June 2003).

**State Administrative Tribunal Bill 2003 \* (No. 213)**

The purpose of this Bill is to establish a new tribunal called the "State Administrative Tribunal" (SAT). SAT will be a single overarching tribunal, amalgamating numerous civil and administrative review tribunals, as well as court and ministerial appeal processes in Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 June 2003 (P.D. p 9102).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 14 August 2003 and in the Legislative Council on 10 November 2004.

**State Administrative Tribunal (Conferral of Jurisdiction) Amendment and Repeal Bill 2003 \* (No. 214)**

This Bill is related to the *State Administrative Tribunal Bill 2003*. Its purpose is to amend 142 enabling Acts and repeal two Acts in order to place them under jurisdiction within the State Administrative Tribunal.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 June 2003 (P.D. p 9104)

**State Flag Bill 2004 (No. 292) (Hon. C.J. Barnett)**

The purpose of this Bill is to declare the flag described in the Schedule of the Bill to be the Western Australian State Flag, thereby giving it legislative status.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 5 May 2004 (P.D. p 2340).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Statutes (Repeals and Minor Amendments) Bill 2001 (LC No. 31)**

The purpose of this 'Omnibus Bill' is to make only short, non-controversial amendments to various Acts and repeal Acts that are no longer required.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 28 June 2001 (P.D.p 1537).

Referred to Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 1 August 2001.

Reinstated on 21 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Referred to Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 13 March 2003.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 23 October 2003.

(Act No. 74 of 2003 -- assented to on 15 December 2003).

**Statutes (Repeals and Minor Amendments) Bill 2004 (LC No. 322)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the statute law by repealing various Acts, by making minor amendments to various Acts, and for related purposes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 25 August 2004 (P.D. p 5515).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Swan Valley Planning Legislation Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 356)**

The purpose of this Bill is to protect and preserve the Swan Valley for future generations. The Bill implements recommendations from the review of the *Swan Valley Planning Act 1995*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 November 2004 (P.D. p 8610).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Taxation Administration Bill 2001 \* (No. 79)**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the administration and enforcement of legislation dealing with State taxation. The *Taxation Administration Bill 2001* seeks to amalgamate and standardise the administrative provisions of the four major taxing Acts, namely the; *Pay-roll Tax Assessment Act 1971*; *Stamp Act 1921*; *Land Tax Assessment Act 1971*; and *Debits Tax Assessment Act 1990*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 5 December 2001 (P.D.p 6452).

**Taxation Administration (Consequential Provisions) Bill 2001 \* (No. 87)**

Secondly, the Bill seeks to amend a number of Acts as a consequence of the changes in the *Taxation Administration Bill 2001*, the rewrite of the debits tax, land tax and pay-roll legislation and amendments to the *Stamp Act 1921*. Finally, the Bill seeks to provide transitional and savings provisions to ensure a smooth changeover to the new arrangements proposed as part of this package of Bills.

**Taxation Administration (Consequential Provisions) (Taxing) Bill 2001 \* (No. 88)**

This Bill is intended to complement the *Taxation Administration (Consequential Provisions) Bill 2001*. The purpose of this Bill is to ensure that any provision that could be considered to constitute a tax are imposed under this Bill rather than the *Taxation Administration Bill 2001*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 5 December 2001 (P.D. p 6457).

Referred to Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 17 April 2002.

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No. 46 of 2003 -- assented to on 20 March 2003).

**Taxi Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 224)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Taxi Act 1994*, in order to provide for Government to issue future taxi licences for lease in addition to sale by tender.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 19 August 2003 (P.D. p 10184).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 17 September 2003 and in the Legislative Council on 3 December 2003.

**Terrorism (Commonwealth Powers) Bill 2002 \* (No. 165)**

This Bill is one of the three pieces of legislation involved in the State reference of powers over terrorism to the Commonwealth. This Bill contains provisions relating to the referral procedures and mechanisms and referring to the Commonwealth Parliament the text of offences set out in Schedule 1 of the Bill.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 November 2002 (P.D. p 3356).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 27 November 2002.

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and General Purposes on 28 November 2002.

(Act No. 53 of 2003 -- assented to on 14 January 2003).

**Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition (Western Australia) Bill 2002 \* (LC No. 134)**

The purpose of this Bill is to adopt the *Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition Act 1997* of the Parliament of the Commonwealth (including the amendments made to it before the enactment of this Act) which provides for the recognition within each State and Territory of the Commonwealth of regulatory standards adopted in New Zealand regarding goods and occupations, and for related purposes.

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 to the stage reached in the previous Session.

The Bill was referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and General Purposes on 14 August 2002 prior to the motion for the Second Reading.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 28 November 2002 (P.D. p 3602).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Transfer of Land Amendment Bill 2001 \* (No. 58)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Transfer of Land Act 1893* and to consequentially amend the *Evidence Act 1906* to provide for the co-existence of the paper and digital systems of land registration. Furthermore, the Bill provides for an alternative method of subdivision using disposition statements and modernises certain practices under the Act.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 October 2001 (P.D. p 4564).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 29 November 2001.

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

**Treasurer's Advance Authorisation Bill 2003 (No. 197)**

The purpose of this Bill is to allow the Treasurer to make certain payments and advances for authorised purposes chargeable to the Consolidated Fund or the Treasurer's Advance Account within the monetary limit available for the financial year commencing 1 July 2003.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 4 June 2003 (P.D. p 8162).

(Act No. 47 of 2003 -- assented to on 30 June 2003).

**Treasurer's Advance Authorisation Bill 2004 (No. 298)**

The purpose of this Bill is to authorise the Treasurer to make certain payments and advances for authorised purposes, chargeable to the consolidated fund or the Treasurer's advance account within the monetary limit available for the financial year commencing 1 July 2004.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 2 June 2004 (P.D. p 3306).

(Act No. 19 of 2004 -- assented to on 26 August 2004).

**Tree Plantation Agreements Bill 2002 \* (No. 118)**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the making of tree plantation agreements and for the effect of those agreements once they are registered under the *Transfer of Lands Act 1893*. Tree plantation agreements will involve an owner of land, or a lessee, with the consent of the owner, agreeing to let another person establish, maintain and harvest a plantation on the land. When that agreement is registered under the *Transfer of Lands Act 1893* the property in the trees becomes a "plantation interest" in the land.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 22 May 2002 (P.D. p 10963).

**Trustees of Western Australia Limited (Transfer of Business) Bill 2002 \* (No. 94)**

The purpose of this Bill is to transfer the business of Trustees of Western Australia Limited to Plan B Trustees Limited. Both are trustee companies registered under the *Trustee Companies Act 1987* (WA).

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 February 2002 (P.D. p 7712).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No. 18 of 2003 -- assented to on 17 April 2003).

**Unclaimed Money (Superannuation and RSA Providers) Bill 2002 (No. 158)**

The purpose of this Bill is to transfer from the Commonwealth to the State, the administration of unclaimed money held by superannuation funds and retirement savings account (RSA) providers. The Bill enables this unclaimed money to be paid to the Treasurer, to provide for a register of such money, and for related purposes, and imposes obligations on superannuation providers.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 4 December 2002 (P.D. p 3912).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and General Purposes on 4 March 2003.

(Act No. 19 of 2003 -- assented to on 17 April 2003).

**Veterinary Preparations and Animal Feeding Stuffs Amendment Bill 2003 (LC No. 185)**

The purpose of this Bill is to -

- provide for the control of the use of veterinary chemical products and the regulation of the sale of certain stock, stock products, and carcasses of stock treated with veterinary chemical products;
  - provide for the regulation of the sale and use of certain substances that promote, or are intended to promote, growth in stock and also of the sale of stock, or the carcasses of stock, which have been or are declared not to have been treated with a substance of that kind;
  - control and regulate the production, importation, treatment, preparation for sale, marketing, storage, and sale of animal feeding stuffs,
- and for incidental and other purposes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 7 May 2003 (P.D.p 7122).

(Act No. 76 of 2004 -- assented to on 8 December 2004).

**Vexatious Proceedings Restriction Bill 2002 \* (No. 95)**

The purpose of this Bill is to restrict the institution of vexatious proceedings through the implementation of an efficient process whereby certain persons may be declared by the courts to be "vexatious" litigants.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 February 2002 (P.D. p 7710).

Reinstated on 14 August 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No. 23 of 2002 -- assented to on 18 September 2002).

**Victims of Crime Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 169)**

The purpose of this Bill is to sanction information-sharing about victims of crime between the Commissioner for Police, the Director of Public Prosecutions and the Chief Executive Officer of the Department of Justice to facilitate the provision of services to victims of crime.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 February 2003 (P.D. p 4715).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 11 September 2003.

(Act No. 30 of 2004 -- assented to on 14 October 2004).

**Voluntary Euthanasia Bill 2002 (LC No. 149) (Hon. R.H. Chapple)**

The purpose of this Bill is to develop an administrative framework for allowing voluntary euthanasia in Western Australia. It will establish an administrative structure that can only be enacted by mentally competent adults, suffering a medically diagnosed illness that is likely to cause death. It will legalise an adult person's intention to terminate his or her life in this circumstance and provide immunity to a person assisting that person providing it occurs according to the requirements of this Bill.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 18 September 2002 (P.D. p 1128).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Volunteer Protection Bill 2002 (No. 122) (Mr B.J. Grylls)**

The purpose of this Bill is to protect volunteers performing community work by limiting personal liability for acts or omissions causing injury, loss or damage; and to encourage community service.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 12 June 2002 (P.D. p 11340).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

**Volunteers (Protection from Liability) Bill 2002 \* (No. 124)**

The purpose of this Bill is to protect certain volunteers from incurring civil liability when doing community work on a voluntary basis, and to provide that community organisations that organise community work to be done by volunteers may incur the civil liability from which the volunteers are protected when doing that work.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 19 June 2002 (P.D. p 11675).

Reinstated on 24 September 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 6 November 2002.

(Act No. 32 of 2002 -- assented to on 14 November 2002).

**Water Boards Amendment Bill 2002 (No. 106)**

This Bill will amend the *Water Boards Act 1904* in order to permit the payment of remuneration and allowances to members of the Bunbury and Busselton Water Boards out of the Water Fund. Specifically, the Bill proposes the following amendments -

- the existing section 29 be replaced with a section to permit the payment of remuneration and allowances to members; and
- an additional paragraph be included in section 111(1), to allow payment of remuneration and allowances from the Water Fund.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 November 2002 (P.D. p 3204).

(Act No. 22 of 2003 -- assented to on 23 April 2003).

#### **Water Conservation and Management Bill 2003 (No. 225) (Hon. P.G. Pental)**

The purpose of this Bill is to make permanent, with minor modifications, the scheme for water restrictions currently imposed by the *Water Agencies (Water Restrictions) By-Laws 1998* made under the *Water Agencies (Powers) Act 1984*. The Bill retains the power of the Water Corporation to change the degree of water restrictions by notices published in the *Government Gazette*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 August 2003 (P.D. p 10299).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Water Resources Management (Administration) Bill 2003 (No. 237)**

The purpose of this Bill, with its companion, the *Machinery of Government (Water Resources) Amendment Bill 2003*, will implement the Machinery of Government Taskforce's recommendation to amalgamate water resources management and environmental protection functions. This Bill establishes institutional and committee arrangements to support the Minister and the CEO and facilitates integrated administration of the Acts dealing with water resources management.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 October 2003 (P.D. p 12748).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

#### **Western Australian College of Teaching Bill 2003 (No. 219)**

The purpose of this Bill is to establish the Western Australian College of Teaching. The College will be a professional body for teachers, administered by teachers and will represent all teachers in Western Australia. The main emphases of the Bill are -

- enhancing the status of the profession of teaching;
- ensuring on-going professional development of all teachers;
- establishing professional standards and values for teaching in schools; and
- administering the schemes of teacher registration and disciplinary proceedings.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 August 2003 (P.D. p 9858).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 18 September 2003 and in the Legislative Council on 12 May 2004.

(Act No. 8 of 2004 -- assented to on 10 June 2004).

#### **Western Australian Land Authority Amendment Bill 2003 \* (No. 184)**

The purpose of this Bill is to complete giving effect to the 1998 Ministerial Review on the *Western Australian Land Authority Act 1992* and also the 2001 Machinery of Government Reforms, by providing for its increased land development mandate and the further commercialisation of the Authority. The main amendments are as follows -

- to clarify, and widen the objects, and therefore the functions and powers, of the Authority, to include urban renewal and remediation of contaminated sites;
- to enshrine the requirement for the Authority to have regard to the triple bottom line concepts of social, economic and environmental outcomes in carrying out its operations;
- to transform the Authority to a statutory body; and
- to require the Authority to carry out its functions and operations in a manner that is comparable to a corporation under the *Corporations Act 2001*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 9 April 2003 (P.D. p 6473).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 12 November 2004.

(Act No. 67 of 2004 -- assented to on 8 December 2004).

### **Western Australian Meat Marketing Co-operative Limited (Shares) Bill 2002 (LC No. 128)**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for -

- the allotment and issue of shares in Western Australian Meat Marketing Co-operative Limited to the Minister;
  - the transfer of those shares to certain trustees,
- and for related purposes.

This will complete the transfer of ownership of lamb producers, of the business of the former Western Australian Meat Marketing Corporation.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 11 September 2002 (P.D. p 715).

(Act No. 4 of 2003 -- assented to on 24 March 2003).

### **Western Australian Planning Commission Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 226)**

The purpose of this Bill is to establish a Coastal Planning and Coordination Council as a prescribed standing committee of the Western Australian Planning Commission.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 August 2003 (P.D. p 10569).

(Act No. 69 of 2003 -- assented to on 9 December 2003).

### **Western Australian Tourism Commission Amendment Bill 2003 (No. 174)**

This Bill amends the *Western Australian Tourism Commission Act 1983*, in order to increase the size of the Western Australian Tourism Commission (WATC) Board, ensure correct reference to the *Industrial Relations Act 1979*, and repeal the WATC's 'sunset clause'.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 3 April 2003 (P.D. p 6142).

(Act No. 55 of 2003 -- assented to on 22 October 2003).

**Wildlife Conservation (Fauna Protection) Amendment Bill 2002 (LC No. 163) (Hon. C. Sharp)**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the conservation and protection of fauna in cases where habitats are likely to suffer damage, or fauna will be subjected to interference or damage by intrusive activity, by amending the *Wildlife Conservation Act 1950* and including production contracts formed under the *Forest Products Act 2000*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 14 November 2002 (P.D.p 3159).

Second reading not agreed to in the Legislative Council on 15 May 2003.

**Wood Processing (Wesbeam) Agreement Bill 2002 (No. 140)**

The purpose of this Bill is to obtain Parliamentary ratification of the Agreement entered into on 11 August 2002 between the State, Wesbeam Pty Ltd. as the project company and its holding company Wesbeam Holdings Ltd. as guarantor to secure the supply of pine timber to a proposed \$80,000,000 engineered wood products (including laminated veneer lumber) project at the Neerabup Industrial Estate near Wanneroo.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 August 2002 (P.D.p 285).

(Act No. 28 of 2002 -- assented to on 4 October 2002).

**Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation Amendment (Cross Border) Bill 2004 (No. 296)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation Act 1981* in order to -

- eliminate the need for employers to obtain workers' compensation coverage for a worker in more than one jurisdiction and ensure each worker is connected to one jurisdiction;
- ensure workers working temporarily in another jurisdiction only have access to the workers' compensation entitlements and common law provisions in their home State or Territory;
- provide certainty for workers about their workers' compensation entitlements; and
- ensure each worker is connected to one State or Territory.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 May 2004 (P.D. p 2922).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and General Purposes on 2 July 2004.

(Act No. 36 of 2004 -- assented to on 28 October 2004).

**Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation (Acts of Terrorism) Amendment Bill 2002 (No. 142)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the Sunset Clause within the *Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation (Acts of Terrorism) Act 2001*. The amendment will extend the "Final Day" beyond 31 December 2003, to a day prescribed by regulation. It is intended regulations will be Gazetted to prescribe a final day of 31 December, 2004.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 August 2002 (P.D. p 378).



(Act No. 36 of 2002 -- assented to on 20 November 2002).

### **Workers' Compensation Reform Bill 2004 (No. 288)**

The purpose of this Bill is to -

- ensure the workers' compensation system balances the interests of workers and employers;
- establish a fair and efficient system with more stable and cost efficient protection for employers while providing improved levels of support and compensation to injured workers;
- incorporate changes to scheme design, the structure and role of the Commission and rectification of unintended consequences of past legislative change; and
- reduce the level of complexity, barriers and delays inherent in the current common law system.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 5 May 2004 (P.D. p 2306).

Referred to a Legislative Assembly Legislation Committee on 3 June 2004.

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 24 June 2004 and in the Legislative Council on 21 October 2004.

Referred to a Legislative Council Select Committee on 2 July 2004.

(Act No. 42 of 2004 -- assented to on 9 November 2004).

### **Workers' Compensation (Common Law Proceedings) Bill 2004 (No. 312)**

The purpose of this Bill is to ensure -

- the Parliament's intent in enacting section 32 of the *Workers Compensation and Rehabilitation Amendment Act 1999* is given effect; and
- workers are not disadvantaged by the effect of certain decisions of the Supreme Court in relation to the operation of section 93D of the *Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation Act 1981*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 22 June 2004 (P.D. p 4053).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 24 June 2004 and in the Legislative Council on 20 October 2004.

(Act No. 35 of 2004 -- assented to on 25 October 2004).

### **Working with Children (Criminal Record Checking) Bill 2004 (No. 347)**

The purpose of this Bill is to -

- provide for procedures for checking the criminal record of people who carry out child-related work or who propose to carry out such work;
- prohibit certain people who have been convicted of or charged with certain offences from carrying out child-related work; and
- provide for related matters.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 October 2004 (P.D. p 6945).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 26 October 2004.

(Act No. 65 of 2004 -- assented to on 8 December 2004).

**Yallingup Foreshore Land Bill 2002 (No. 99)**

The purpose of this Bill is to ensure the retention of approximately 13.5 hectares of beach front land at Yallingup near the foreshore and Caves House. The Bill proposes to preclude a claim that the Land had been invalidly acquired in 1938; to prevent sections 29 or 29A of the *Public Works Act 1902* applying to the Land and to overcome the claim that the caravan park, parking area and bush fire brigade depot were unlawfully used, by reason of a failure to comply with section 29 of the *Public Works Act 1902*. When enacted this legislation will settle the rights of the parties which are currently in dispute in the Supreme Court proceedings.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 March 2002 (P.D. p 8760).

Reinstated on 24 September 2002 in the Legislative Council to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

**Young Offenders Amendment Bill 2003 (LC No. 264) (Hon. P.G. Foss)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Young Offenders Act 1994* in order to close loopholes in the Principal Act, whereby young offenders escape conviction "three strikes" due to the interpretation of the provisions of the various Statutes, principally the *Young Offenders Act 1994*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 4 December 2003 (P.D. p 14170).

Referred to Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 1 April 2004.

Second reading not agreed to in the Legislative Council on 18 November 2004.

**Young Offenders Amendment Bill 2004 (No. 305)**

The purpose of this Bill is to make a number of amendments to the *Young Offenders Act 1994* that will improve the management of juvenile offenders and provide greater protection to the community through reducing re-offending.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 August 2004 (P.D. p 5160).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 21 September 2004 and in the Legislative Council on 11 November 2004.
